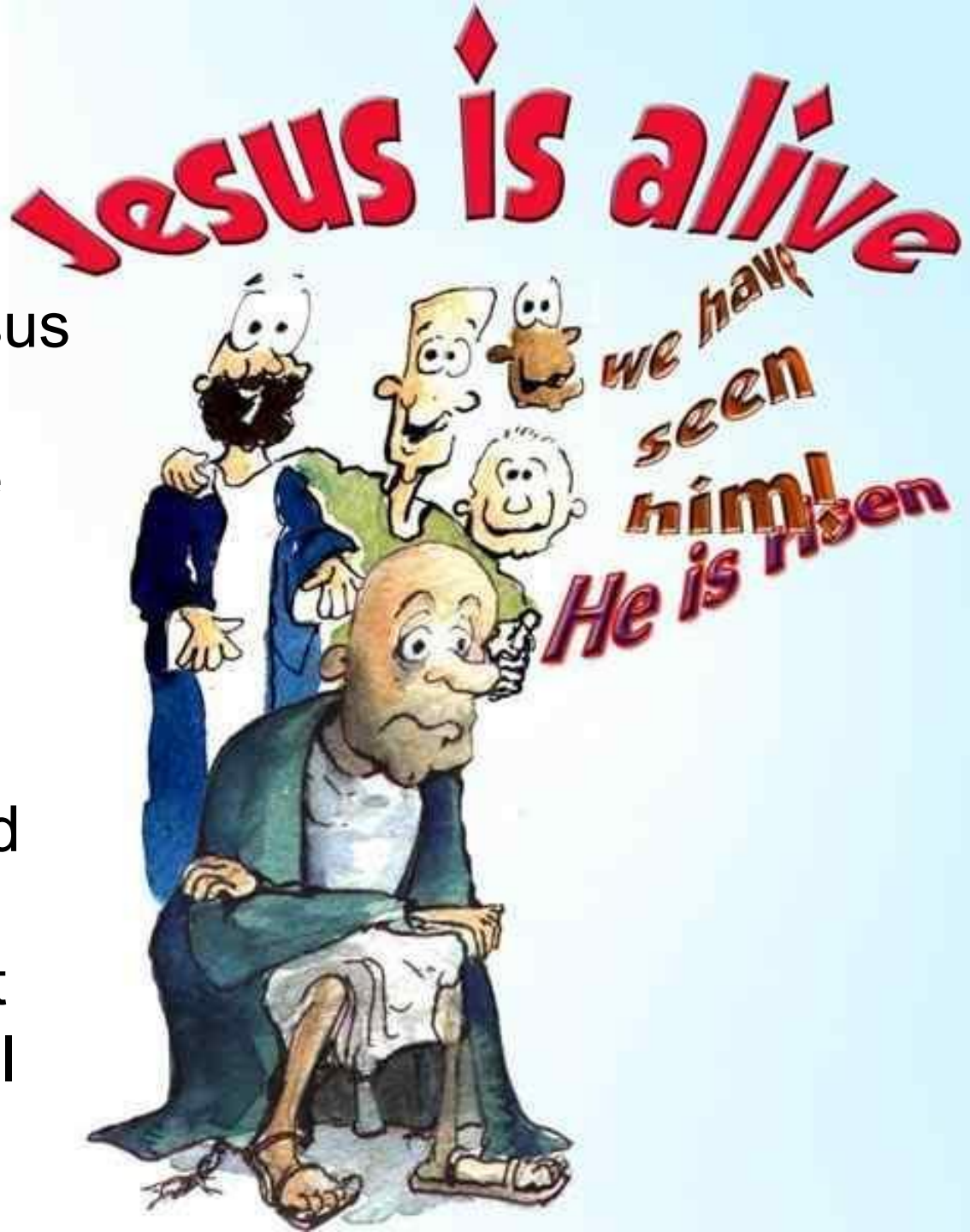
On the evening of that first day of the week, when the disciples were together, Jesus came and stood among them.

Then he showed them the wounds in his hands and side. The disciples were overjoyed when they saw that Jesus had risen from the grave.

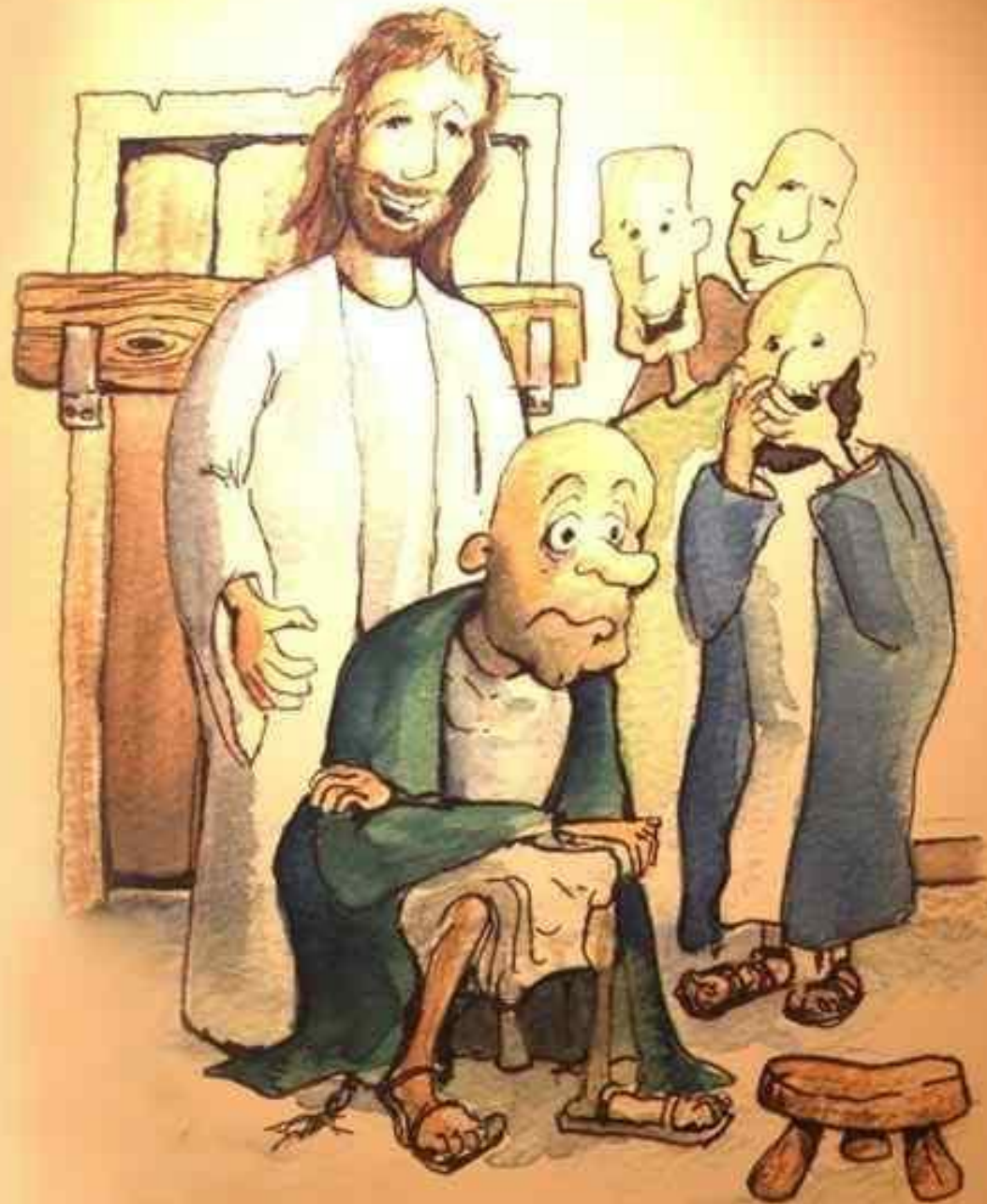
One of the disciples, whose name was Thomas, was not with the disciples when Jesus came. So the other disciples told him, "We have seen the Lord!"

Though the doors were locked, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you!"






Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here; see my hands. Reach out your hand and put it into my side."
