The Aurora



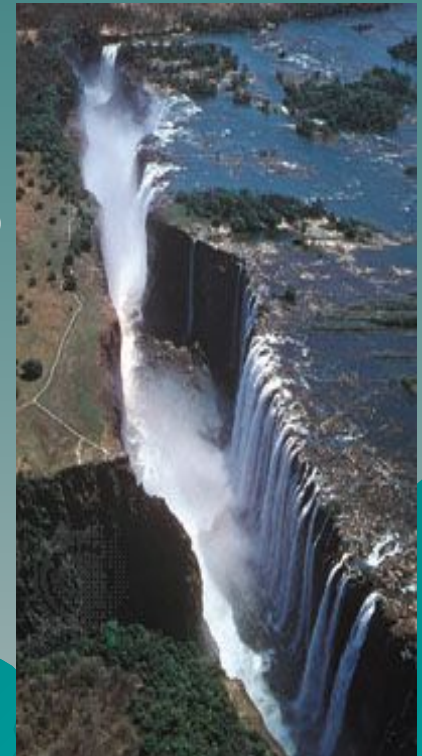
The Aurora has an endless variety of forms, including the auroral arch, the corona, and the auroral clouds.

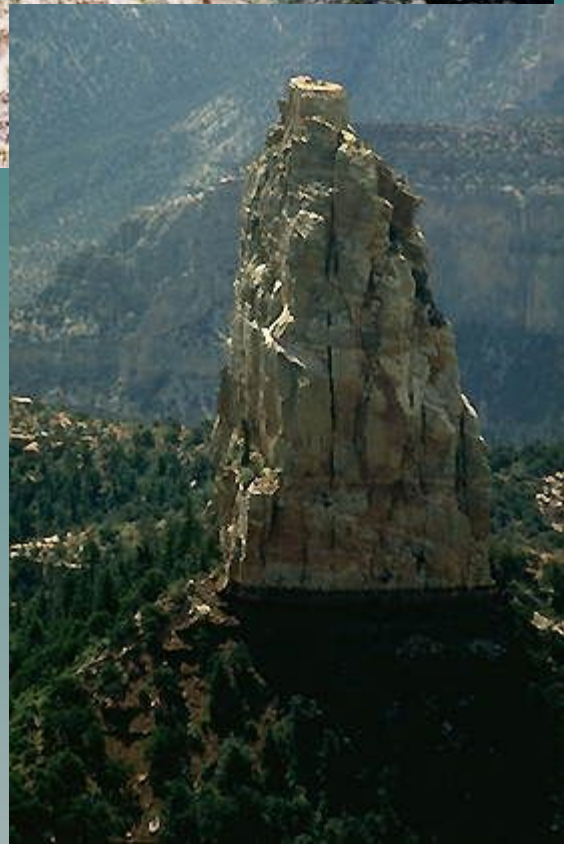

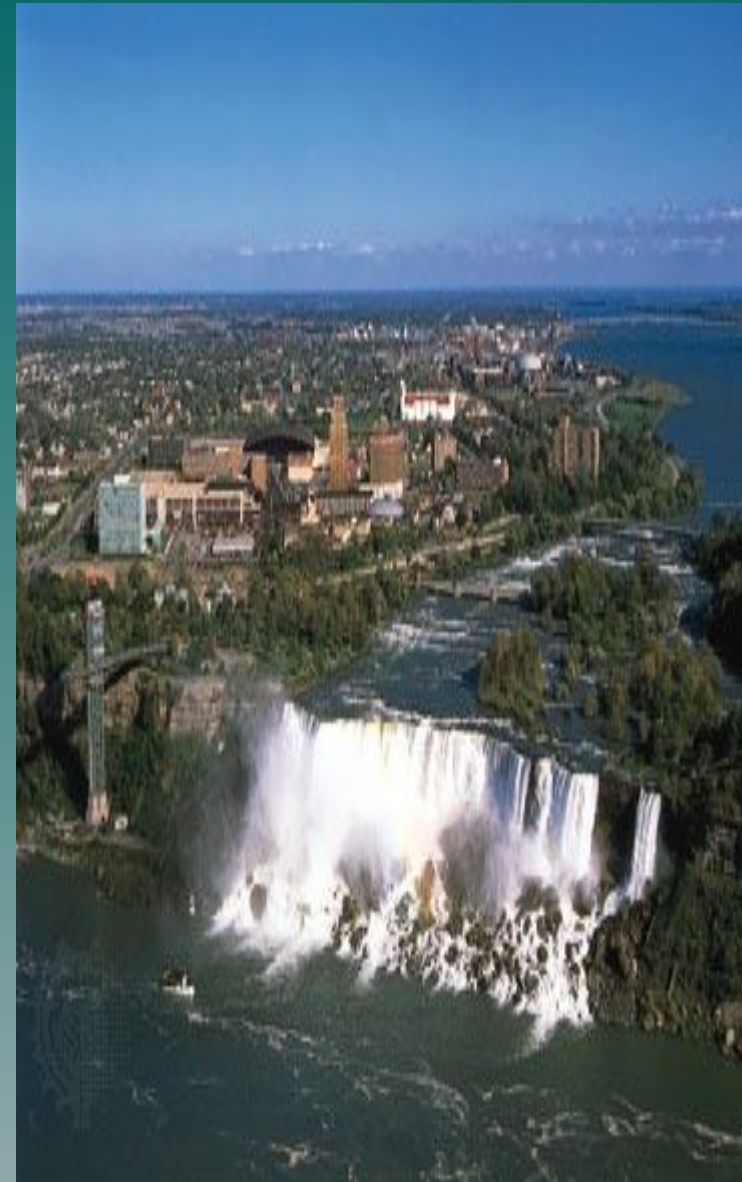
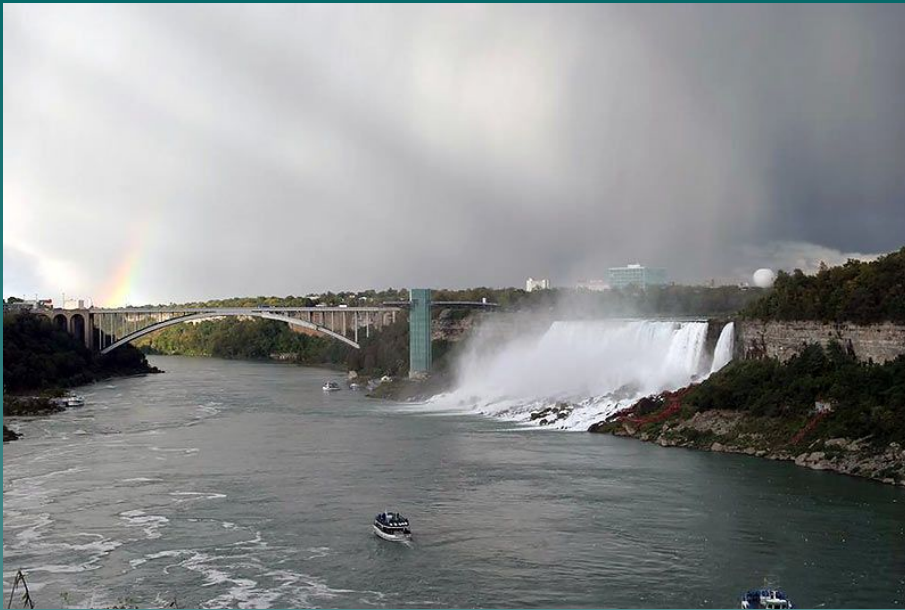


Niagara Falls
