


CONTINUOUS TENSES



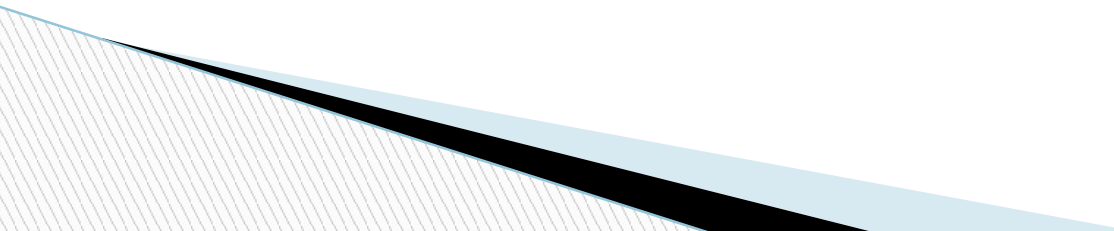
PRESENT AND PAST CONTINUOUS

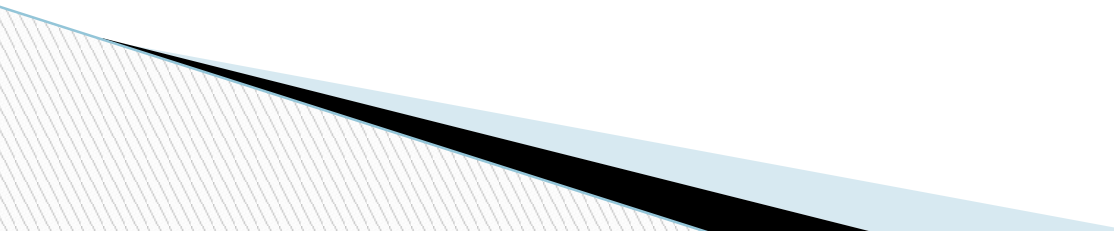
FUTURE SIMPLE AND FUTURE CONTINUOUS

- Don't call on us tonight! We (to pack).
- I (not to go) to the cinema tomorrow. I (to watch) TV the whole evening.
- What you (to do) at eight tomorrow?
- You (to play) volleyball tomorrow?
- When we arrive in St.-Petersburg, it probably (to rain).
- When you (to go) to see your friend next time?
- I (to wait) for you when you (to come).

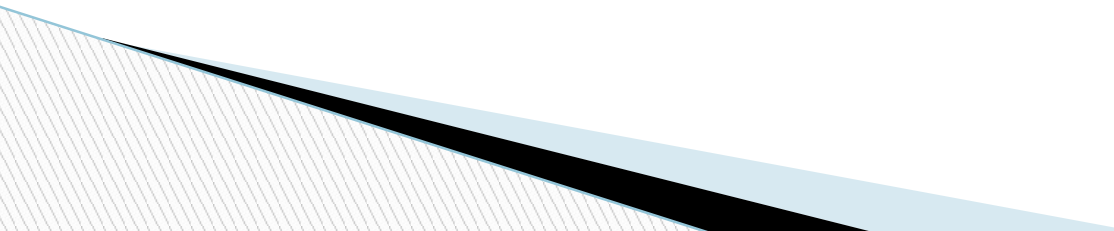
to shine

 - The sun ... brightly now.
 - Tomorrow the sun ... all day long.

to write

- I ... a postcard at the moment.
 - I ... a postcard when you phoned.
 - I ... a lot of Christmas cards tomorrow evening.

- We ... in the garden at 3 o'clock yesterday afternoon.
 - This time tomorrow we ... in the garden.
 - We ... in the garden now.
