
## 2<sup>nd</sup> or 3<sup>rd</sup> Conditional?



## 2<sup>nd</sup> or 3<sup>rd</sup> Conditional?




### 2<sup>nd</sup> or 3<sup>rd</sup> Conditional?

#### 2nd If the book were shorter, I would finished it sooner. 3rd If the book had been shorter, I would have finished it sooner. 2nd If I had a new pair of skies, I would take part it the competition. 3rd If I had had a new pair of skies, I would have taken part it the competition.
