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The History Of Ivankovo.

- In 1740 from the village uchkulevo separated some families ikkinchi Tatars and settled at lake Amankul. Here for a long time fishing Russian named Ivan, and the people began to call the lake-lake Ivan. Later, the village was called Ivankovo. The village belonged to the parish McKinsey Isetsky province, then the Chelyabinsk district of Orenburg province. In the "List of settlements of the Russian Empire", published in 1871, the settlement is mentioned as a Bashkir village. The village had 103 households and 636 inhabitants. In 1919, formed Ivankov SEL. During the Soviet era, residents of Ivankovo worked in the agricultural artel "Trud"
