Red

Green



means hope and the eternal longing for spring and all the promises of the future.

Green is the symbol of nature, youth, and the hope of eternal life.



White



means purity and is represented by the crystalline form of water and the snowflake.



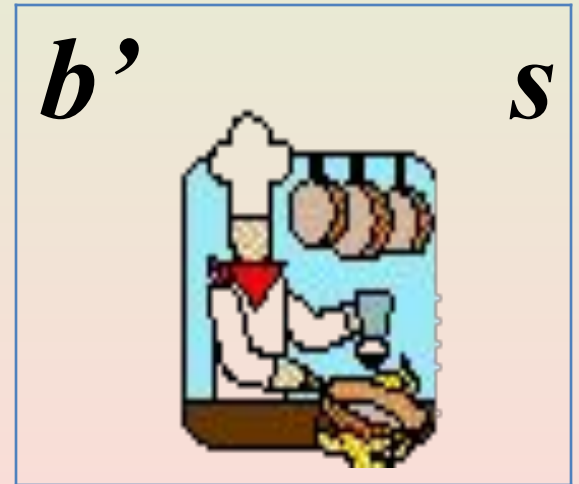
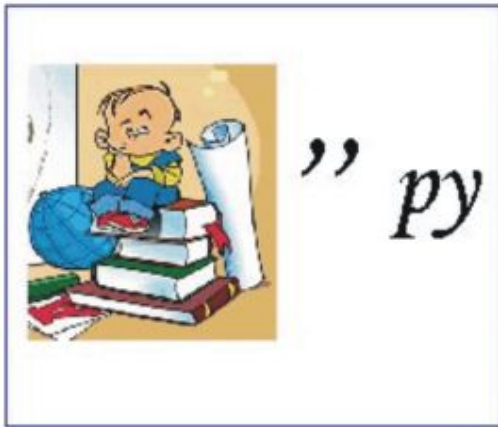
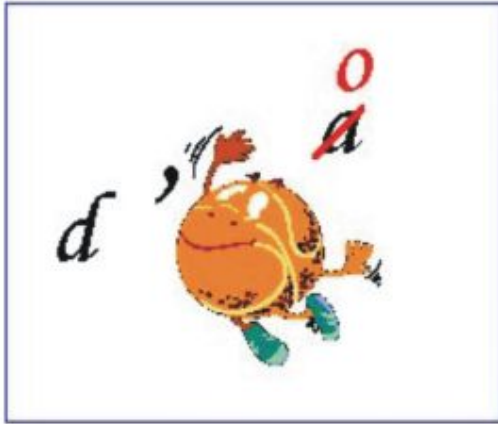
White is the religious symbol which stands for light, purity, joy and glory.
