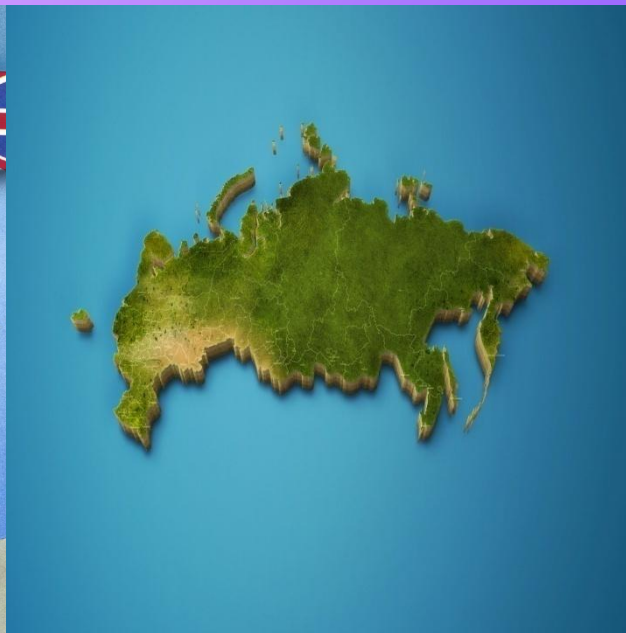

Problem issue:

The English national costume, there is no original, no fake, no, but there is a recognizable English uniform. This, for example, the costume of the Beefeaters - a gold-embroidered scarlet jacket, stockings and a black round hat with a brim, which is worn by the guards of the tower of London; the red tunics and hats made from bear skins Royal guards of infantry; a white shirt, breeches and pads on the knees with bells performers of Morris dancing (dance in costumes of the heroes of the legend of Robin hood).

In addition, there is a point of view, according to which the basis of a national English costume, you should take the cloak of the Anglo-Saxon tribes that inhabited the territory of modern Kent in the VII—VIII centuries ad.

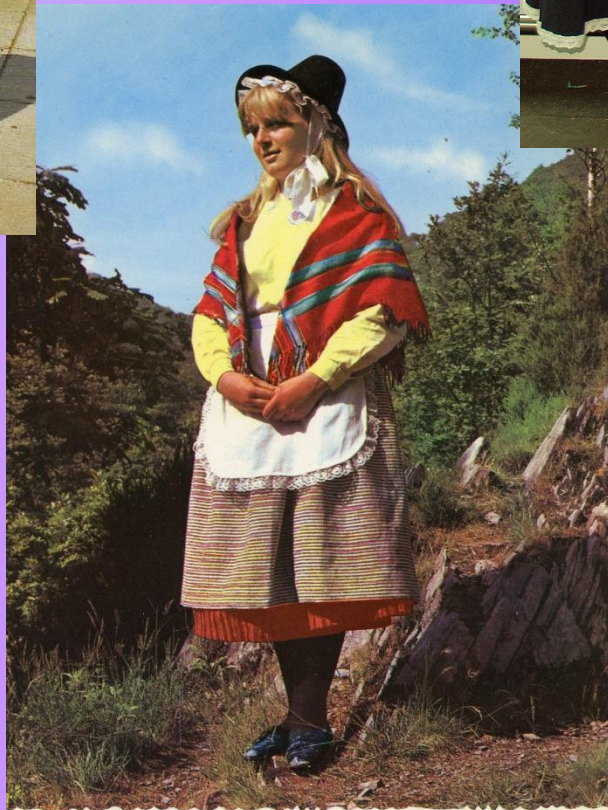




The national costume of Wales

Today, the national Irish costume, many associated primarily with clothing dancers tap dance . Their outfits successfully combined folk ornaments, ancient and modern items of clothing. Women – this short bright dress, embroidered with multi-colored embroidery and are highly flared cut, and men - jacket, shirt with tie and skirt.

The national costume of Russia

The basic elements of Russian folk costume was formed in Ancient Russia. Main costume was a long shirt straight cut, which were made of thick homespun, with wide sleeves.

Clothes Russian peasant women consisted of this here shirt, decorated with embroidery, in Russian folk costume is usually placed on the sleeves, hem and shoulders. Top wore a plain dress and apron. Peasant costume was prepared with great care, usually in the context of working holidays – the harvest, the haymaking, pasture of cattle.

A distinctive feature of Russian national costume — a large number of clothing. Clothing flare and swing. Flare clothing worn over the head, swing was cut from top to bottom and fastened with butt hooks or buttons.







Conclusion:

- *Analyzing national costumes of Russia and the UK, we came to the conclusion that these suits have played an important social role in the life of the Russian and British people*
- *National costume is priceless, an integral domain of culture accumulated over the centuries. Clothing held in its development a long way closely connected with the history and aesthetic views of the creators*

Practical part

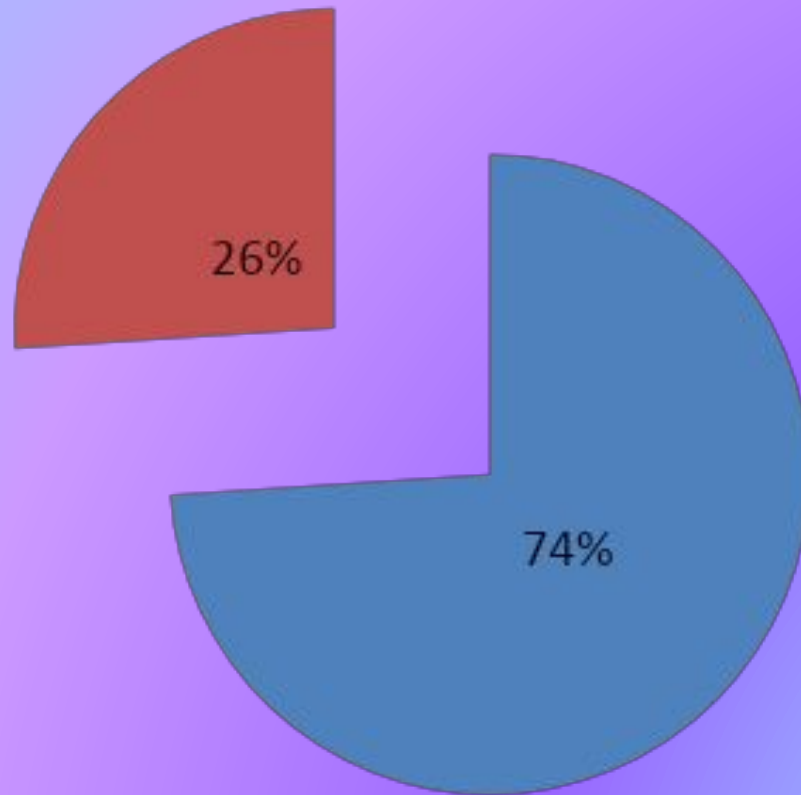

- 5) What feelings do you have when you see people in national costumes?***

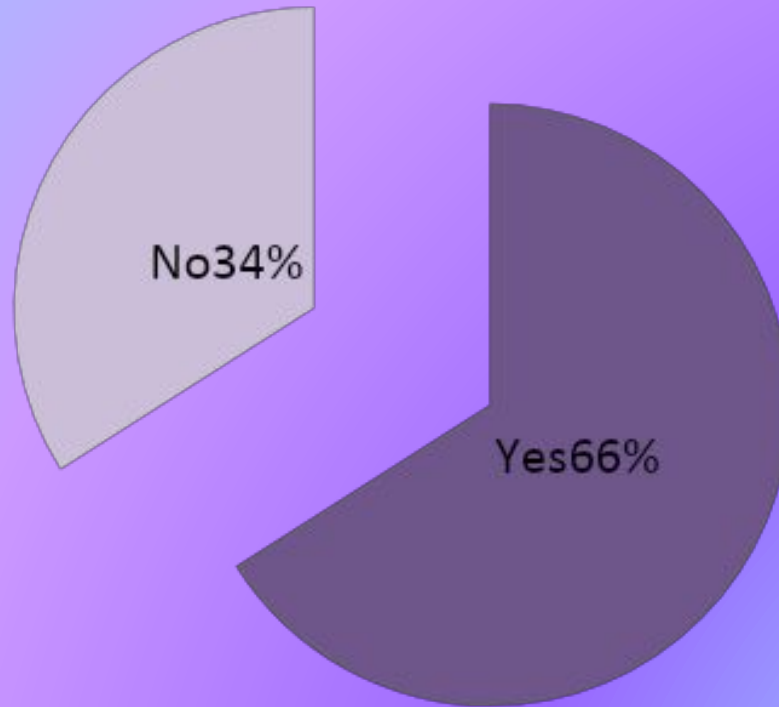

Correct answers

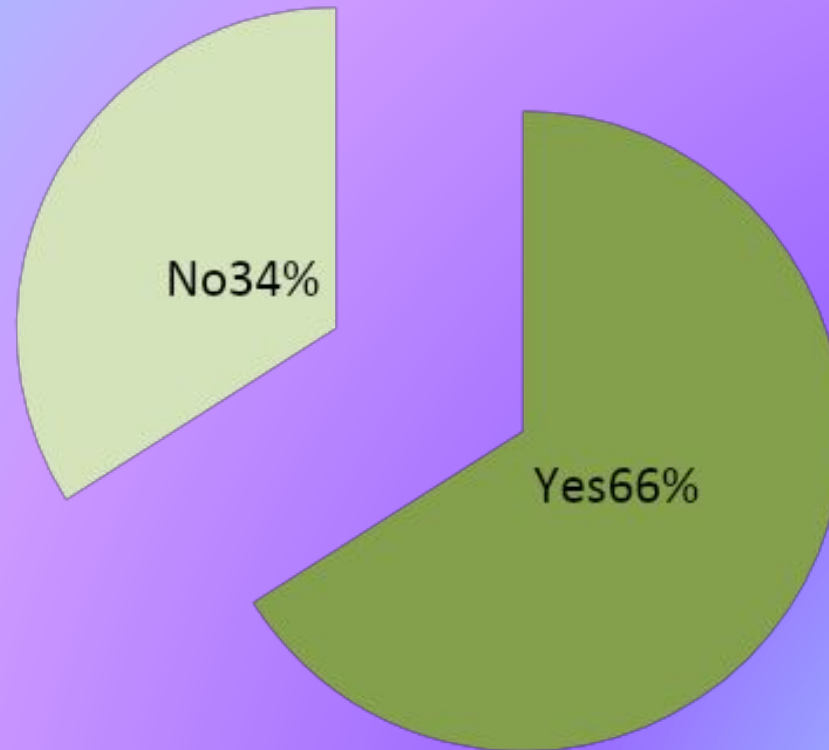
Incorrect answers




Answers to the 2nd question
