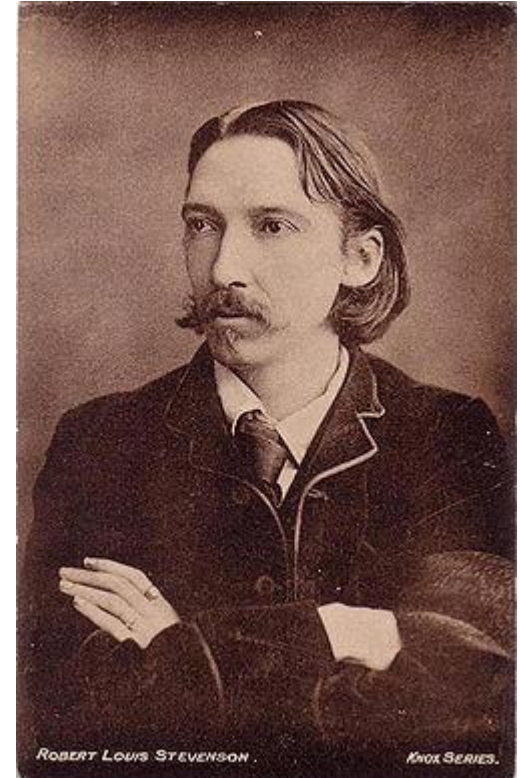
Lewis Carroll (1832 – 1898)

Arthur Conan Doyle (1859 – 1930)



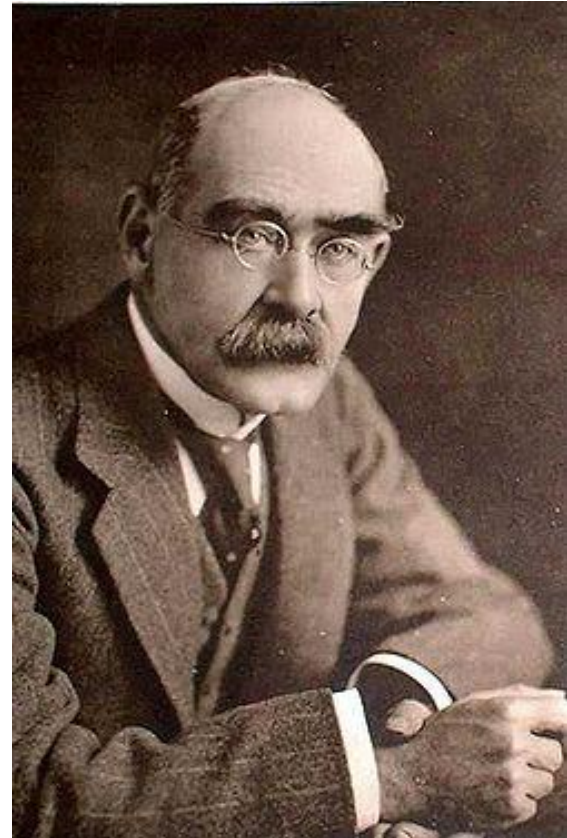
Genres: detective fiction,

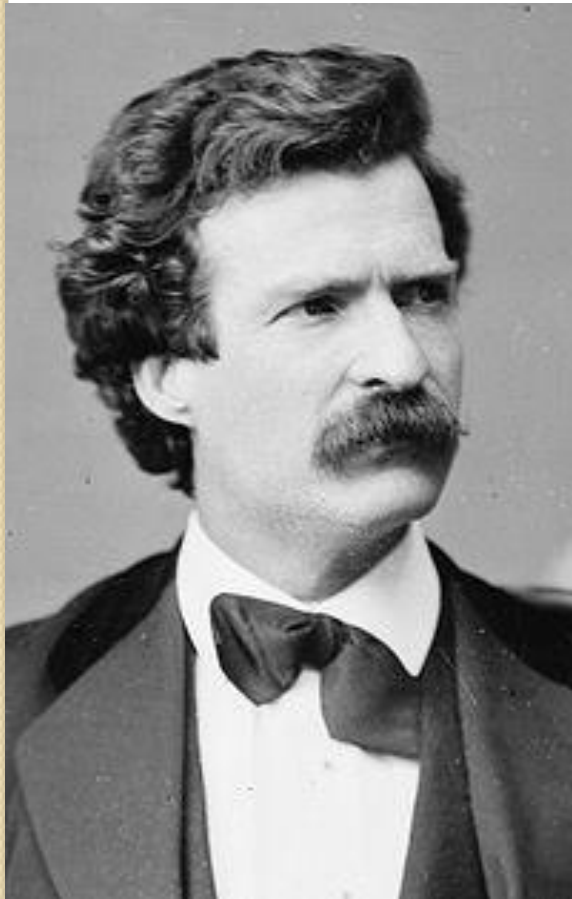
