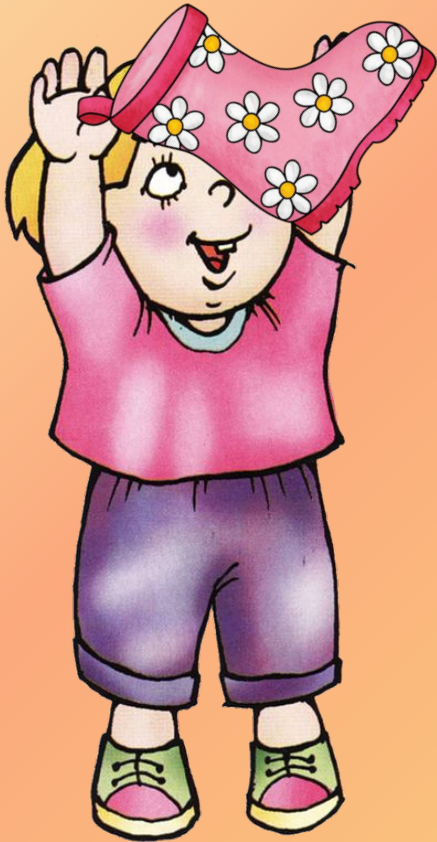

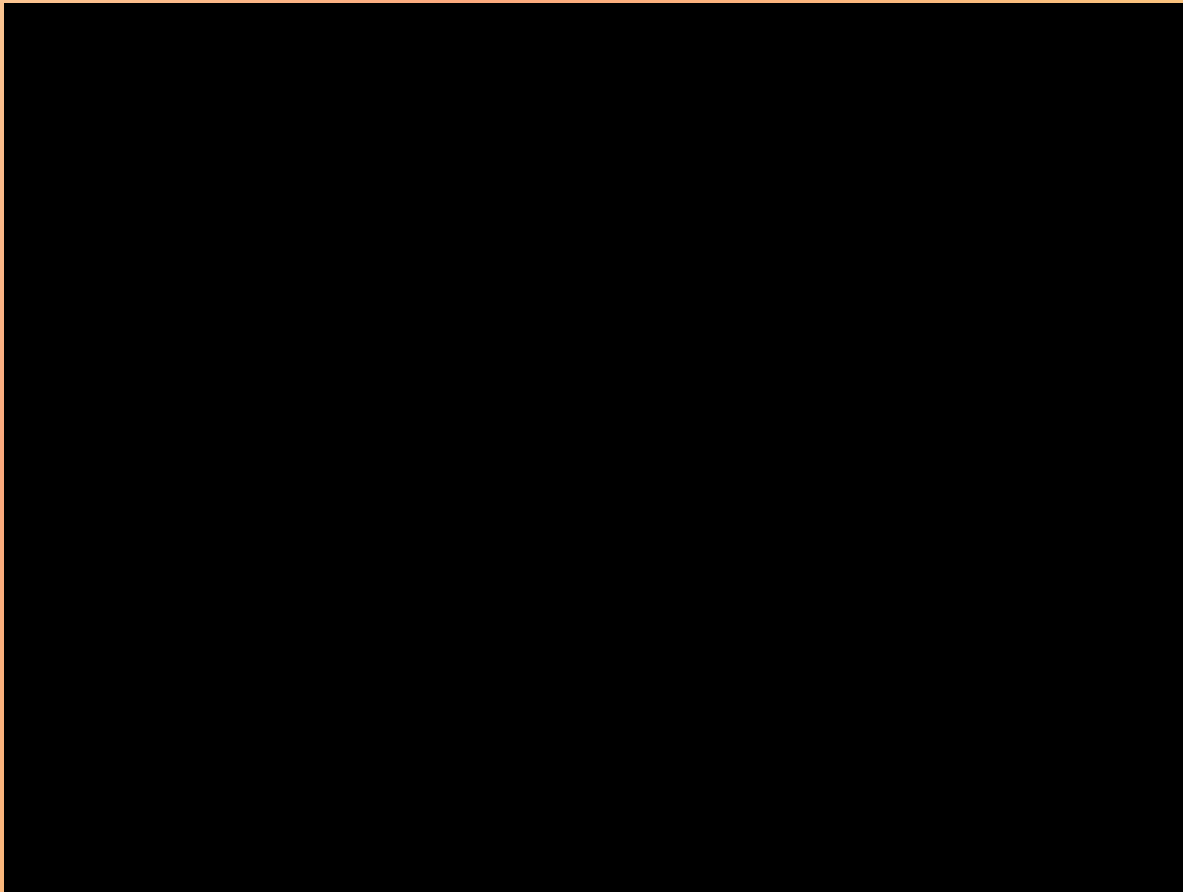
Taihape is a small town in the centre of the North Island. Every year since 1985, they celebrate Gumboot Day — a funny festival with a gumboot throwing contest.



A chocolate carnival



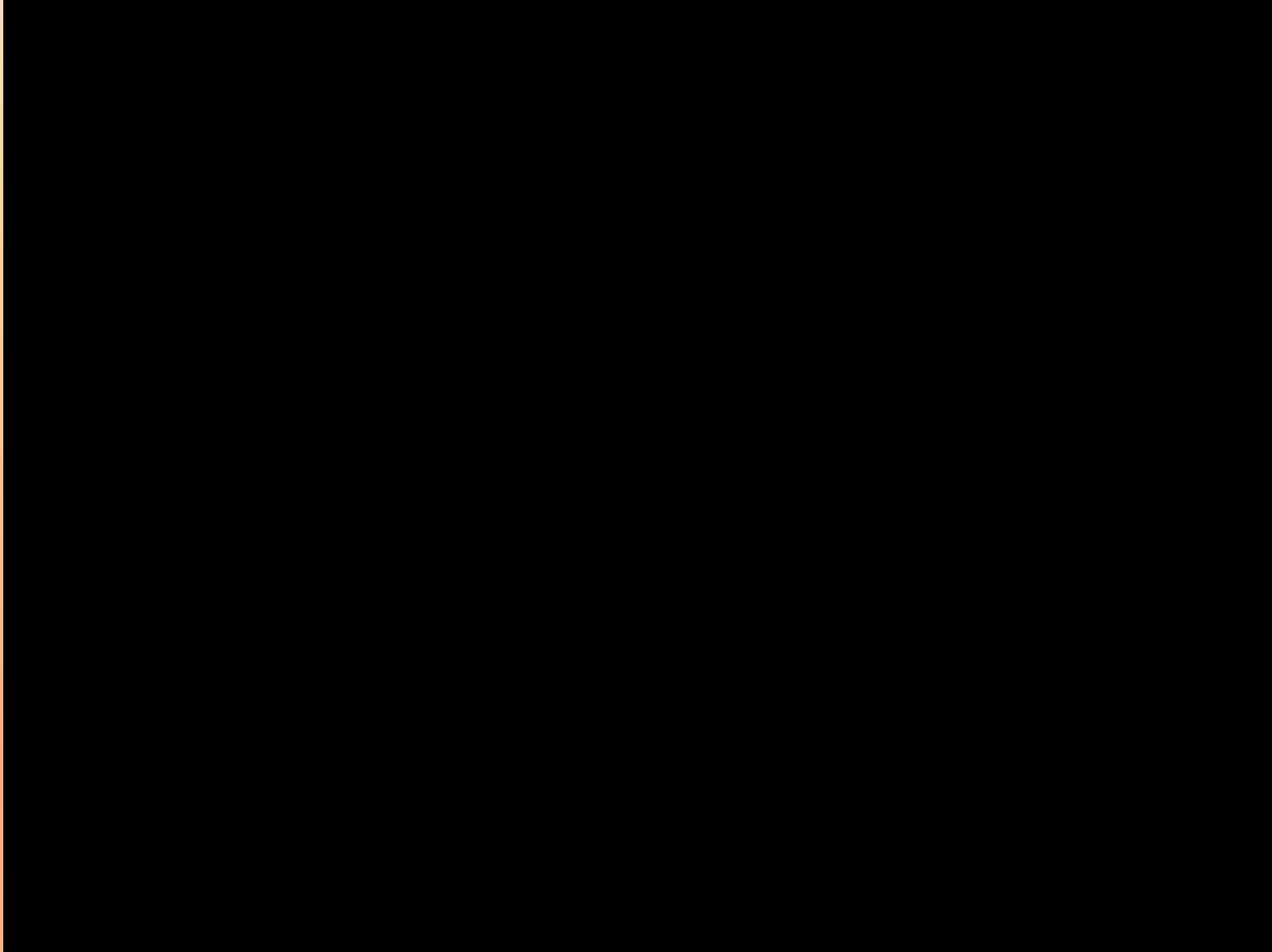
In Dunedin people throw chocolates down Baldwin Street. Chocolates race down this road.

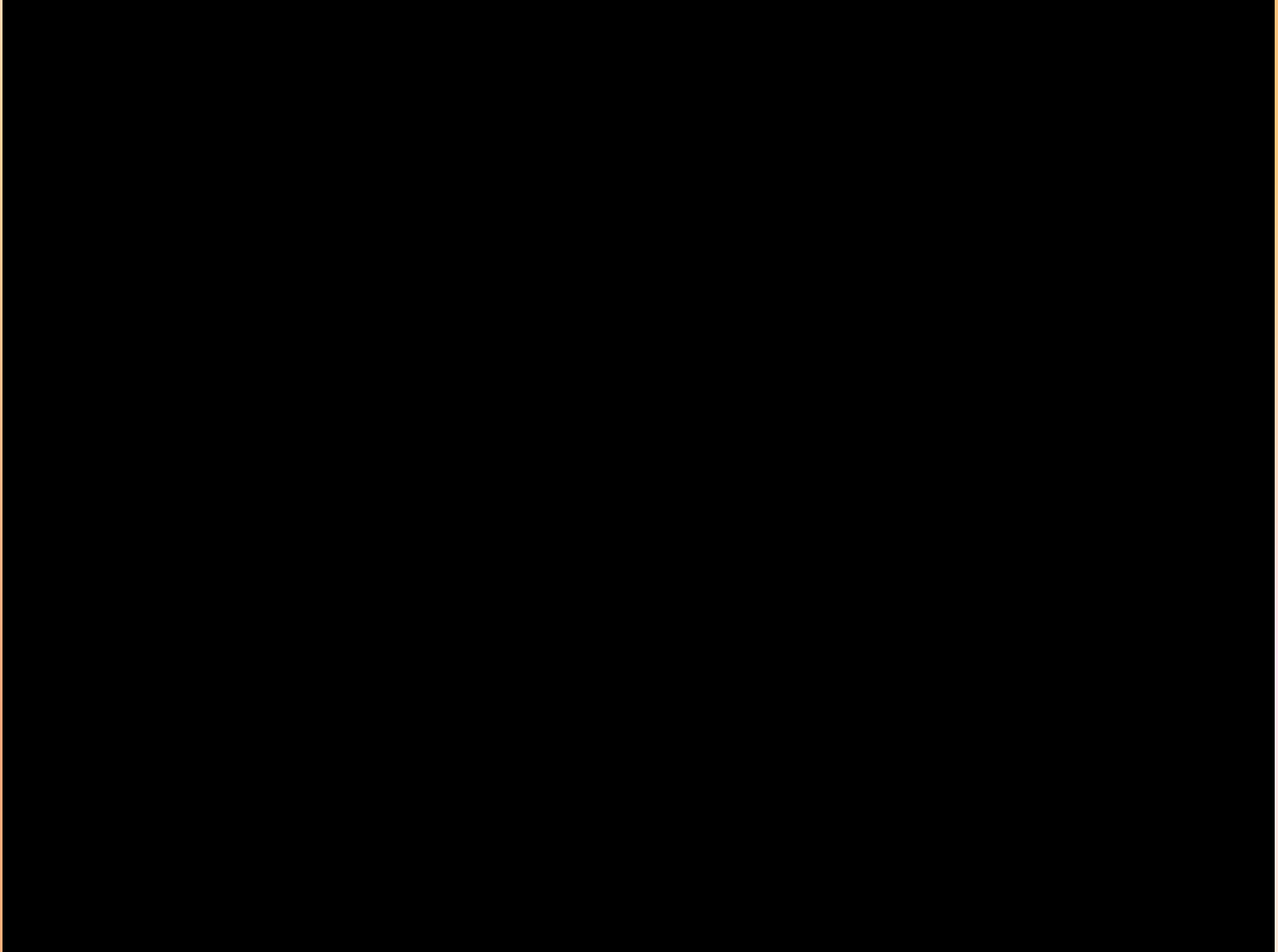
Hongi



Hangi

is the Maori **cooking method**. A hangi is prepared underground, using heated rocks that are buried in a pit oven. Food is placed on top of the stones, and items are covered with mats or bags for three hours during the cooking process. This is usually saved for special occasions.
