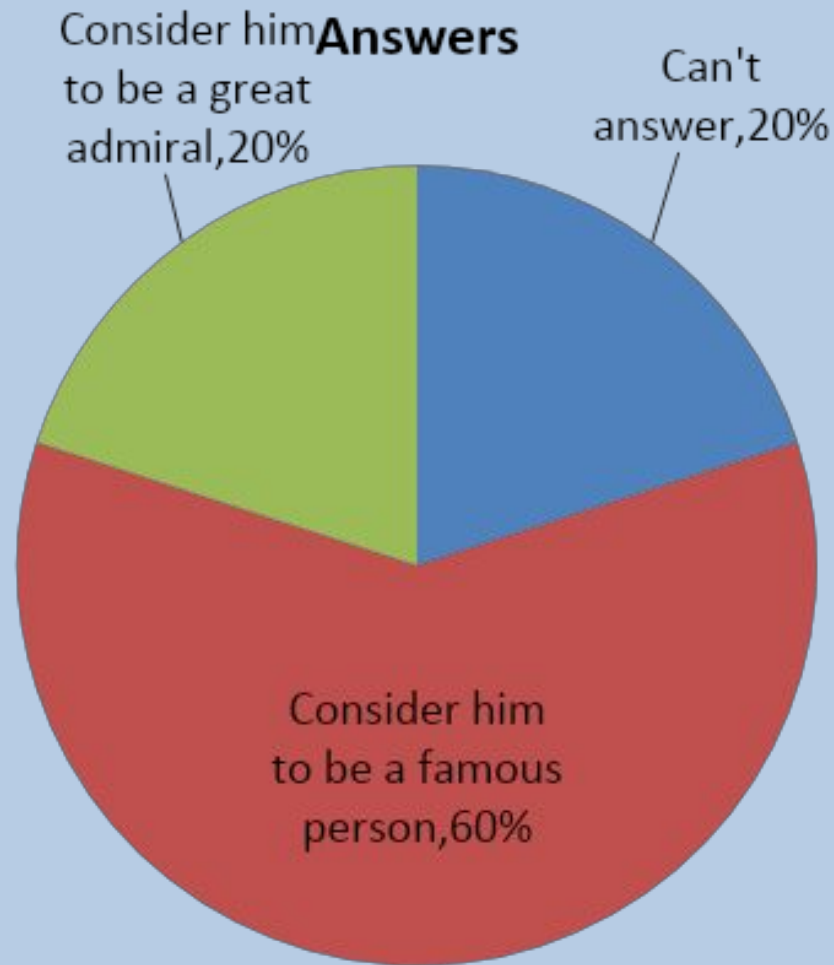

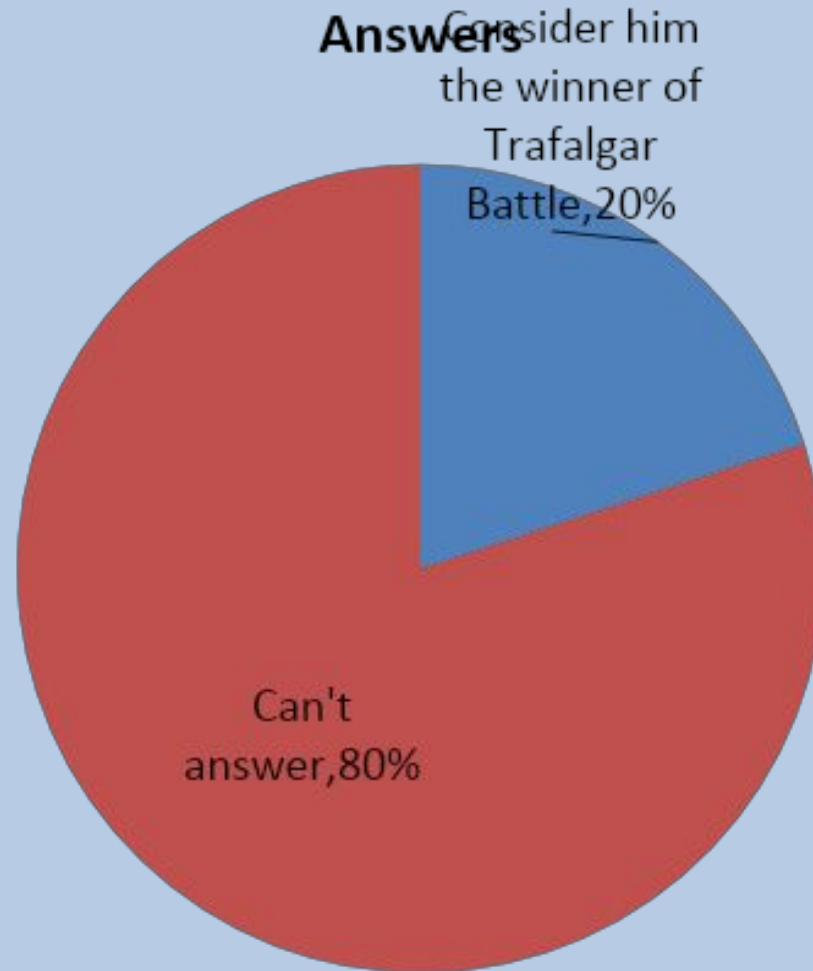

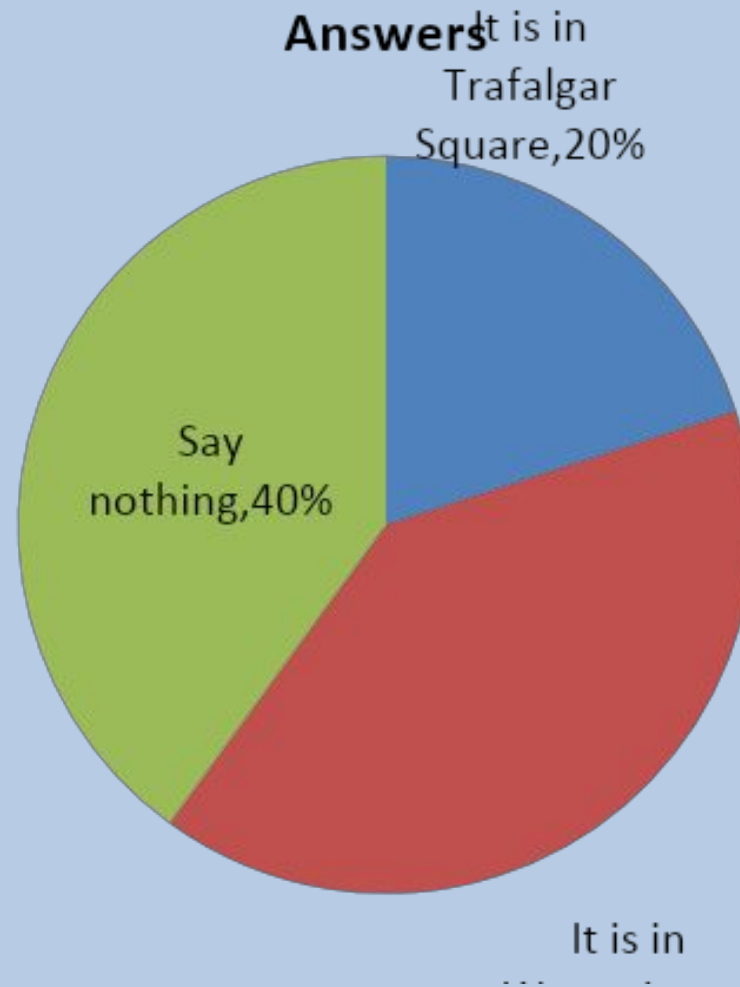

Early years

Horatio Nelson was the sixth of 11 children of the village rector, Edmund Nelson, and his wife, Catherine. Nelson was born in a gentle, scholarly and poor family.





When Horatio's mother died, Captain Suckling, her brother, agreed to take the boy to sea.

In Naples Nelson met Sir William Hamilton and his wife Emma.

On 21st of October 1805 Nelson won the Battle near the Cape of Trafalgar.
