Madame Tussauds is a wax museum in London. It was founded by wax sculptor Marie Tussaud.



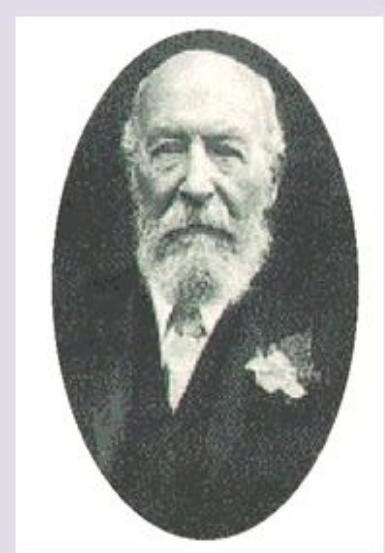
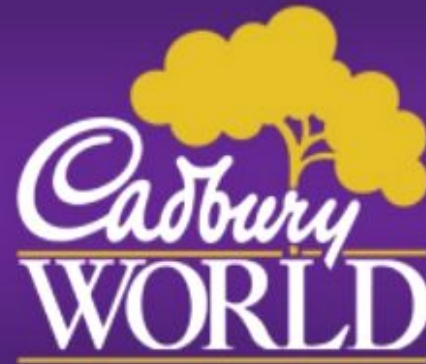
Madame Tussauds and the London Planetarium.

This museum is a major tourist attraction in London, displaying the waxworks of famous and historic people and also popular film characters. The museum is situated in Marylebone Road.



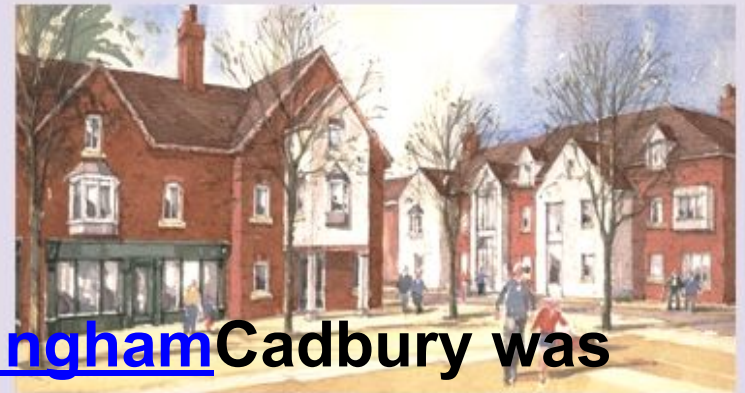
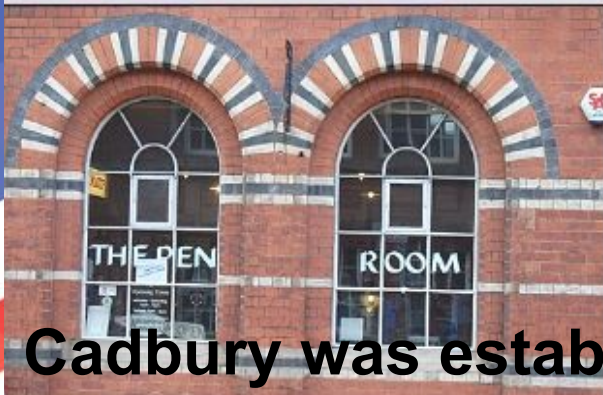

Madame Tussaud herself at the wax museum in London

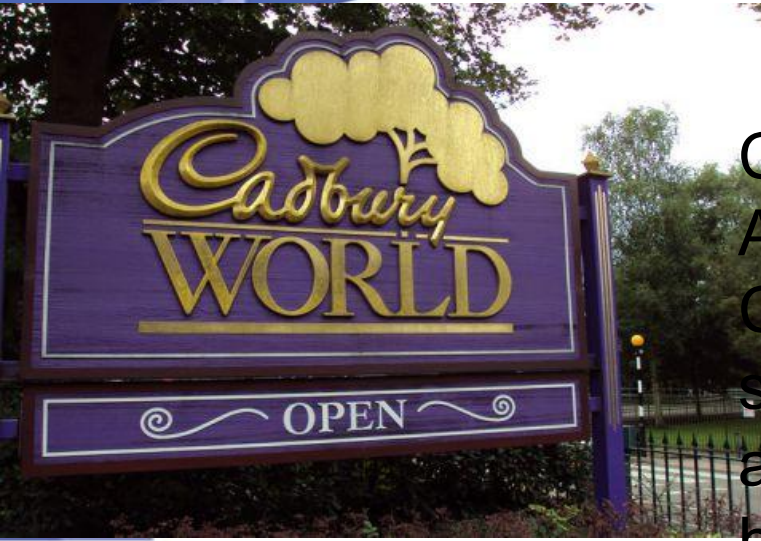


Cadbury World.

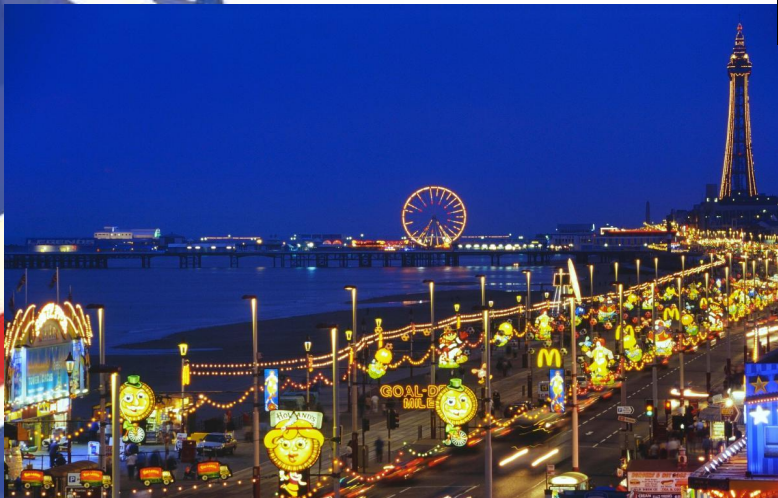

THE PALACE PIER AT BRIGHTON



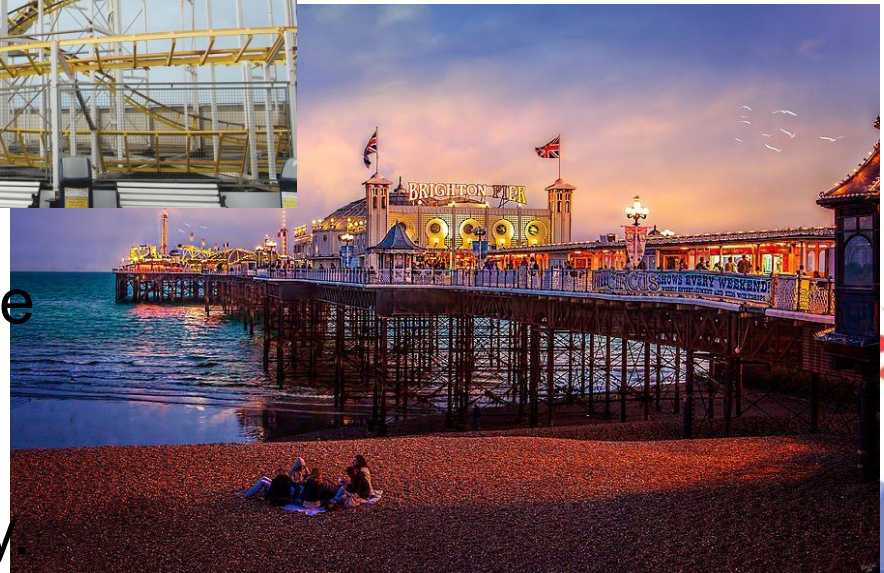
The English coastline is famous for its piers and the Palace Pier at Brighton is one of the most impressive examples.

STONEHENGE

It consists of a ring of standing stones with each standing stone around 13 feet (4.0 m) high, 7 feet (2.1 m) wide and weighing around 25 tons.
