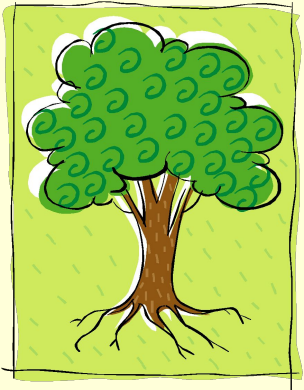




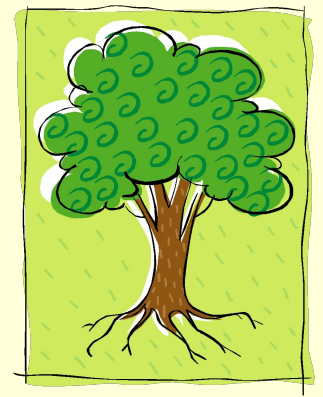
# Learn the tongue-twister

If all the trees were bread and cheese,

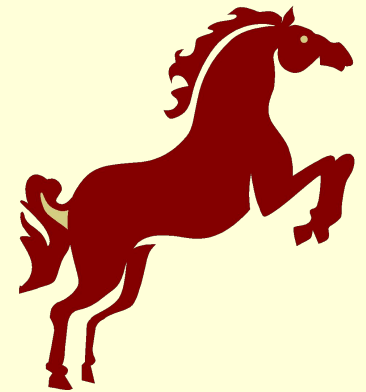
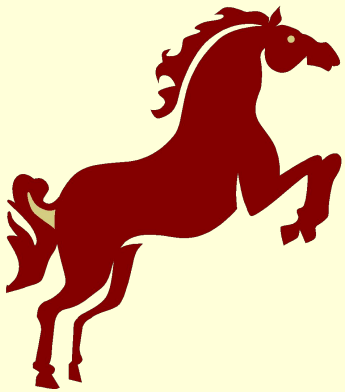
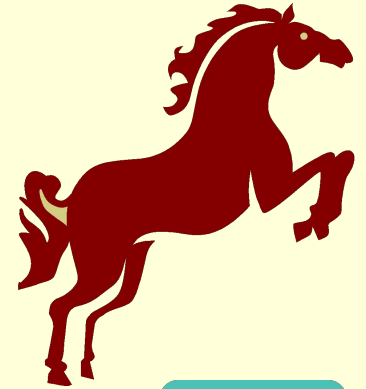
- What would we have to drink?

# Unreal condition referring to the present

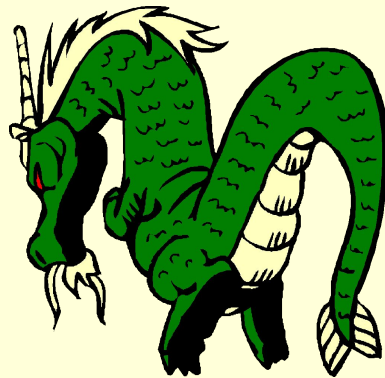
- What would you do if you inherited a million dollars?

# Unreal condition referring to the present

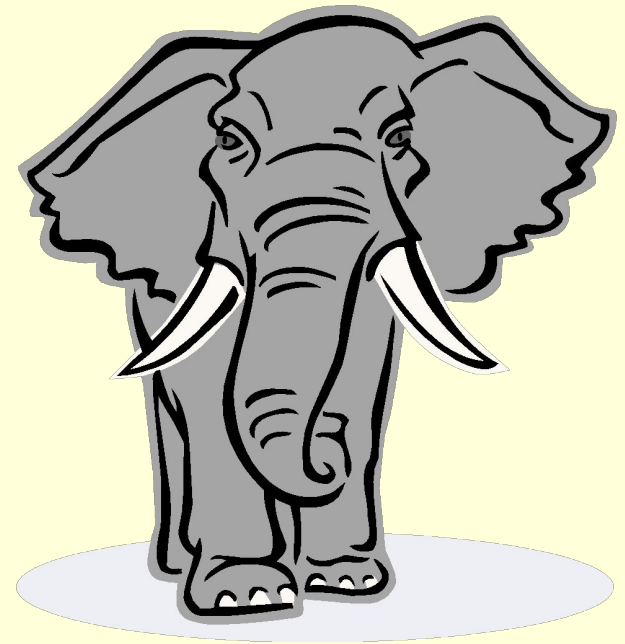
- What would you do if it rained for forty days and forty nights?
