A General truth

B Probable situation in the future or present

C Imaginary situation in the present or future

D Imaginary situation in the past (regrets)

Type	Condition	Main Clause	Use
0	If + present simple	present simple, imperative	general truth
	<i>If you heat ice, it melts.</i>		
1	If+ present simple	can/will/may + bare infinitive	probable situation in the future/ present
	<i>If they play well, they'll win the match.</i>		
2	If + past simple	could/would/may + bare infinitive	imaginary situation in the present/future
	<i>If I were you. I'd take up tennis.</i>		
3	If + past perfect	could/would/might have + past participle	imaginary situation in the past, regret about the past
	<i>If we had revised more, we would have passed the test.</i>		

Type 0 (общепринятые истины)



If\when + Present Simple, Present Simple

If Present Simple, will\ can\ may\ must

e.g. If you go to London, you can see Big Ben.

1  London/ Big Ben	2  Rome/the Colosseum	3  New York/the Empire State Building
4  Paris/the Eiffel Tower	5  Egypt/the Pyramids	6  Sydney/the Sydney Opera House
7  Venice/some gondolas	8  Hawaii/some palm trees

Type 1

If Present Simple, will\ can\ may\ must

1 A: I'd like a cup of coffee.

B: Well, if you ...*hold*... (hold) the baby for five minutes, I (make) it for you.

2 A: I must go to the bank.

B: If you (leave) now, you (get) there before it closes.

3 A: I can't do everything myself!

B: Well, if you (wash) the dishes, I (cook) the meal.

4 A: Are you going on holiday this year?

B: Yes, I (go) to Spain for two weeks if I (have) some time off work.

Type 2

If + Past Simple, could\would\may + infinitive

- 1 If I ...*were*... (be) you, I ...*would study*... (study) for the exams.
- 2 If we (have) a car, we (go) for a drive in the country.
- 3 Kim (buy) some new clothes if she (have) enough money.
- 4 If cameras (not/cost) so much, we (buy) one.
- 5 John (lend) you some money if you (ask) him.
- 6 He (open) the door if he (have) the key.
- 7 We (paint) the house if we (have) the time.
- 8 If she (get) good grades, she (go) to university.
- 9 If I (be) rich, I (never/ work) again.
- 10 Helen (post) the letters if she (have) some stamps.

Type 2

If + Past Simple, could\would\may + infinitive

order a pizza, complain to the manager, light some candles, go to hospital, call the police, stay in bed

- 1 You see someone robbing a bank.
If I saw someone robbing a bank, I would call the police.
- 2 A shop assistant is rude to you.
- 3 You fall over and break your arm.
- 4 You burn your dinner.
- 5 There is a power cut in your house.
- 6 You catch a bad cold.

◆ We can use **were** instead of was for all persons.
e.g. *If Peter was/were here, he would tell us what to do.*

If it were summer now, I would _____ .



Giving advice

If I were you, I would (I'd) + infinitive

e.g. SA: *Shall I paint the fence red or green?*
SB: *If I were you, I'd paint it red.*



paint the fence/red/green



order a salad/a sandwich



have some coffee/orange juice



buy a dog/a goldfish



go to Japan/France



take up golf/baseball

Type 3

If + had V3, would/could/might + have+V3

- 1 If you ...*hadn't been*... (not/be) in a hurry, you ...*wouldn't/might not have forgotten*... (not/forget) your keys.
- 2 If he (remember) earlier, he (send) her a birthday card.
- 3 If you (not/be) ill, you (go) to the party.
- 4 Jason (not/break) his arm if he (be) more careful.
- 5 Helen (get) wet if she (not/take) her umbrella.
- 6 If I (do) my homework, my teacher (not/shout) at me.
- 7 You (pass) the test if you (study) more.
- 8 If she (close) the gate, the rabbit (not/run away).
- 9 She (lose) her keys if I (not/pick) them up.
- 10 If he (save) some money, he (be able) to go on holiday.
