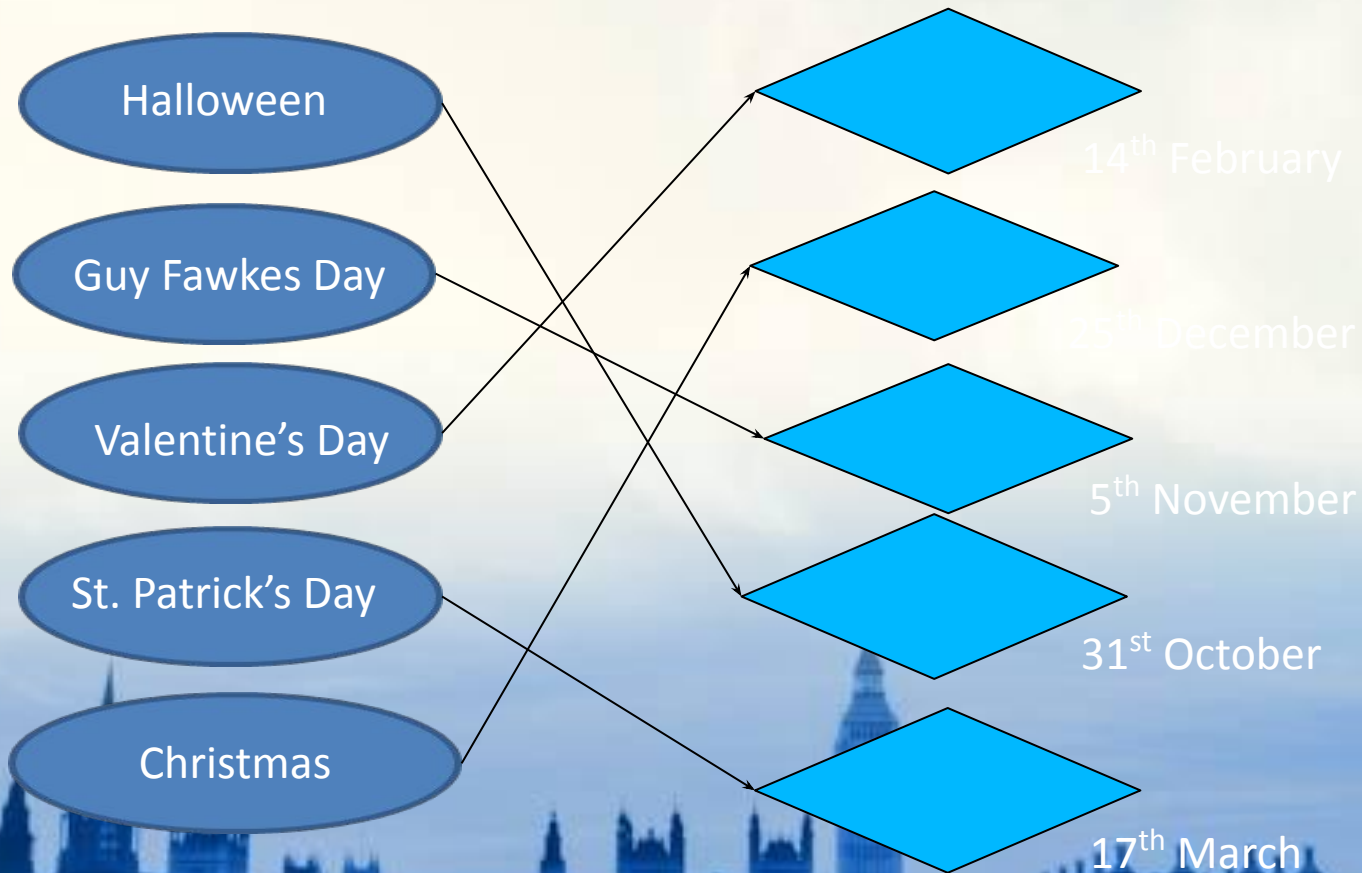

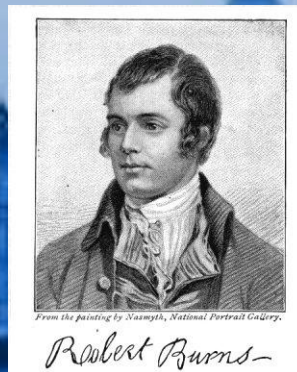
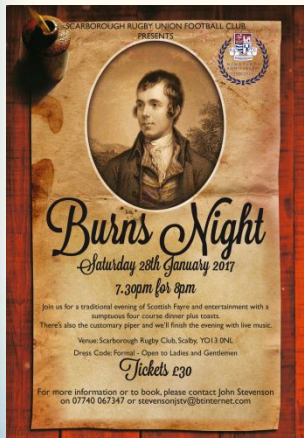

The 25-th of January is the birthday of the greatest Scottish poet, Robert Burns. This date is usually celebrated in all English-speaking countries.

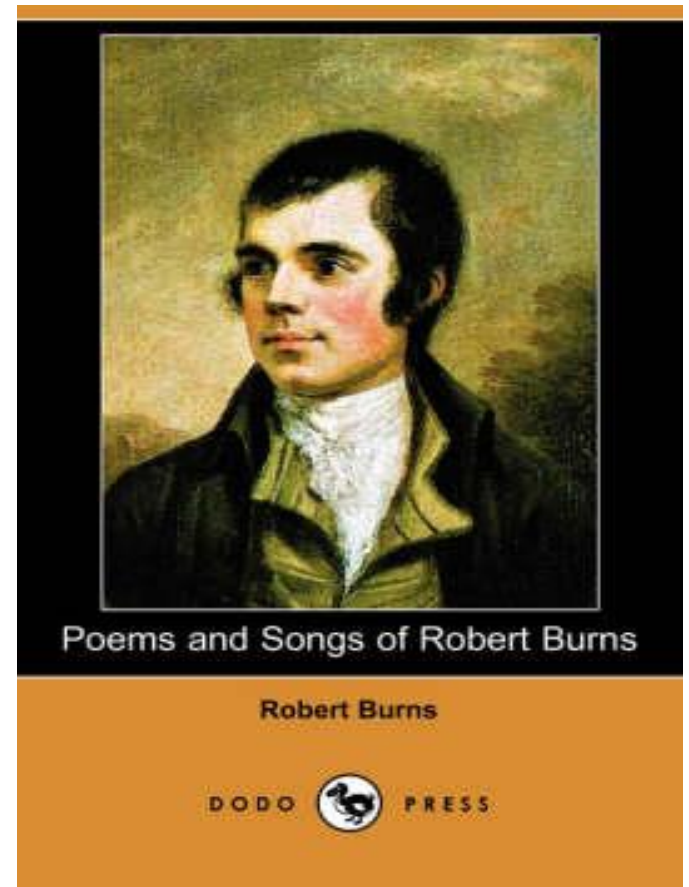

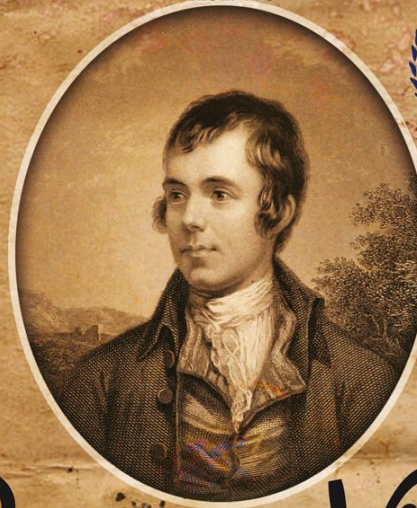

all over the world.

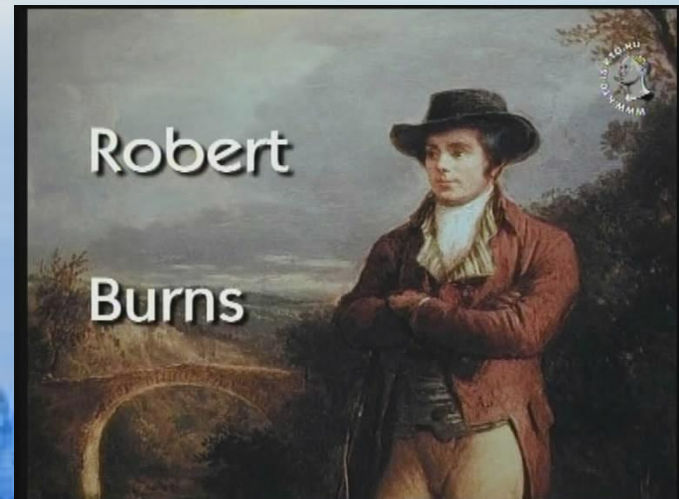
