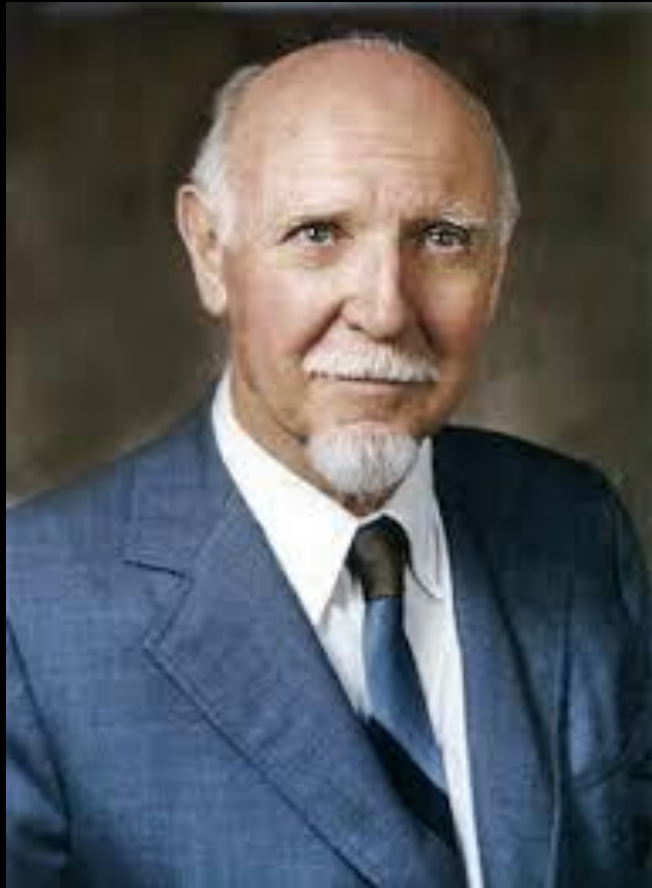
Cattell enrolled at the Royal College of the University of London



After completing his work in Columbia, he moved to the University of Clark, Massachusetts, where he headed the department, which later became known as the "Stanley Hall Chair."

The main works

- The most significant work in this direction:
- 1946 - "Description and measurement of personality"
- 1950 - "Personality: Systematic Theoretical and Actual Research"
- 1957 - "The personal and motivational structural dimension"
- 1965 - "Scientific analysis of personality"
- 1982 - "Inheritance of personality and abilities"
- 1987 - Beyondism: Religion from Science.
- Also R. Kettel conducted interesting psychological studies in the field of: humor (1947), musical preferences (1954), leadership (1954), intelligence (1963), psychopathology (1966), creativity (1968), reaction setting (1968).



Cattell was a laureate of the Darwin Society Prize, received the Wenner Gren Award from the New York Academy of Sciences, and the American Psychological Association's "Outstanding Work in the Field of Measurement" award. Cattell was the first president of the Society for Multivariate Experimental Psychology and, in recognition of his merits, was elected a full member of the British Psychological Society.
