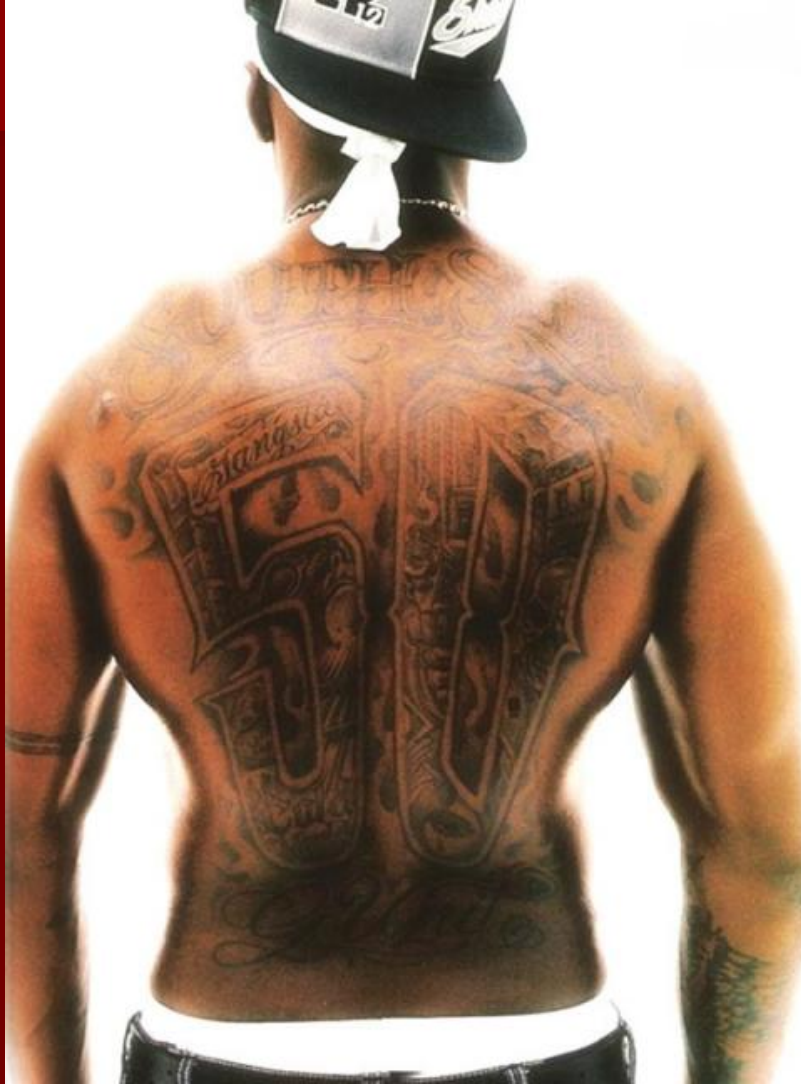

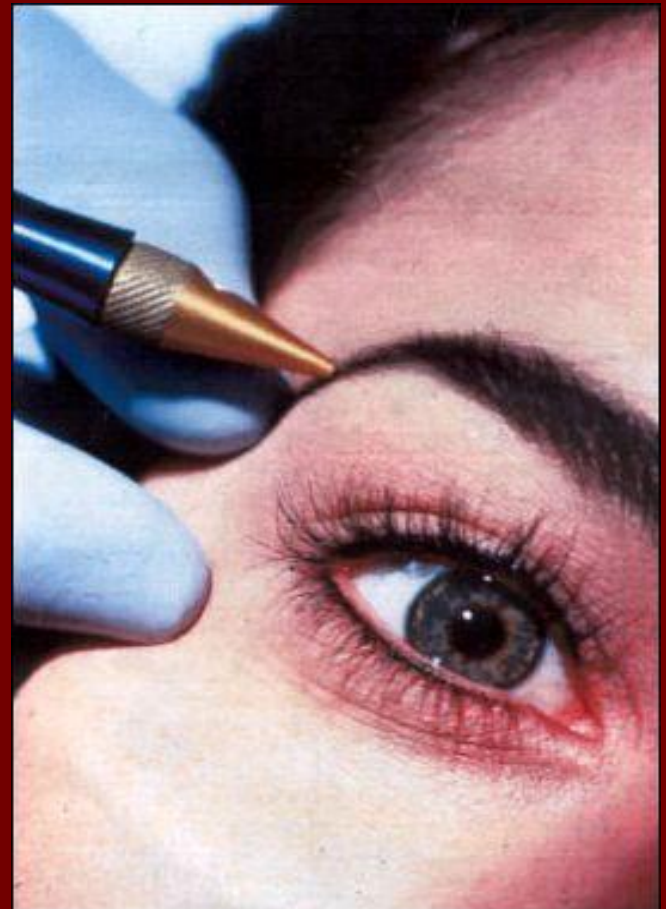
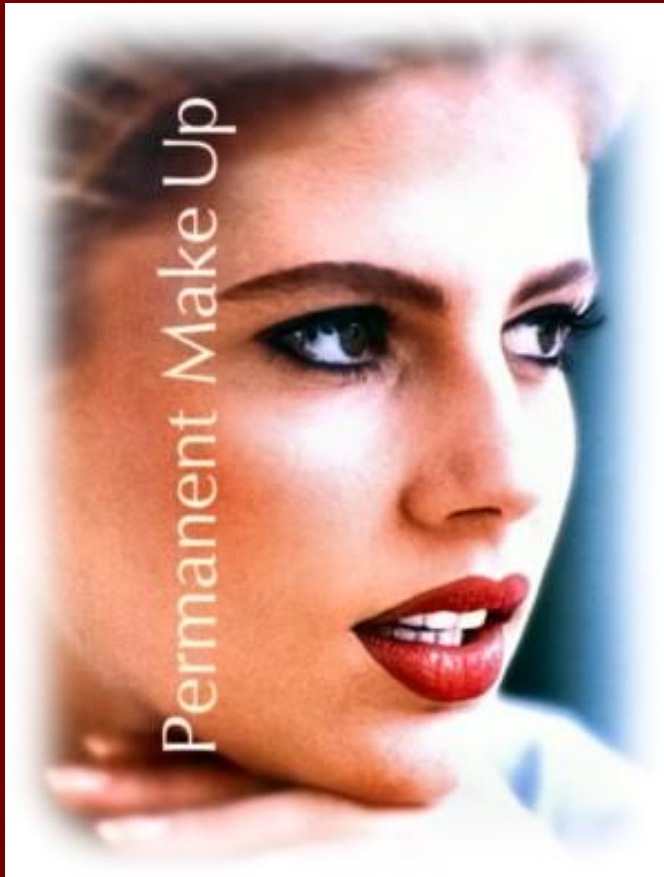

- that 50% of the young population of the world has a tattoo.





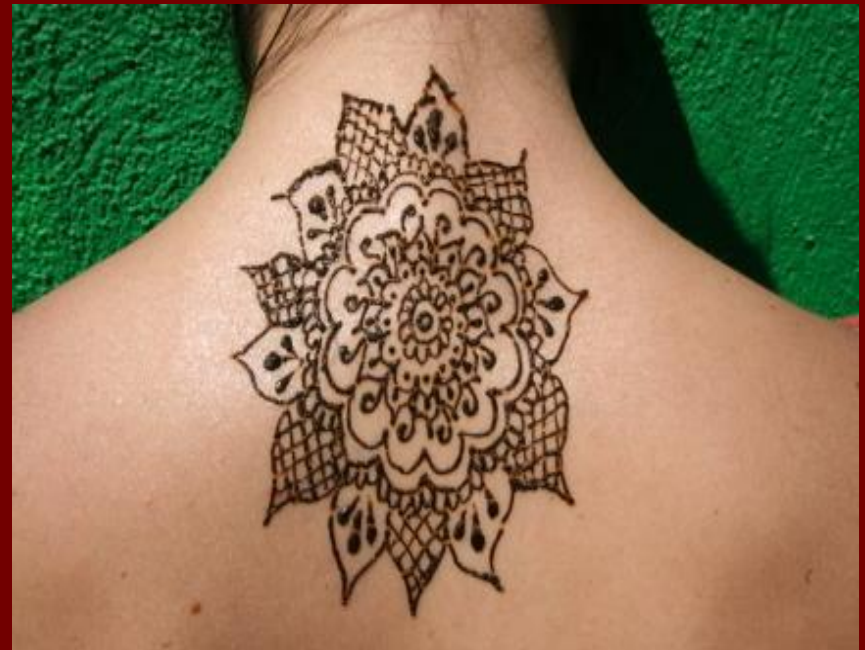
# *Health risks*

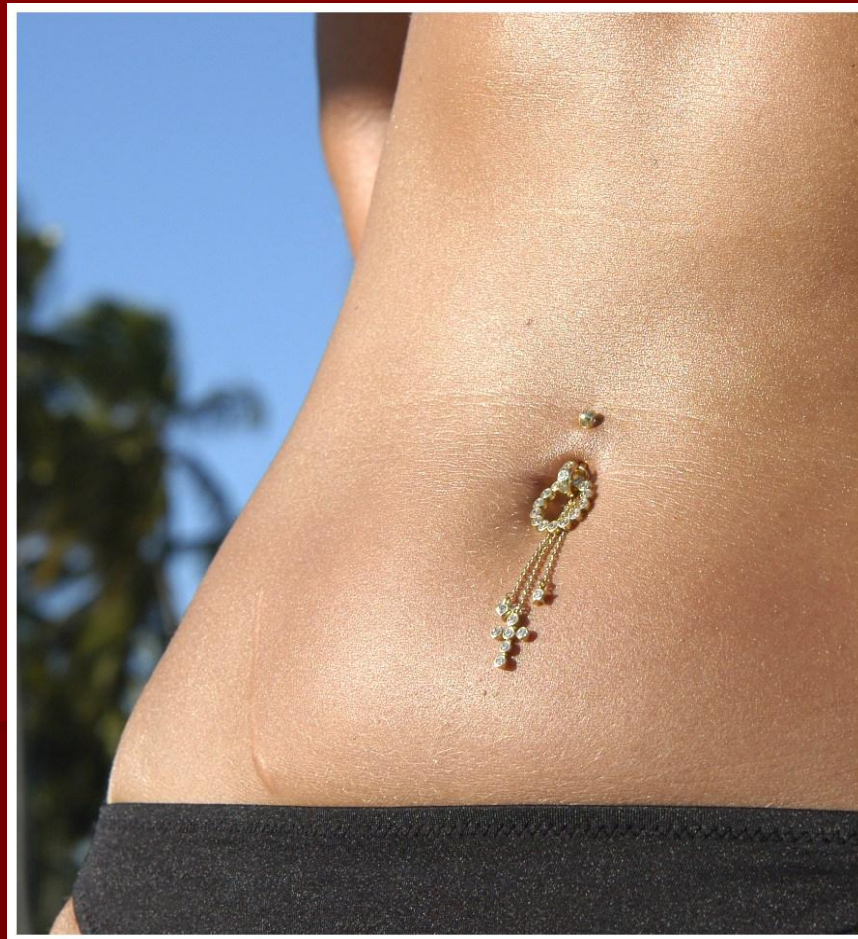

# Face painting

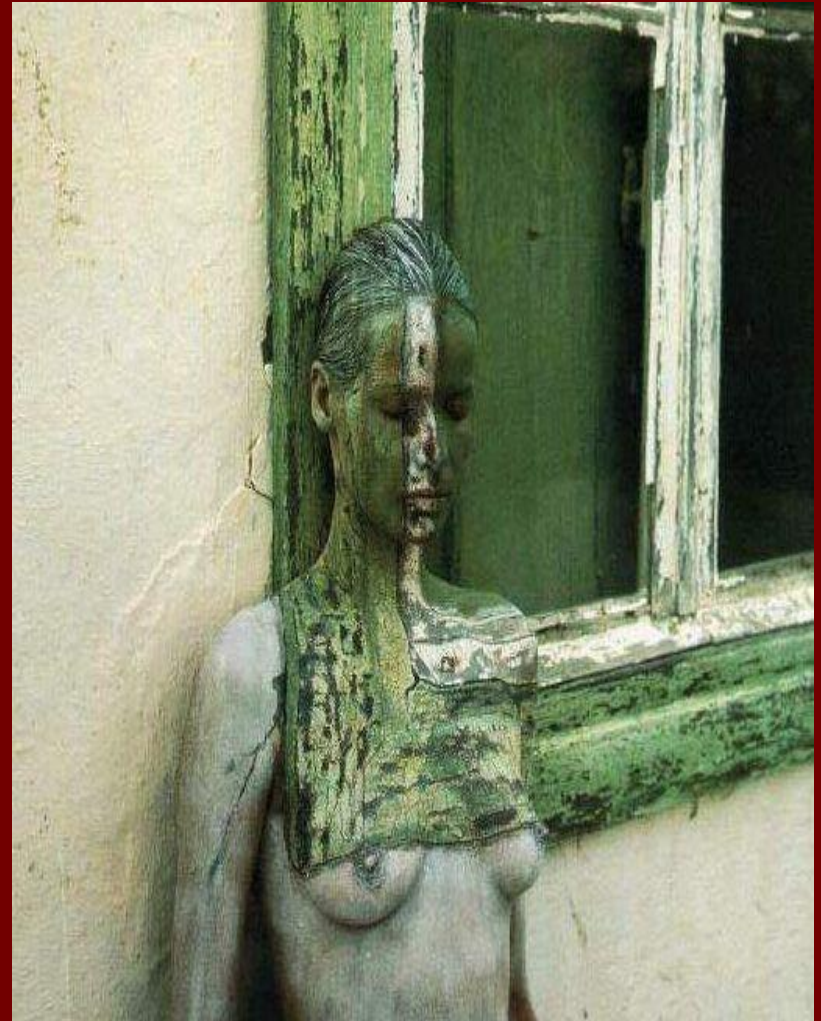


- **Designs that include the emblems of favorite cartoon characters**

- **Camouflage purposes**

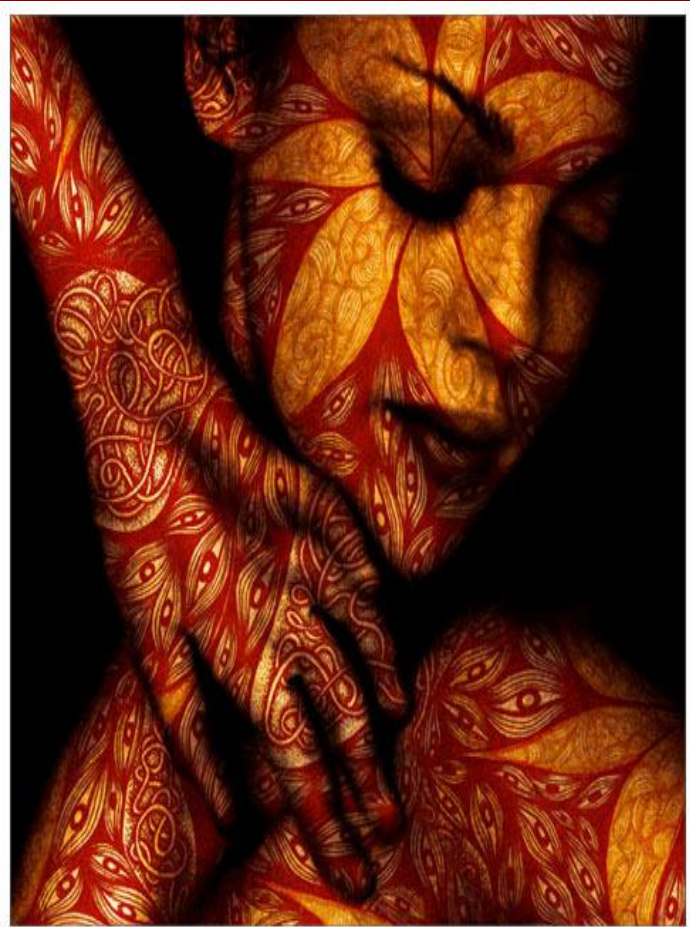
