



## Biography of Mark Twain



Samuel Langhorne Clemens (Mark Twain) was born on 30 November 1835 in Florida.

His parents were John and Jane Clemens. After moving to Missouri John met Jane and some years later they married. There were seven children in their family but only four survived: Samuel, Henry, Orion and Pamela. Samuel was the sixth child.






Mark Twain had a wife Olivia Langdon. They married in 1870 lived in Buffalo, New York. He started working as a writer and editor in the newspaper. The married couple had 3 daughters: Jean, Clara and Susy.





Mark Twain spent a lot of time in Hartford and at Quarry Farm where he wrote his famous writings including The Adventures of Tom Sawyer, The Prince and the Pauper, Life on the Mississippi, Adventures of Huckleberry Finn etc.



## Interesting facts from the life of Mark Twain


In English the nautical term "mark twain" meant that the depth of the river is sufficient for safe passage of river vessels.







Mark Twain was born during a visit by Halley's Comet, and he predicted that he would "go out with it". This prophecy was exact.
