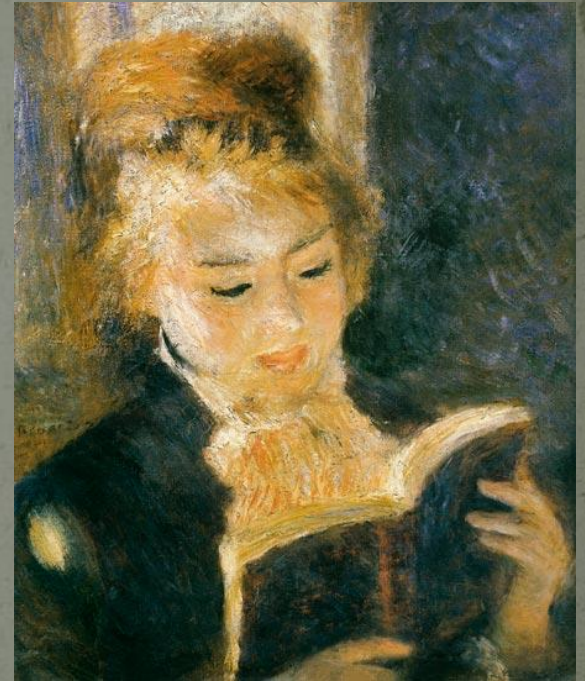
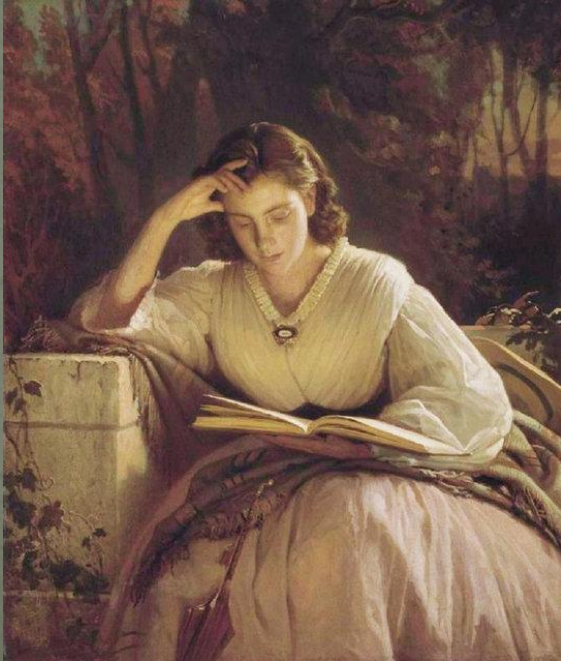


World masterpieces of Russian literature

the great Russian poet.

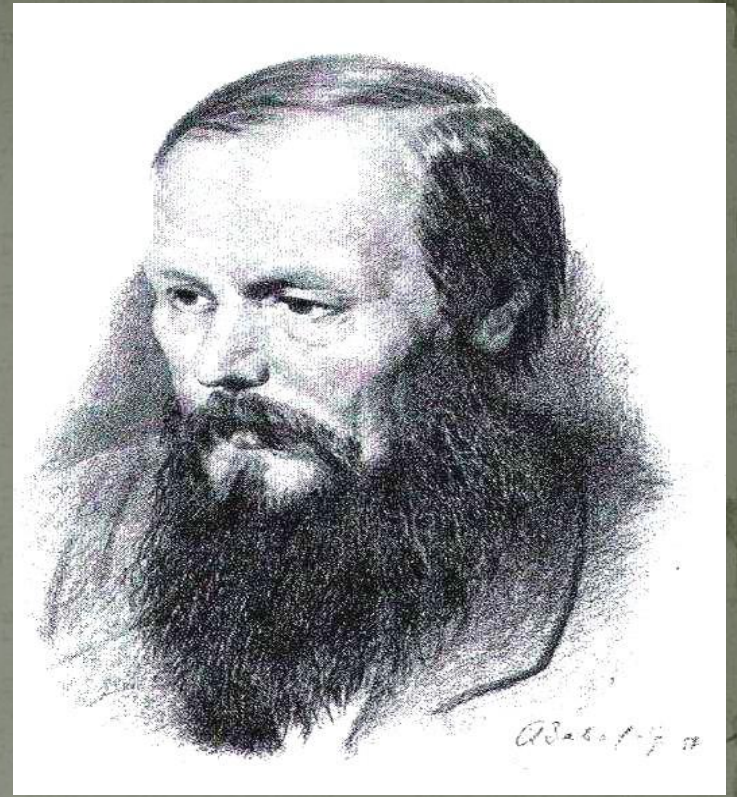
As Oleg Menshikov said:

mysterious Russian soul.

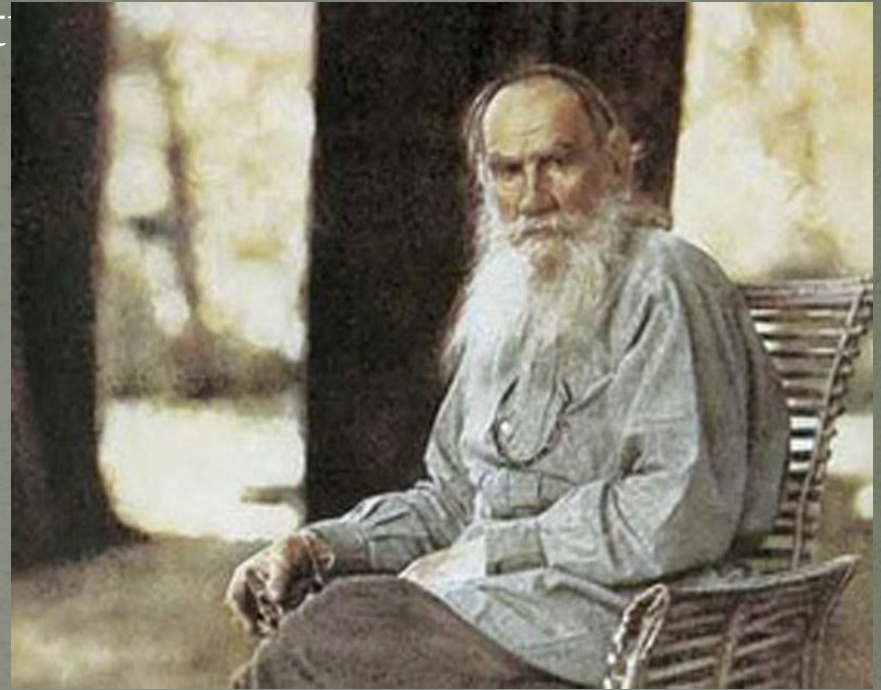


Lev Tolstoy was a writer, recognized during the lifetime of the head of Russian literature.

Mikhail Lermontov, Russian poet, novelist, playwright, artist. Readers get familiar with the school's most famous poems of Lermontov. Some of his works include such poems as "Sail", "Death of a Poet", "Borodino", "Angel", "Mermaid", etc. And "Sail" has become an integral part of Russian culture. But the poet at the time of its writing was only seventeen years old. That's really genius from birth.
