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today, everyday, week, month, often | usually, always, seldom, sometimes



Verb or Verb + s/-es in 3 p.

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The simple present tense in English is used to describe an action that is regular, true or normal.

- We use the present tense:
- **1. For repeated or regular actions in the present time period.**
- I **take** the train to the office.
- The sun **rises** in the east.
- John **sleeps** eight hours every night during the week.

We use the present tense:

- **3. For habits.**
- I **get up** early every day.
- Mike **brushes** his teeth twice a day.
- We **travel** to our country house every weekend.

We use the present tense:

- **4. For things that are always / generally true.**
- It **rains** a lot in autumn.
- The Queen of England **lives** in Buckingham Palace.
- They **speak** Russian at work.

We use the present tense:

- **2. For facts.**
- A cat **has** four legs.
- We **come** from Russia.
- Plants give us oxygen.

Affirmative sentence

Subject	Verb	Rest of the sentence
I, We, You, They	Verb(Present)	Rest of the sentence.
He, She, It	Verb -e(s)(Present)	Rest of the sentence.

Negative sentence

Subject	Auxiliary	Verb	Rest of the sentence
I, We, You, They	do + not	Verb(Present)	Rest of the sentence.
He, She, It	does + not	Verb(Present)	Rest of the sentence.

Yes /No type question.

Auxiliary	Subject	Verb	Rest of the sentence
Do	I, We, You, They	Verb(Present)	Rest of the sentence.
Does	He, She, It	Verb(Present)	Rest of the sentence.

Questions.

Question Word	Auxiliary	Subject	Verb	Rest of the sentence
QW	Do	I, We, You, They	Verb	Rest of the sentence.
QW	Does	He, She, It	Verb	Rest of the sentence.

The spelling for the verb in the third person differs depending on the ending of that verb:

For verbs that end in **-O**, **-CH**, **-SH**, **-SS**, **-X**, or **-Z** we add **-ES** in the third person.

- go – goes
- catch – catches
- wash – washes
- kiss – kisses
- fix – fixes
- buzz – buzzes

For verbs that end in a **consonant + Y**, we remove the **Y** and add **-IES**.

- marry – marries
- study – studies
- carry – carries
- worry – worries

**NOTE: For verbs that end in a vowel + Y,
we just add -S.**

- play – plays
- enjoy – enjoys
- say – says
