

The Smallest House in Britain

In the country of the legendary King Arthur and the wizard Merlin, in the country of eccentrics and wonders in Conwy there is the ugliest house in Britain. It's located in the village which name includes 58 letters and where the bright butterflies are painted on every house. It's the most visited place in Conwy which is called "Fisherman house" and listed in the Guinness Book of Records as the smallest house in Britain...

It was built in the harbor of Conwy,
In a small coastal settlement in
North Wales in the 14th century. Its
size is 360 to 312 to 371
centimeters. There are 2 rooms in it.
In the 19th century a family of 8
people lived in the house!



The last owner of the house was a fisherman Robert Jones. With his normal height, Robert Jones was unable to stand upright in the room.



However, a bed with a mattress for the Bible in the head was placed in the room. There was also a fireplace and other simple household goods which could quite reasonably sustain the people who lived there. However, Albion natives thought that Robert Jones' house was not convenient, not because of its size but because there wasn't the main attribute of a comfortable life – a bath.



If you want to visit Wales

A Welsh lady in traditional clothing stands outside when the house is open and will tell you about the history of the house. Visitors are unable to go upstairs to the first floor, due to structural instability, but can view it from the step ladder. It is open from spring to autumn.



To look at this wonder of the previous centuries, thousands of tourists come to Conwy annually...
