The game consists of several rounds. At the beginning of each round are announced theme and cost issues (the number of points you can get with the right answer to the question.) One team chooses a theme and cost issue, then the leading read the corresponding question. Time for discussion at 15 seconds. After 15 seconds, the signal command writes its own version in the form and give a response to the master, in this case, if the team is not sure, the answer can never surrender. Under the rules of the game in each round, each team chooses a time issue. The order in which teams select the questions to define the lead before the round. At right answer team gets points equal to the cost issue. In the case of an incorrect response team loses the number of points equal to the cost issue. If a team does not give an answer, then nothing happens.
