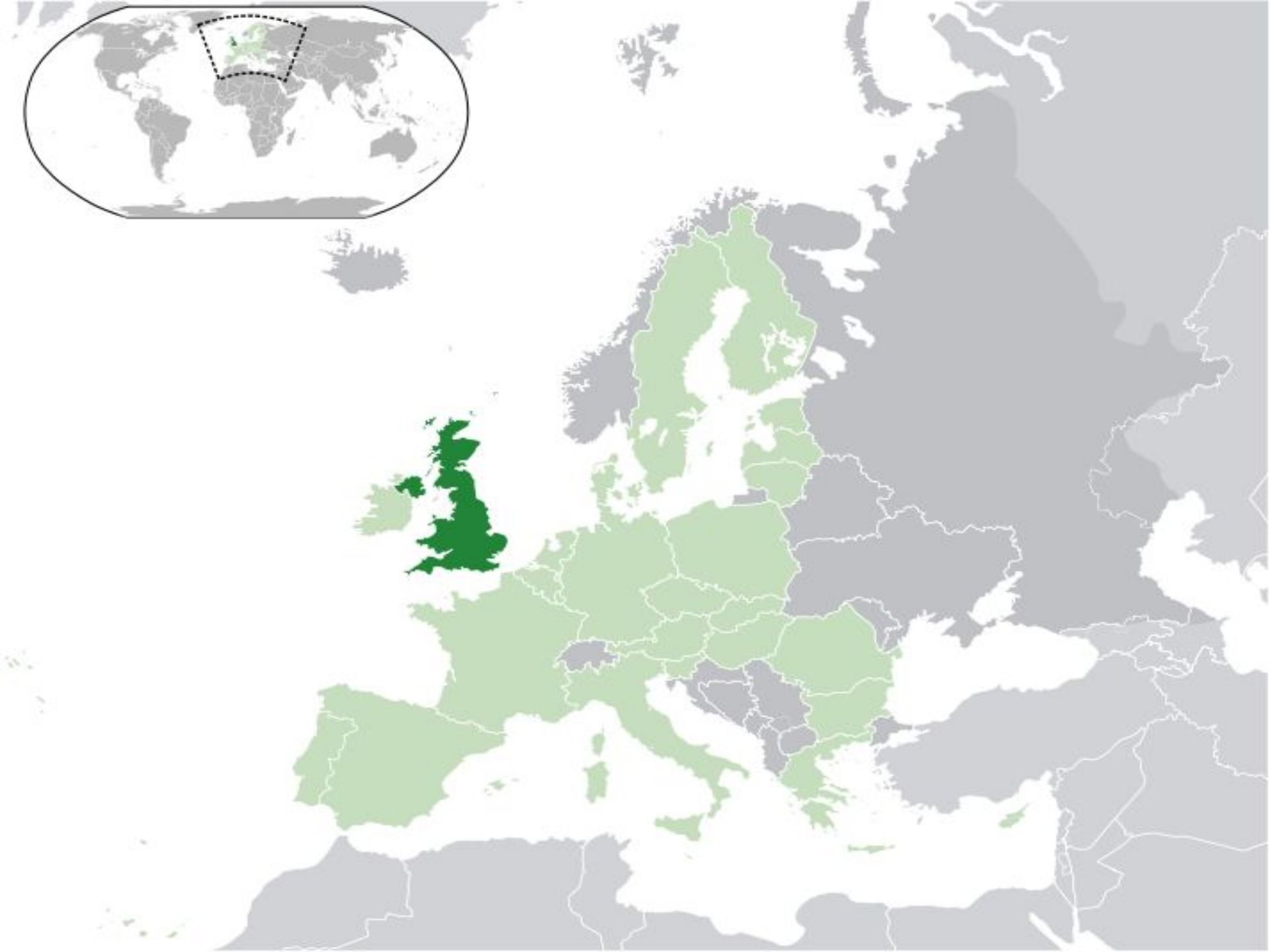
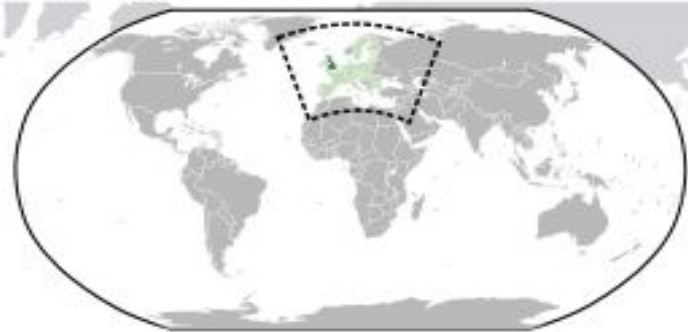


GREAT BRITAIN

The British Isles are separated from the European continent by **the North Sea and the English Channel**. The western coast of Great Britain is washed by the **Atlantic Ocean and the Irish Sea**.



Mountains

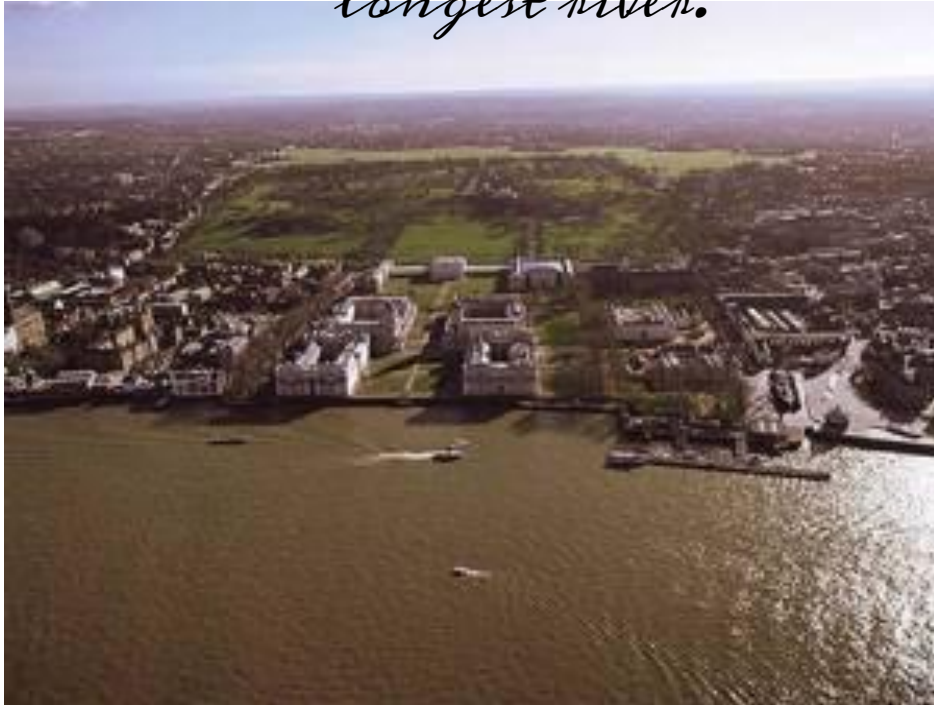
The north and west of England are mountainous, but mountains are not very high. **BEN NAVIS** in Scotland is the highest mountain (1343 m)

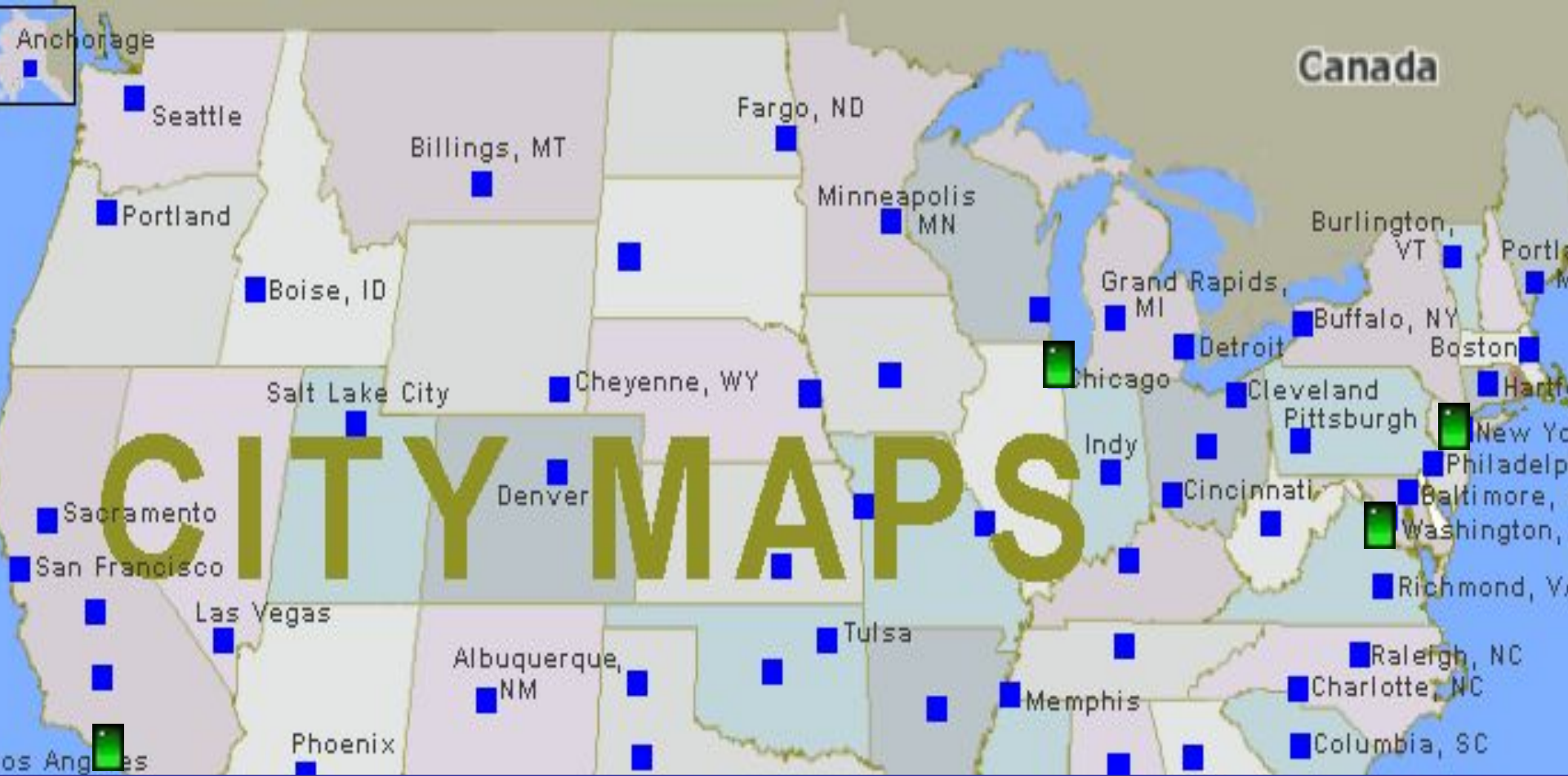
