
Project Christmas in Canada

Ireland has given the custom of decoration of the streets with lighting




Santa Claus has come from the USA.




In Canada the traditional Christmas dinner is roast turkey with vegetables and sauces. For dessert it is rich, fruity Christmas pudding with sauce.
