

- Many highland games take place all over Scotland every year.
- The most famous **meeting** is in Braemar, a small village in the Scottish Highlands.
- The games are always on the first Saturday in September.
- Many athletes travel to Scotland each year to take part in the games.
- They **complete** in events like *the hammer throw, shot put* and *the hill run*.
- There are also music and dancing competition.
- Marching bands perform for the crowds.
- They wear traditional clothing and play the bagpipes.
- The most popular event of the day is the «tug of war».
- Two teams **hold onto a rope** and try to pull the other team over the line.
- «Tossing the caber» is also popular.
- The athletes have to run holding a heavy tree trunk, the caber, upright.
- Then, they stop and throw it towards the sky.
- Tickets always sell out months before the games start. It's a great day out for all family.




