We use the Present Continuous tense to talk about:

actions and things that are happening now



He is drinking.



He is reading.



He is smiling.



He is singing.

PRESENT CONTINUOUS

Am

Is + V + ing

Are

I **am writing** now.



She/He/It **is playing** ball at the moment.



We/you/they **are reading** now.

Questions in PRESENT CONTINUOUS

Am I speaking now? -Yes, you are./ No, you are not.(aren't)

Is he riding a bike now? - Yes, he is. /No, he isn't.

Are they going boating at the moment? - Yes, they are./
No, they are not.(aren't)

What is she doing now? She is

What are you doing now? I am

What are they doing now? They are
