
Welcome To The United States Of America The USA is a very big country : the rivers and the mountains are big, and the population is big.

The total area of the USA is over nine million square kilometers. The USA occupies the territory from the Pacific Ocean to the Atlantic Ocean. In the west it is washed by the Pacific Ocean. Its eastern coast is washed by the Atlantic Ocean and the Gulf of Mexico. It is also washed by the Arctic Ocean, the Bering Sea and the Caribbean Sea. In the North the USA has a border with Canada. In the South it shares borders with Mexico.

The word "**Niagara**" is an Indian word which means "roaring waters'. And that is definitely true because the loud sound of falling water can be heard 25 kilometers away from the place. The cliff where the water is falling from is 27 meters, so it makes a very loud noise.

The colours have symbolic meaning too: red- hardiness and valour, white- purity and innocence, blue- justice. The US flag has thirteen white lines, or stripes, that represent the thirteen colonies; the fifty stars represent the fifty states.
