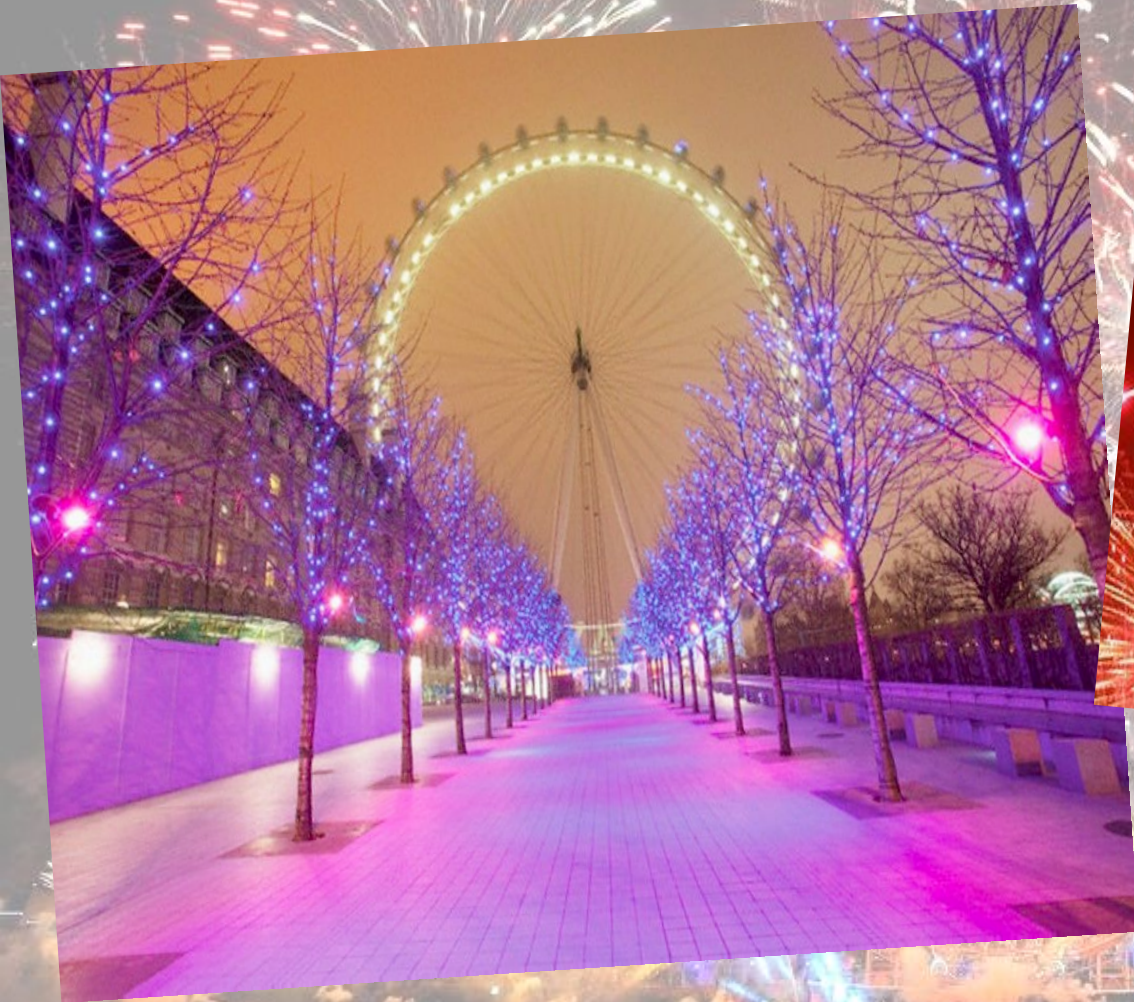
# The gifts Santa Claus
