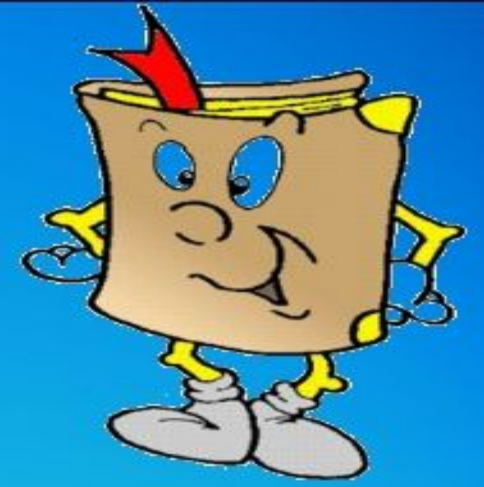


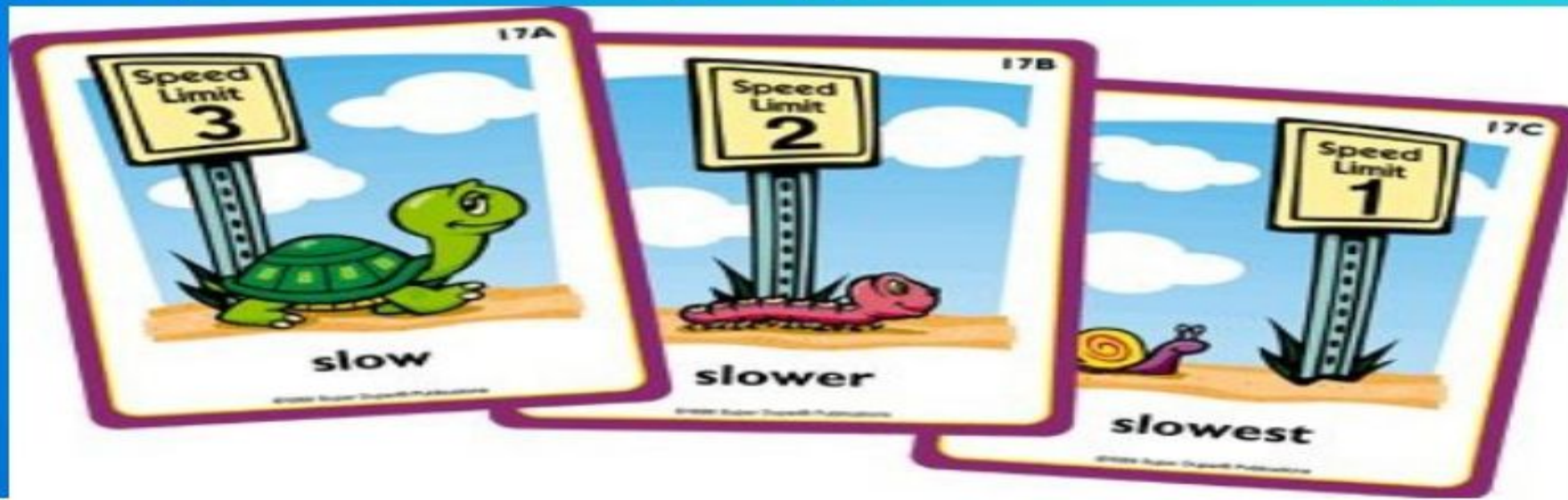

Make three degrees of comparison



strong -stronger – the strongest



fat -fatter – the fattest



nice -nicer – the nicest



tasty -tastier – the tastiest

Degrees of Comparison of Adjectives

	Positive	Comparative	Superlative
The synthetic degrees of comparison (one or two syllables) -er, -est	nice hot long happy gay	nicer hotter longer happier gayer	nicest hottest longest happiest gayest
The analytic degrees are formed by means of «more» and «most»	Interesting Beautiful serious	More interesting More beautiful More serious	Most interesting Most beautiful Most serious

Possessive Pronouns

Possessive pronouns have two forms. One form is used before a noun. The other form is used alone.

	Singular	Plural
Used before nouns	my your his, her, its	our your their
Used alone	mine yours his, hers, its	ours yours theirs

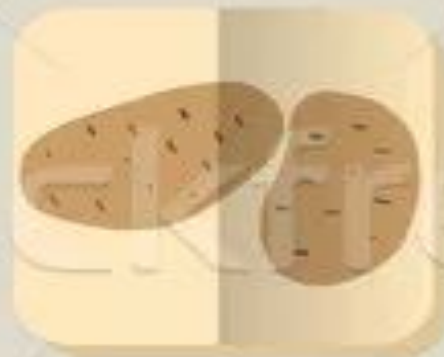
