



Premier to open museum

Tant to know what's new in bones and stones? If the answer is yes - next weekend you are in for a treat. The only complete Tyrannosaurus Rex skeleton in Australia can be viewed at the Australian Fossil and Mineral Museum, home of the Somerville Collection, during a special free open day for Bathurst residents on Saturday, July 24.

The museum will be officially opened by NSW Premier Bob Carr on Thursday, July

Following the open day, the museum will be open to the public on Monday, July 26.

The opening of the museum marks a significant time for Bathurst, adding to the

city's cultural diversity.

The museum is home to Professor Warren Somerville's magnificent minerals and fossils, one of the country's finest collections of international and Australian specimens that is valued at more than \$6.5 million.

Somerville Collection Management Committee chair Dr Peter Hodgson said the dream has been a long time in the making.

"The opening of the museum is a tribute to the team that has brought Warren Somerville's lifelong dream to reality," Dr.

Hodgson said.

"We look forward to Central West residents and tourists visiting the museum and enjoying a collection that has been meticulously collected, preserved and pre-

EIGHT years of battling for funding and holding discussions with the three levels of government has finally paid off for those involved in permanently housing the Somerville collection. The Australian Fossil and Mineral Museum, home of the Somerville Collection, will officially open for business on Monday, July 26. Bathurst residents will be given the chance to have a sneak preview however, at a free open day to be held on Saturday, July 24. In this week's Panorama BROOKE NEWSTEAD gives readers a quick glimpse into the museum. The following articles also tell the story of how one idea started the process of what would result in one of Australia's leading mineral and fossil museums.

After the doors open, the museum will host visiting exhibitions.

The first visiting exhibition is the SuperCroc, a spectacular flesh-on-bone bussized replica of the extinct crocodile Sarcosuchus Imperator, courtesy of the National Geographic Channel.

"With a national museum comes the opportunity to host special feature exhibits," Dr Hodgson said.

"We look forward to hosting many wonderful displays that provide something new to see on a regular basis."

Curator and denor of the Collection, Professor Warren Somerville is a long time Central West resident who has spent his

life amassing this most significant fossil and mineral collection.

"The Central West means a great deal to me and donating my collection for display in the region has ensured that a premier museum is created for people to enjoy now and for many years to come," he said.

The exhibitions include close to 2000 mineral and fossil specimens.

Dr Hodgson said the centrepiece of the fossil collection is without a doubt the T-

"It measures more than 10 metres long and four metres high and is Australia's only complete T-Rex skeleton.

"The door to the museum had to be

widened just to get T-Rex's head inside," he said.

Also significant to the collection are the fossils in amber and the museum has one of the only two lizards in amber ever found.

Mineral specimens at the Museum include gold, diamonds and other precious gems in

their natural crystal state.

The building restoration and museum development has taken many years to complete and has been made possible through the generous support of the NSW Government, Charles Sturt University, Bathurst Regional Council, The Australian Museum and contributors including Masterfoods Australia New Zealand Newcrest Mining and Omya and some generous private sponsorship from individuals and small businesses.

The museum, located in Howick Street, will be open Monday-Saturday from 10am to 4pm and on Sunday from 10am to 2pm.

Entry is \$8 for adults, \$6 concession, \$4 for children with a family pass available for

Tickets for the free open day can be picked up at Peter Rogers Real Estate in Howick Street, however there are only a limited number available.

Bathurst residents must provide identification of their Bathurst residency upon collecting their free tickets.
