looks as if + a noun/pronoun + verb She looks as if she is in her teens.

2 Height/build/figure.

Try to use neutral, not negative, words.

She's quite tall and slim. Skinny

3 Hair.

Order: general opinion/length/style/colour

She's got beautiful long dark hair.

4 Striking features.

He's got dimples and a goatee beard.

5 Clothes

He/She is wearing (or usually wears) ...

6 General impression

She looks very well-dressed.
