 The geographical center of England, Birmingham, was founded in the VI. and was the Anglo-Saxon village. To date, most of the megacities is the postwar reconstruction of the 1950s and 1960s. Birmingham (Birmingham), the second largest city in England, located in the West Midlands region.

ENTERTAINMENT AND ATTRACTIONS IN BIRMINGHAM

 Birmingham Anglican Cathedral of the early 18th century and Birmingham Catholic Cathedral of the mid-19th century, Birmingham Museum and Art Gallery Birmingham Museums & Art Gallery, located in the city center and the well-known works of the Pre-Raphaelites, and the paintings of the old masters - Rubens, Bellini, Canaletto and Claude



- Interestingly Botanical Gardens Birmingham Botanical Gardens & Glasshouses. As well as a nature reserve (Birmingham Nature Centre), which is represented by a large number of animals and birds, including the rare red panda 2.
- Center for marine life (National Sea Life Centre), home to turtles, piranhas, seahorses, stingrays and otters.



In the autumn-winter period in the West Midlands we recommend visiting Kenilworth Castle (Kenilworth Castle & Elizabethan Garden), Goodrich Castle, Stokes Castle, Whitley Court and the monastery Wenlock Priory, and spring and summer work Tudor house Blakesley Hall and Jacobin manor Aston Hall.





EVENTS IN BIRMINGHAM

 Religious celebration in honor of St. George, the Victorious; annual festival of Birmingham Tattoo, leading back to 1989; Birmingham International Carnival in the Caribbean style, and ArtsFest Festival of Arts - the largest festival of the UK arts.



Annual parade in Birmingham celebrated St. Patrick's Day, and in August a festival of Mardi Gras (analogue Slavic Shrovetide). You can visit the Fierce Festival !, folk festival Moseley Folk Festival, Birmingham International Jazz Festival, as well as comedy and dance festival. During holidays in Birmingham Frankfurt Christmas Market opens.
