[l] – a lot of, apple, lemon











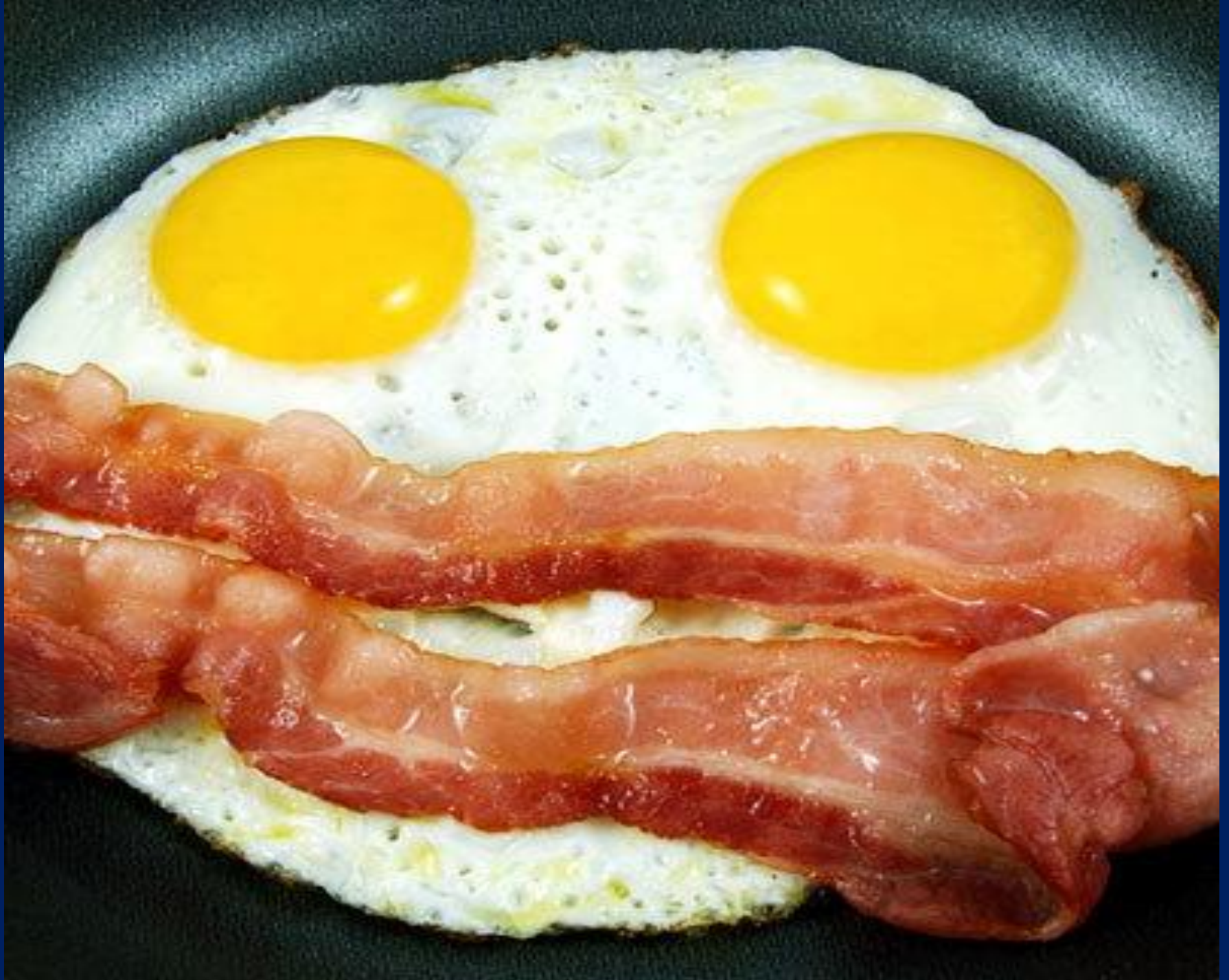
