Centered 5/8 across and 9/16 up flag Outer diameter 1/14 length of flag Inner diameter 4/9 outer diameter 7 pointed




Epsilon Crucis

Centered 4/5 across and 11/24 up flag Outer diameter 1/24 length of flag Inner diameter 4/9 outer diameter 5 pointed



Alpha Crucis Centered 3/4 across and 1/6 up flag Outer diameter 1/14 length of flag Inner diameter 4/9 outer diameter 7 pointed
