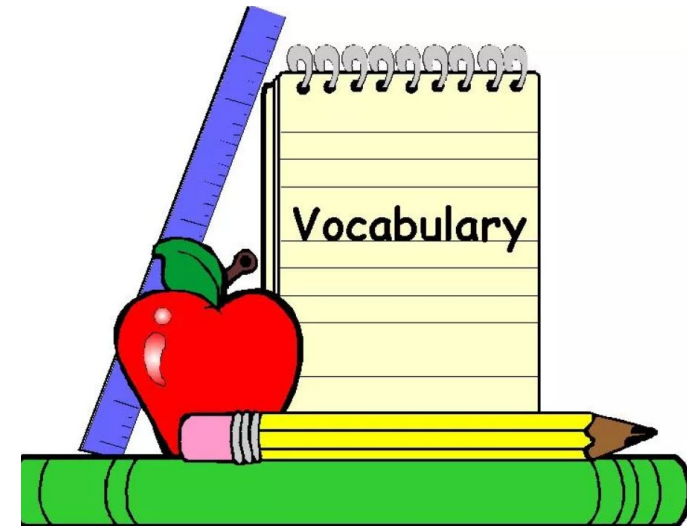

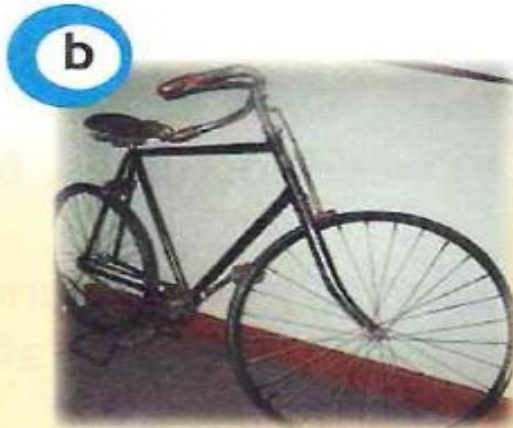


HOUSE MUSEUMS IN RUSSIA
