

• Sitka is the city where Alaska was sold in 1867. Before 1808 it had been named Novo Archanglsk.





# State Holiday



- Alaska's day, October 18, is the anniversary of the formal transfer of the territory and the raising of the US flag at Sitka on October 18, 1867.

Benny Benson was a 13-year-old boy Russian-Aleut by birth. The Flag was established as the official Flag of Alaska Territory in 1927.


On January 3, 1959, Alaska became the 49<sup>th</sup> state of America.
