- you're busy

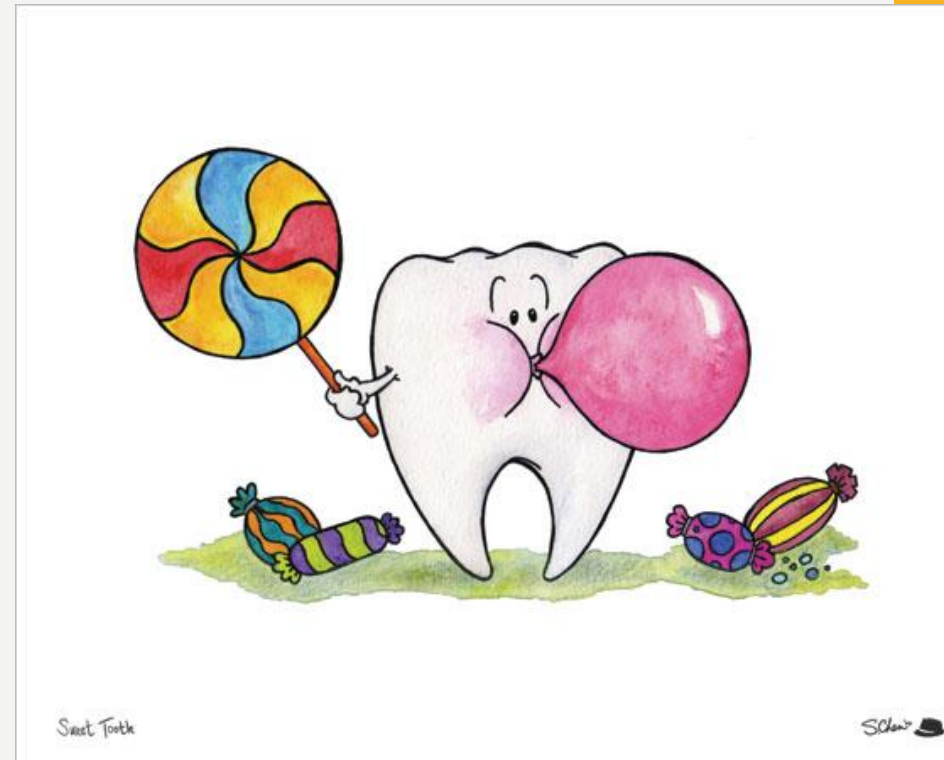


Answer: You're busy
