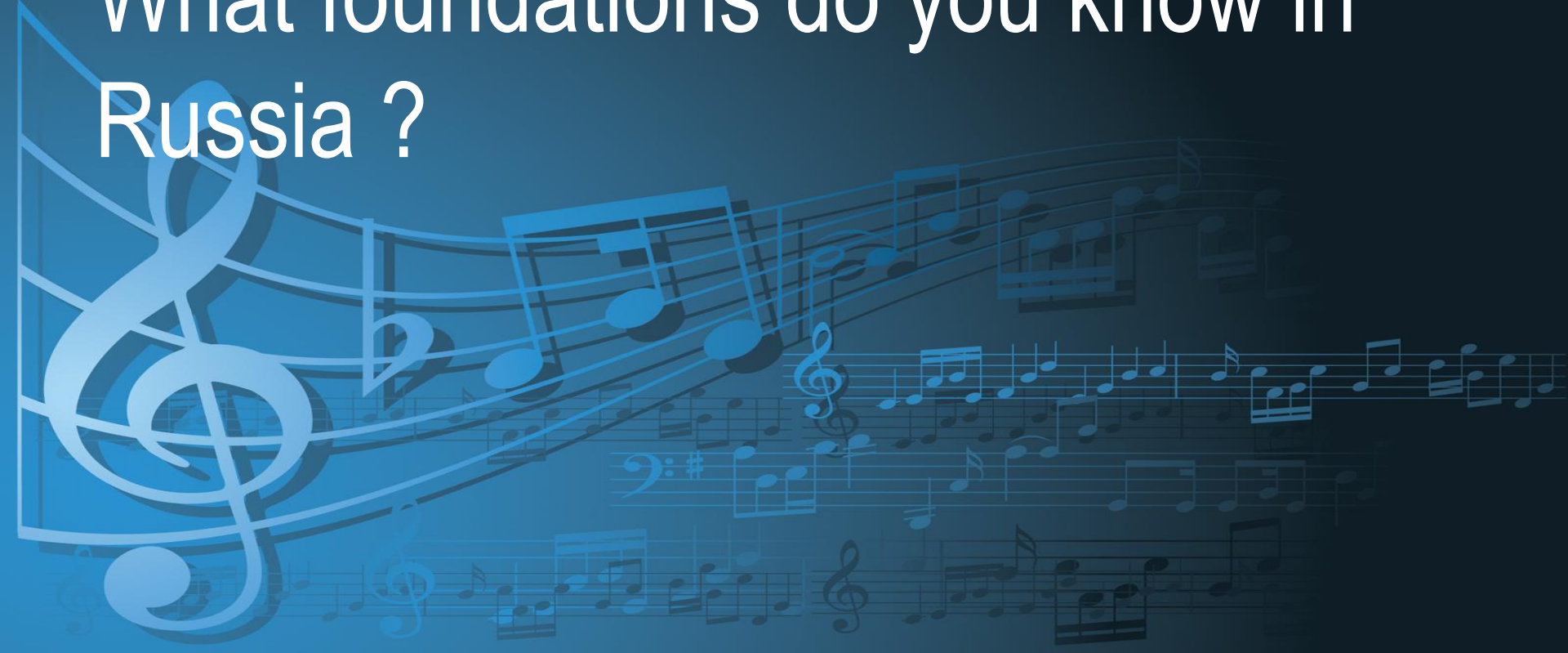


What foundations do you know in

Musical Instruments



Gifted - A gifted person has a natural ability or is extremely intelligent.

Composer - someone who writes music.

Preserve - to keep something the same or prevent it from being damaged or destroyed.

Follow in sb's footsteps - to do the same job or the same things in your life as someone else, especially a member of your family.

Forefather - someone's relatives who lived a long time ago.

Invest - to put money, effort, time, etc. into something to make a profit or get an advantage.

Award - to give money or a prize following an official decision.

Fee - an amount of money paid for a particular piece of work or for a particular right or service.

Jury - a group of people who have been chosen to listen to all the facts in a trial in a law court and to decide if a person is guilty or not guilty, or if a claim has been proved.

Worthy - deserving respect, admiration, or support.

Expenses - the use of money, time, or effort.

Review - to think or talk about something again, in order to make changes to it or to make a decision about it.

Scholarship - an amount of money given by a school, college, university, or other organization to pay for the studies of a person with great ability but little money.

Foundation - an organization that has been created in order to provide money for a particular group of people in need of help or for a particular type of study.

Fund-raising - the activity of persuading people and organizations to give money for something.
