•The territory of England is 131 km².






 It washed by the waters of the Atlantic Ocean, by the North Sea, by the Irish Sea, and by the waters of the English Channel.





Three gold lions on a red background appeared in the English coat of arms of Richard the Lionheart after 1195 and are there still.




National symbols of England The official original anthem of England




A traditional symbol of England for centuries was a lion
