

A. Stress on first syllable

B. Stress on last syllable

rule example

Most 2-syllable verbs

exPORT, deCIDE, beGIN

C. Stress on penultimate syllable (penultimate = second from end)

-ty, -phy and -gy

Words ending in -al

deMOcracy, geOLogy

dependaBILity,

phoTOgraphy

CRItical, geoLOGical

E. Compound words

rule

- For compound nouns on the first part
- For compound adjectiveson the second part
- For compound verbs –
 on the second part

example

BLACKbird, GREENhouse bad-TEMpered, old-FASHioned underSTAND, overFLOW



Rhythm

- Content words (have the most stress): Nouns, Verbs, Adjectives, Adverbs
- Function words (are weaker and shorter):

Auxiliary verbs, Prepositions, Conjunctions (but, not...), Determiners (the, some, each...), Possessive adjectives (my, your...)

 Content words are stressed more (pronounced louder and longer) than functions words.

- When are you coming to dinner?
- I have never liked the color red.
- Motorcycles can be dangerous to drive or ride on.

Stress Timing

- English is a stressed timed language. The time it takes to say something depends on the number of stressed syllables, not the number of syllables.
- Bob ate some corn. (4 syl.)
- Kenny has swam to France and back. (8 syl.)
- The Americans are buying some souvenirs and posters. (15 syl.)

Intonation

- Intonation Patterns
- -Statements:
- I like riding horses.
- -Wh questions:
- When do you go riding?
- -Yes/no questions:
- Do you ever fall off?

- -Commands:
- Get off the horse now.
- -Requests:
- Can I go with you sometime?
- -Choice questions:
- Does she like chicken or meat?
- -Tag questions:
- Susan ate, didn't she?
- -Giving lists:
- Samuel likes pizza, tacos, spaghetti,
 hamburgers, and hot dogs.

Consonants

- th sounds
- There are two pronunciations for the th sounds,
- -voiced:
- thin, think, tooth, something, thank
- Math and theology are worth thinking about to be wealthy and healthy.

-voiceless:

- the, them, rather, another, seethe
- Another father withered in the hot weather.
- That brother's mother and father smooth lathered leather.

How to pronounce /w/ and /v/ sounds:

wet vet

way vane

weather rave

between believe

- Slow sweaty wombats wallow in wet watery swilling sewage.
- Conservation drives savvy investors to save their valuables in vaults.

- How to pronounce the /r/ sound: red, bar, arrive, revere, room, ready
- Rowdy Brandy arrived in the room ready to rock and roll.

How to pronounce /h/ sound:

- Hat, heaven, behold, ahead, hash
- Heaven has heaps of hot heads who have behaved hellishly.

How to pronounce ng sound

Most of the time when you see the letters NG, you want to pronounce them as one sound only, the NG sound [ŋ]. Can you make this sound without a hard G [g] sound?

hung laughing

spring expecting

song remembering

wing swimming

- How to pronounce the sound in were-work-worth-word-world
- ir (bird), er (berg), ur (urge):
- dirty clergy splurge
- stirring submerge purge

- How to pronounce the sounds in
- bed bad, men man, send sand…
- Open your mouth a bit more to pronounce/æ/
- apple, hamster, mask, automat, candle.
- That fat cat sat on a black hat.
- Masked cattle and lambs ransacked the ranch in the valley.

- How to pronounce the sounds in
- set sit seat, ship sheep

pen pin peenge

ten tin teen

peg pig peak

bell bill beal

cheque chick cheek
