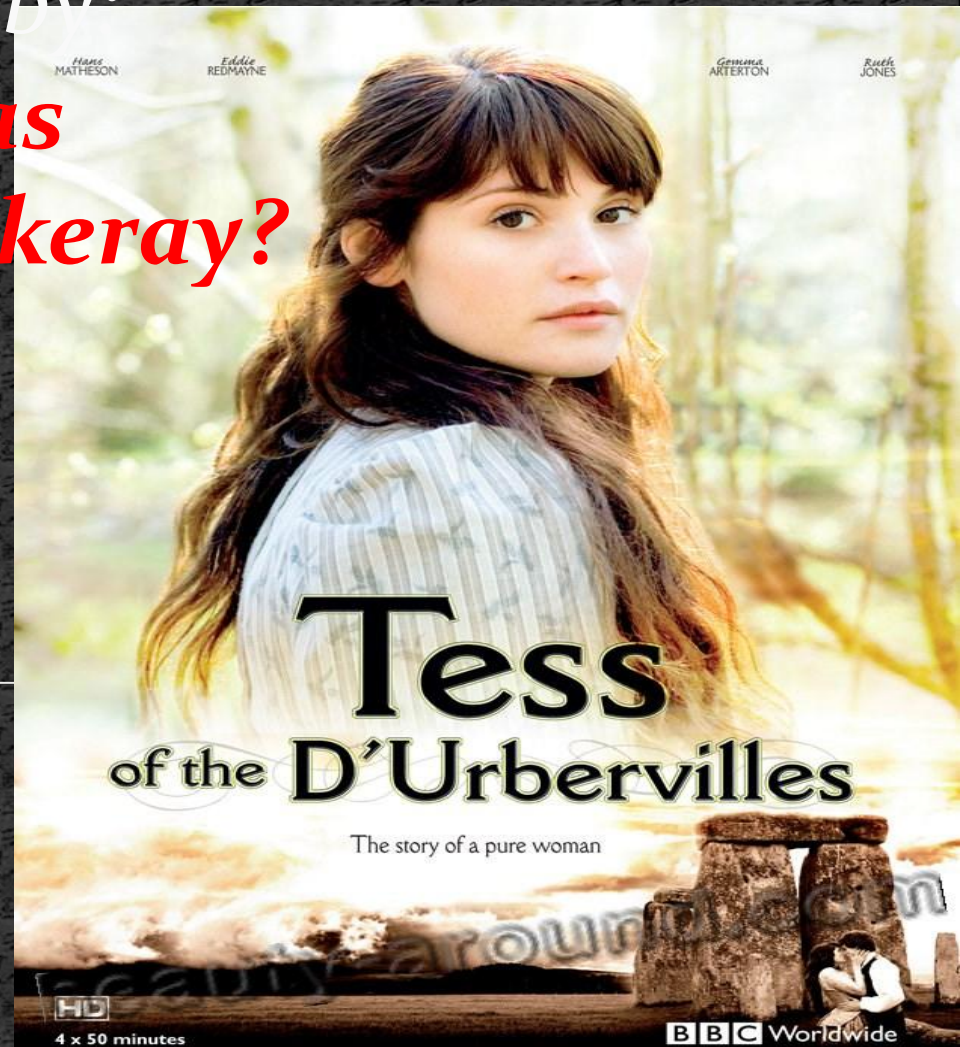

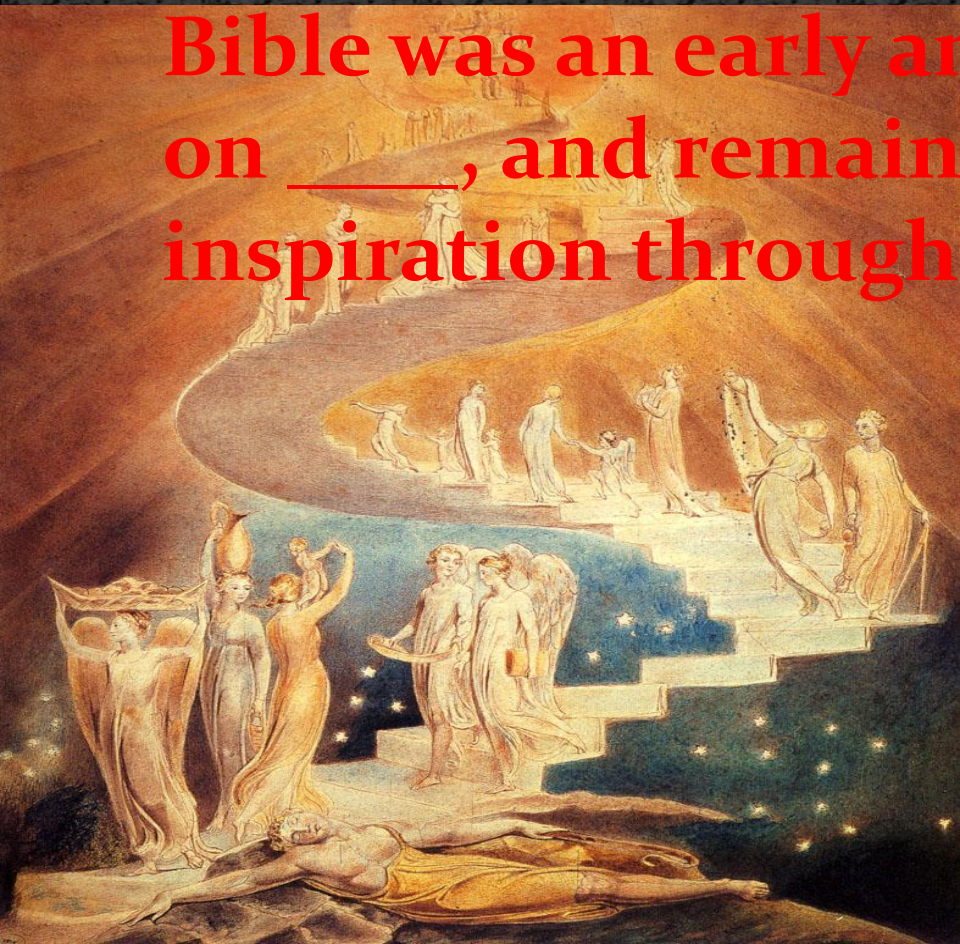

Genre: **Fantasy, high fantasy, translation, literary criticism.**



Had a military career. Served in the British Army. Years of service: 1915–1920.

Rank :Lieutenant. Battles/wars: World War I (Battle of the Somme).

He was at one time a close friend of C. S. Lewis.

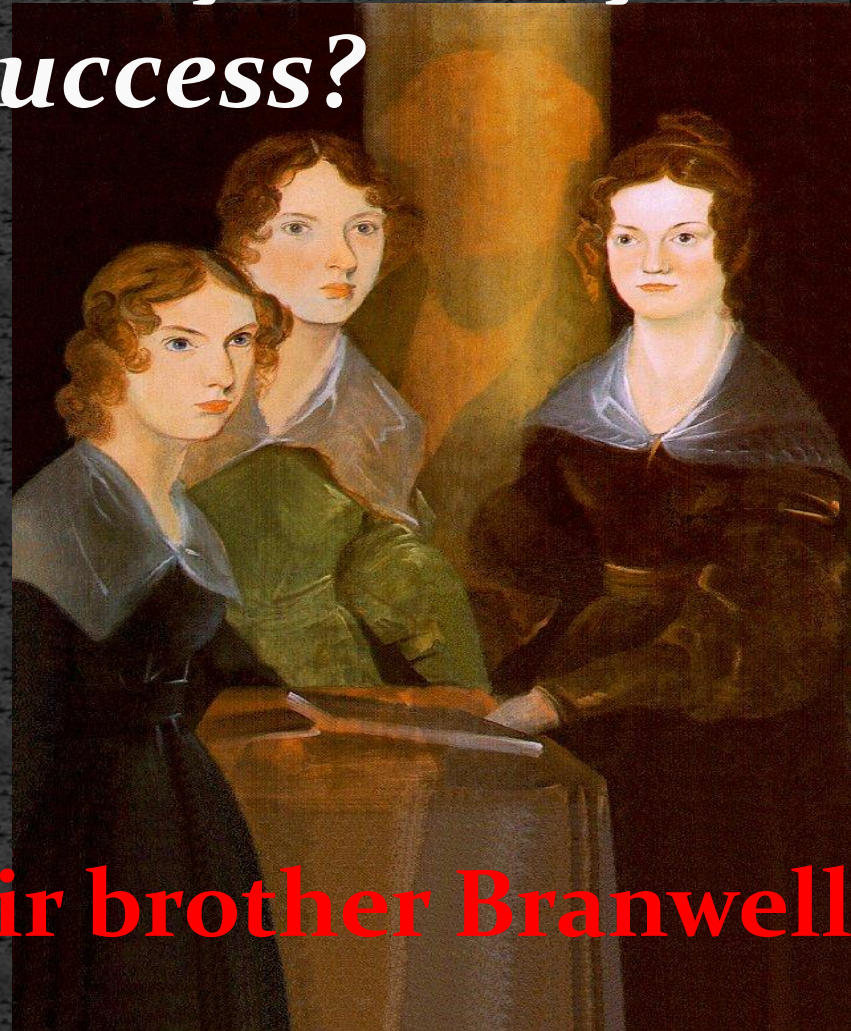
