The radio was invented by Popov

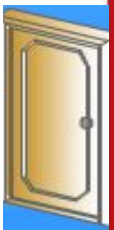
When the subject is not the agent, then we use a passive verb.

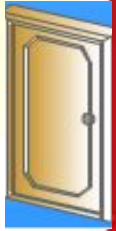
