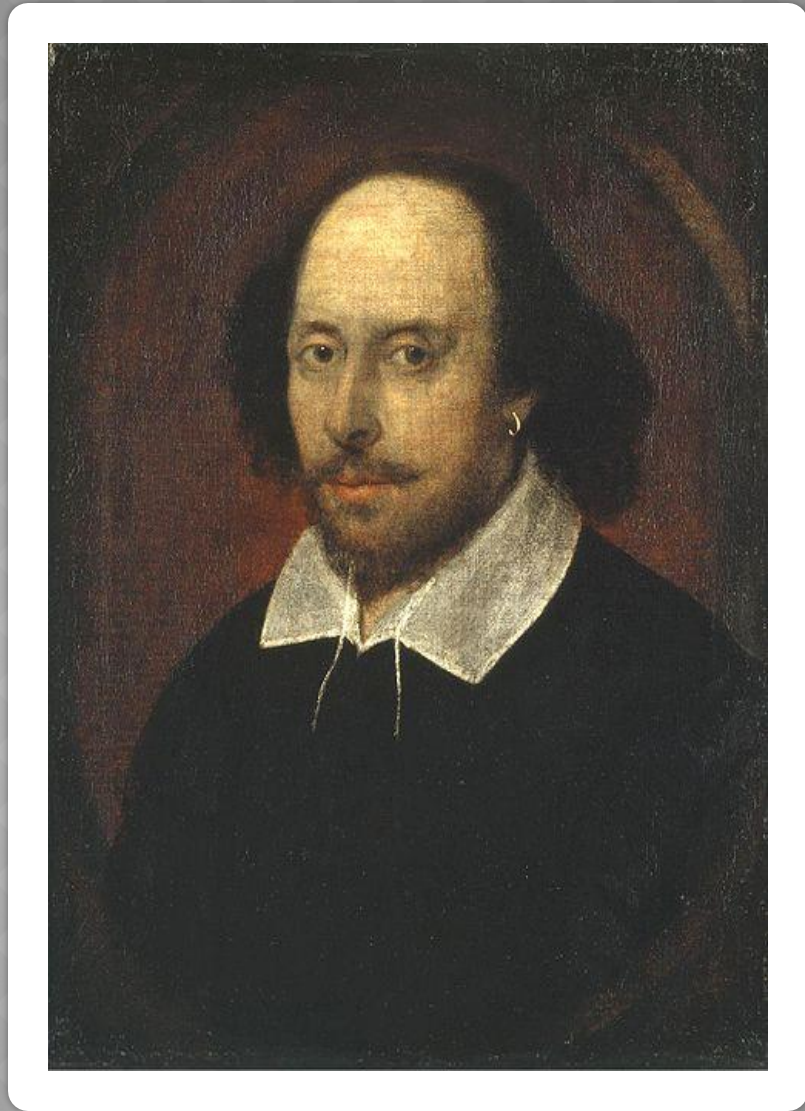

ABOUT **1/3** OF THE PLAY'S LINES ARE SPOKEN BY HIM

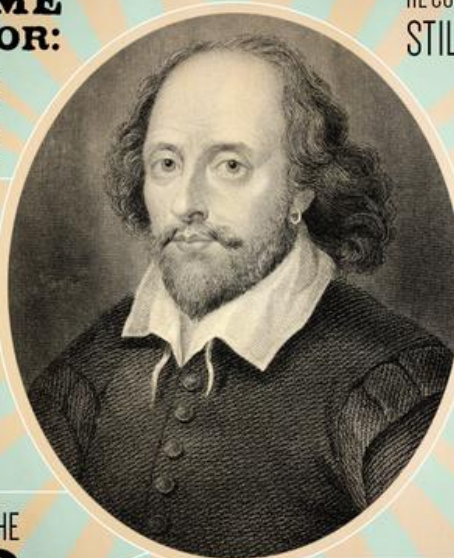


SOME **BELIEVE** HE DIDN'T

NEW NAME GENERATOR:

HE'S CREDITED WITH INVENTING
MANY FIRST NAMES THAT ARE
STILL POPULAR TODAY, INCLUDING
JESSICA, MIRANDA AND OLIVIA

HIS EPITAPH
WARNS VANDALS
AND GRAVE ROBBERS
TO STAY AWAY:
"BLESSED BE THE MAN
THAT SPARES
THESE STONES / AND
CURSED
BE HE THAT MOVES
MY BONES"

PLAYS WITH THE MOST DEATHS:
MACBETH (**10 DEATHS**) AND
TITUS ANDRONICUS (**14 DEATHS**)

SHAKESPEARE'S PLAYS
CONTAIN OVER **20**

POISONING,
DECAPITATION,
SNAKE BITE, HANGING,
DROWNING...

PLUS, BEING EATEN
IN A PIE
AND DEVoured BY A
BEAR

NIGHT OWL

MEANING: A PERSON LIKES TO STAY UP LATE AT NIGHT



BREAK THE ICE

MEANING: TO BE THE FIRST ONE TO SAY OR TO DO SMTH



AT A SNAIL'S PACE

MEANING: VERY SLOWLY



LIE LOW

MEANING: HIDE SO THAT YOU WILL NOT BE FOUND



SEND SOMEONE PACKING

MEANING: TELL SOMEONE TO DO AWAY
