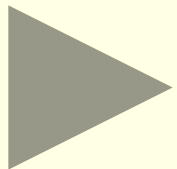

■ If you drop an apple, it ....

- fall
- falls
- will fall



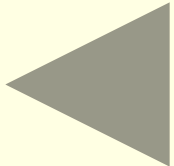
# Wrong 😞

The conditional *O* is used to express general truths and facts (often things based on scientific fact).

Uses the simple present tense:-

(IF Clause)	(Main Clause)
If you heat water to 100°C,	it boils.

Try it again 😊



- If you don't water indoor plants, they ....
  - will die
  - dies
  - die



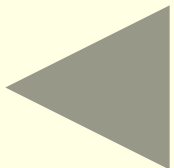
# Wrong 😞

  - am late, gets



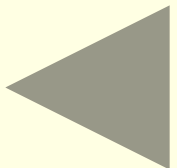

- If it ....., we ..... at home.
  - will rain, stay
  - rain, stay
  - rains, will stay



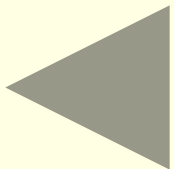


# Wrong 😞

  - will arrive, hurries
  - arrives, hurries
  - arrives, will hurry

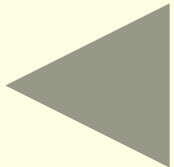

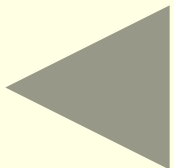

- If he ..... more, he ..... the exam.
  - study, will pass
  - studied, would pass
  - studied, pass



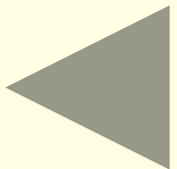

If I won the lottery,	I would buy a new house.

- I ... lower taxes if I ... the President.
  - would, were
  - would, was
  - will, is





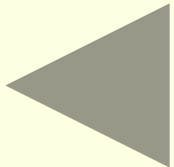
# Wrong 😞

■ They ... buy a new house if they ... more money.

- would, have
- will, have
- would, had



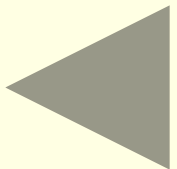

# Third Conditional

- If he had known that, he would have decided differently.
  - had known, would have
  - has known, would have
    - was known, had



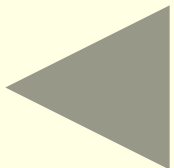
# Wrong 😞

Used to express conditions in the past that did not happen. Often used to express criticism or regret with would have, could have or should have.

Uses the past perfect tense:-

(IF Clause)	(Main Clause)
If I had worked harder,	I would have passed my exam.

Try it again 😊



- Jane ..... a new job if she ..... in Boston.
  - will find, has
  - would have found, stayed
  - would have found, had stayed



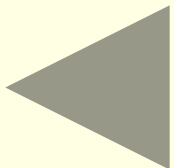
# Wrong 😞

  - had gone, had watched



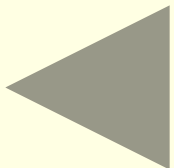

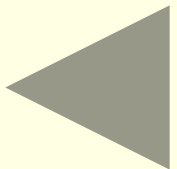
# Mixed Conditionals

- If I .... to that concert tonight, I .... very excited.
  - was going, would have
  - were going, would be
  - have gone, would

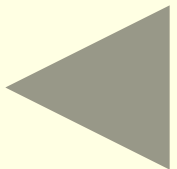
- If I ..... an aspirin, I ..... a headache now.
  - had taken, would have
  - had taken, wouldn't have
  - have taken, wouldn't have

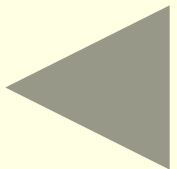
- If she had enough money, she could have done this trip to Hawaii.

- I **wish** I ... on a beach. (I'm in the office.)
  - was
  - is
  - will
