People feel bored, sad or happy as a result of some actions or events.

Look at the children.

What do they feel like?

Why?

The girl is happy. Why? (get a “5”)



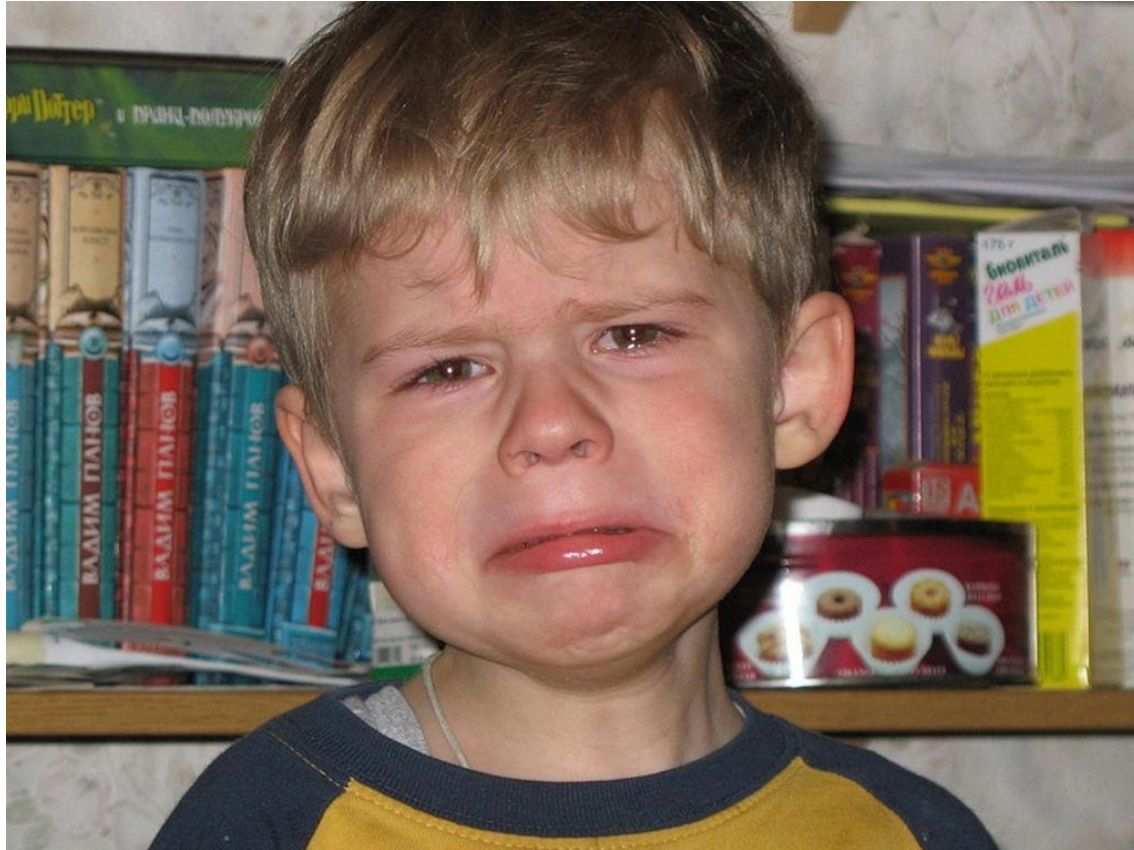
She **has got** a “5”!

The children are scared. Why?
(see a monster)



They **have seen** a monster

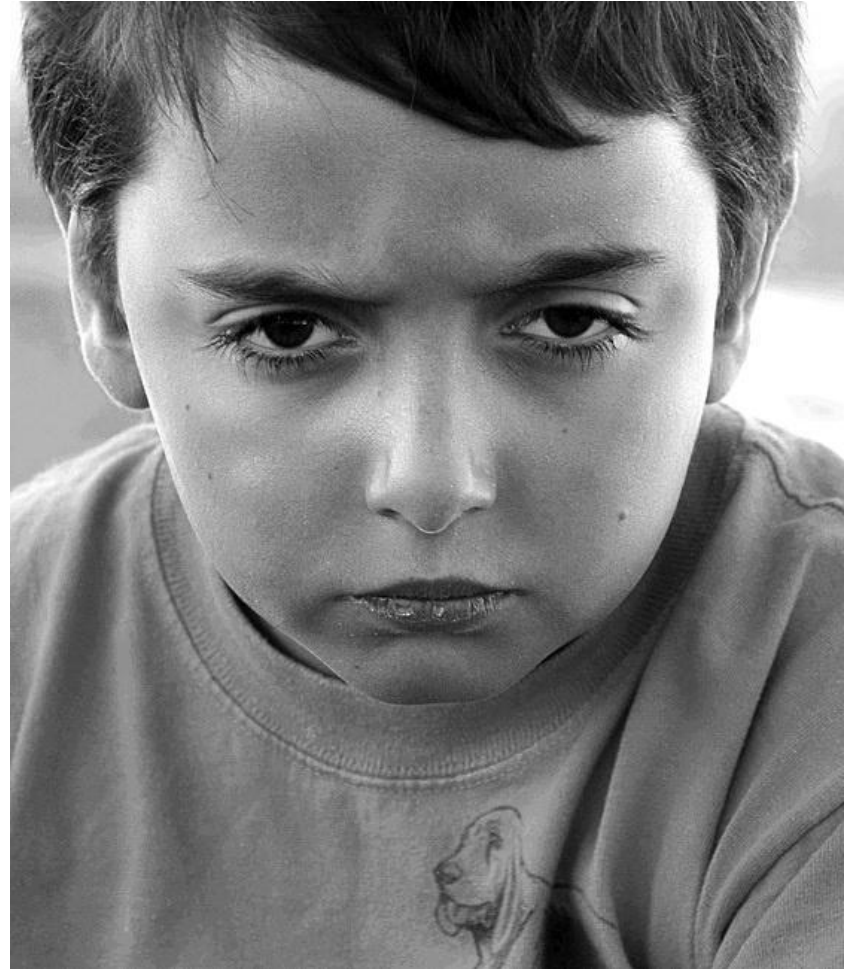
The boy is crying. Why? (lose his toy car)



He's lost his toy car.

The boy is upset. Why? (fail his test)

He **has failed**
his test



The girl is surprised. Why? (see an elephant)



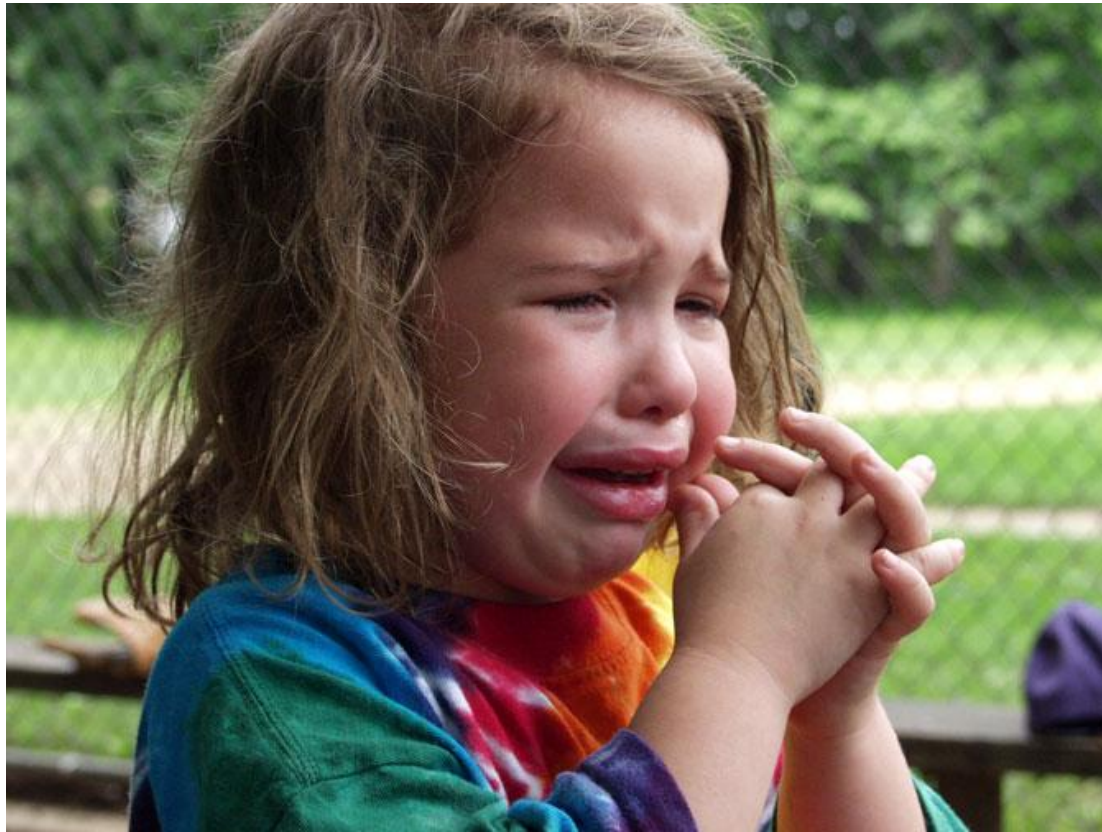
She **has seen** an elephant!

The girl is sad. Why?
(her mum ...go to work)

Her mum
has gone
to work.



The girl is crying. Why?
(hurt her finger)



She **has hurt** her finger.

The boy is disgusted. Why?
(eat something bad)



He **has eaten**
something
bad.

The boy is happy. Why? (find his dog)



He **has found** his dog!
