

The history of the Red Book





- In 1949 the Commission on rare species was organized .
- It was composed of famous zoologists from all over the world.
- The Commission has done a great job : created the list of rare
- and endangered species of animals and formed the Red Book .

What is the Red Book?

It is a book about animals in danger of extinction.

Nicholas Sweet, the author of a lot of books about animals, says:

«The Red colour shouts: «STOP, STOP! YOU CANNOT GO ON LIKE THIS!»

The Red book itself does not protect, but only warns.

It consists of coloured pages.

On the red pages there are especially rare and endangered species

On the yellow pages there are vulnerable species of animals, whose number is rapidly declining


The white pages are devoted to animals, the number of which has always been small and their position unstable

On the grey pages there are animals that are still poorly known


On the green pages there are animals which may be saved from extinction










Conclusion
