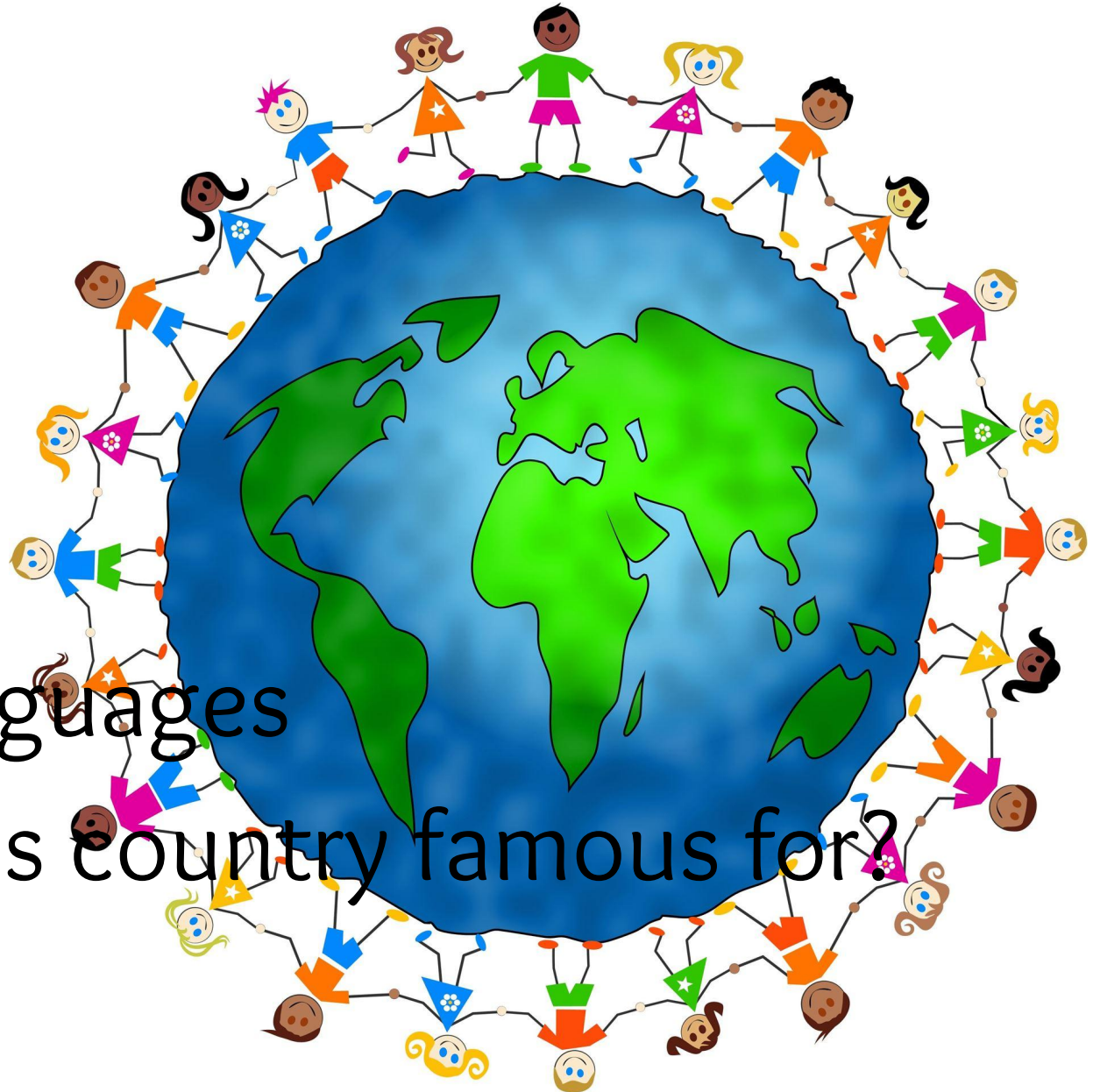

# The UK



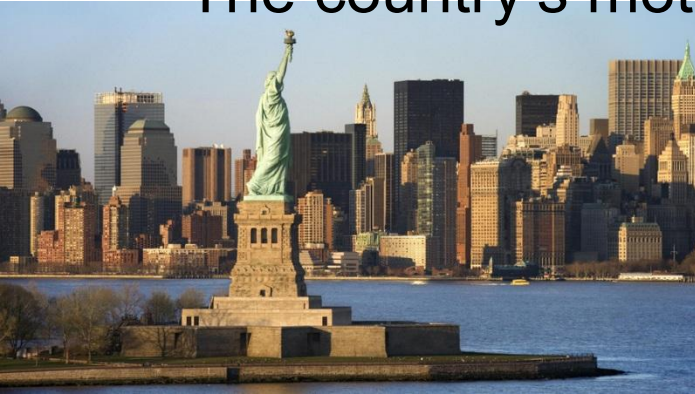

- London is rich in sights.

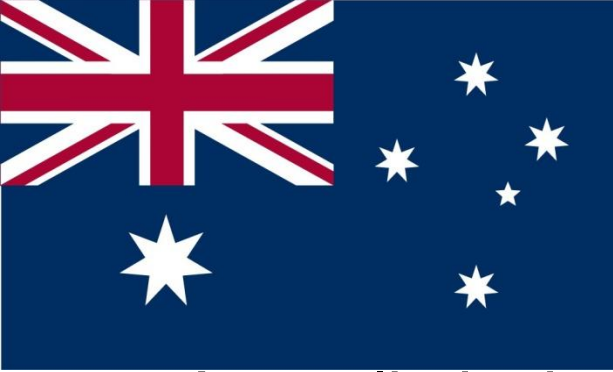


# The USA

- English is the official language in Australia.





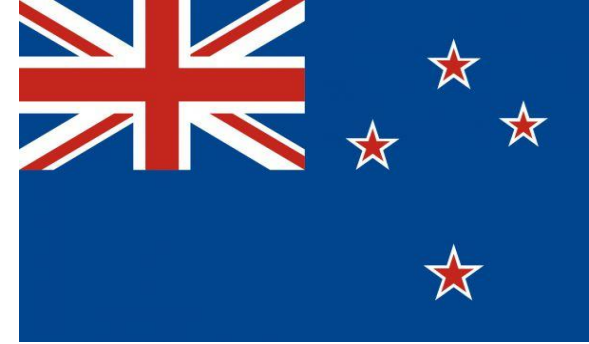


# Canada

- The capital of Canada is Ottawa. There are two official languages in this country – English and French.
- The red and white Canadian flag shows a leaf of the maple tree, which grows in North America. The maple leaf is the official emblem of Canada.
- Canada is famous for its lakes and The Niagara Falls.



# New Zealand



- New Zealand is a small country in the Pacific Ocean. It consists of two main islands and some smaller islands. It looks like Italy upside down. When it is summer in New Zealand, it is winter in Europe. But the school year starts in autumn – in February.
- The capital of New Zealand is Wellington. The population of New Zealand is mixed. Some people came from Britain. Some Maori people lived here before the British came. The official languages are English and Maori. English is called Kiwi English
