It gave mankind a lot of outstanding scientists, writers and poets, musicians and painters.



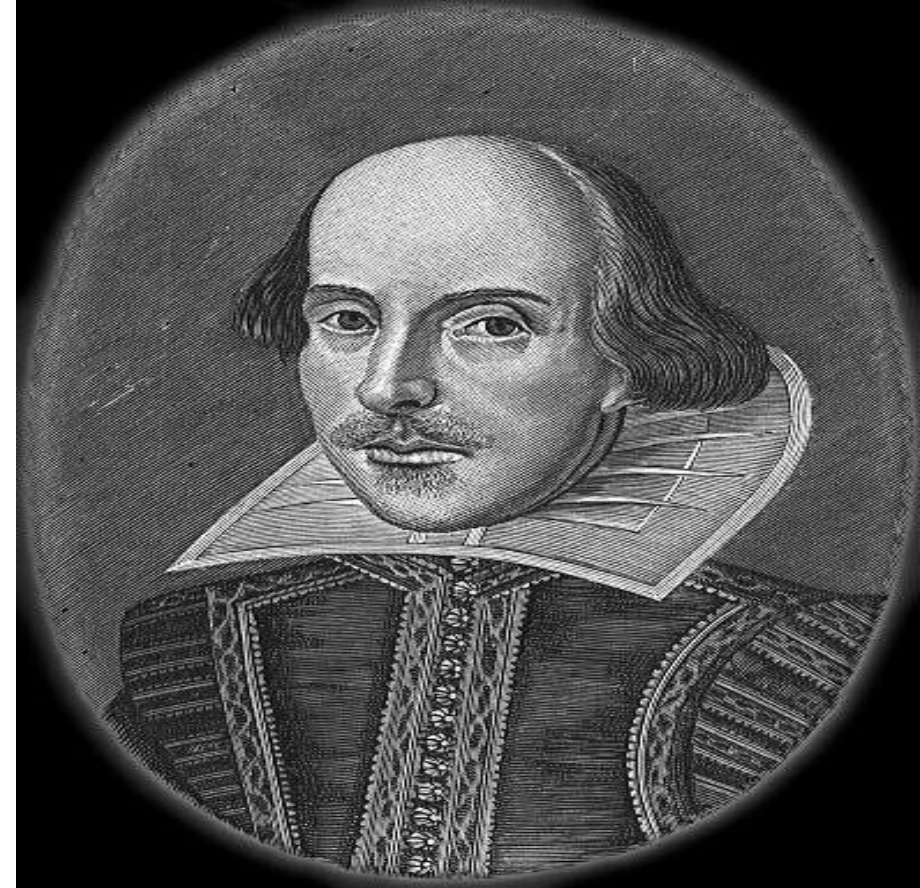
POETS

His plays were translated almost every language and staged in every theatre.

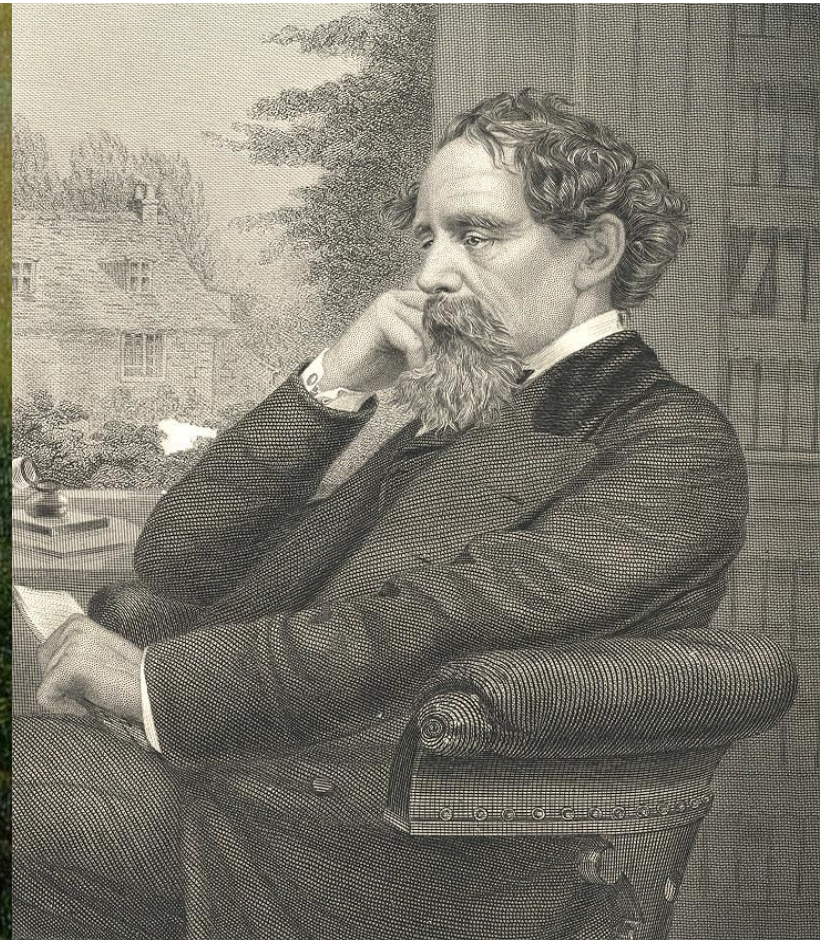
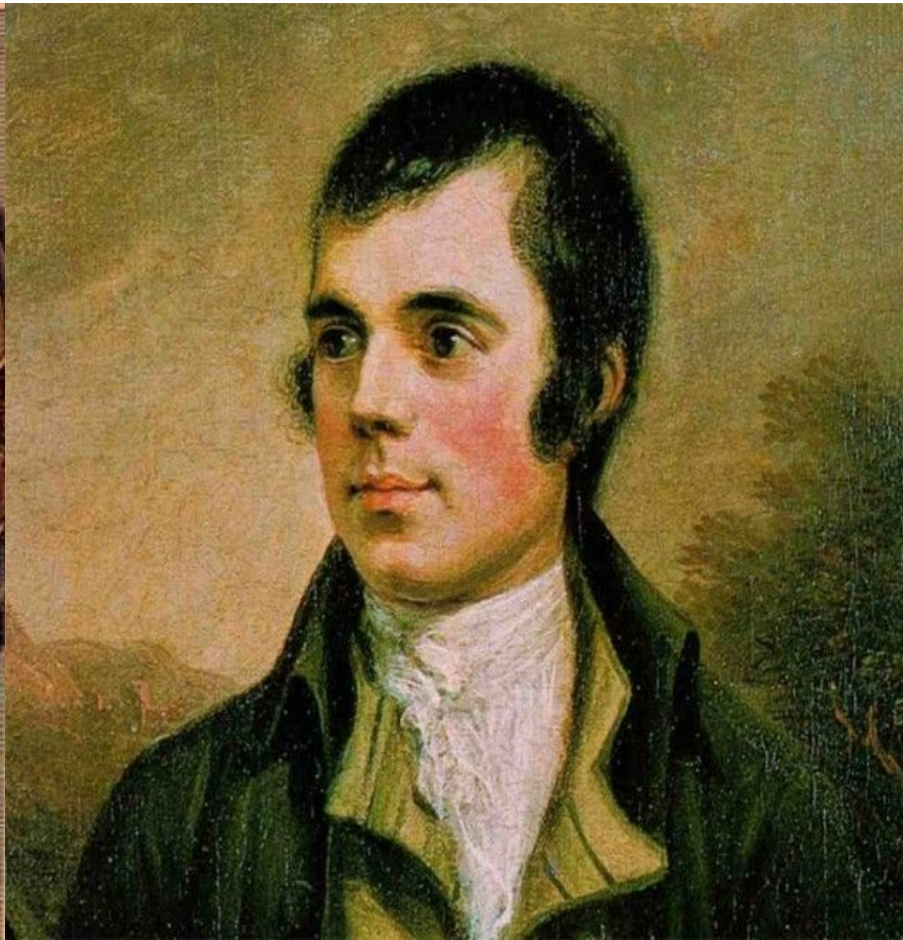

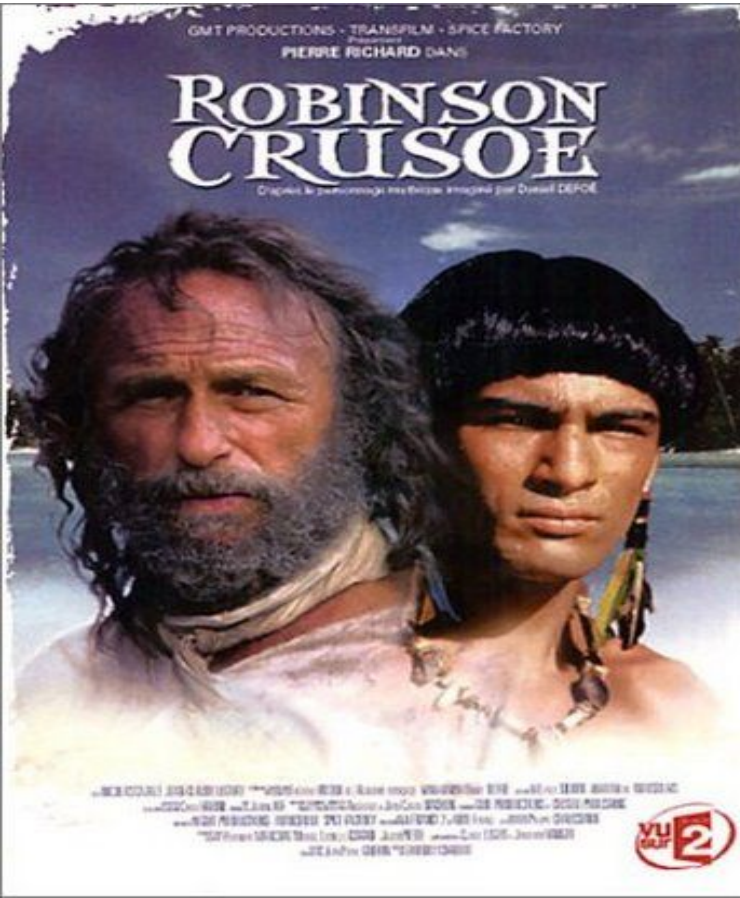
OTHER POETS

William Hogarth, Thomas Gainsborough contributed to the world's painting treasures.

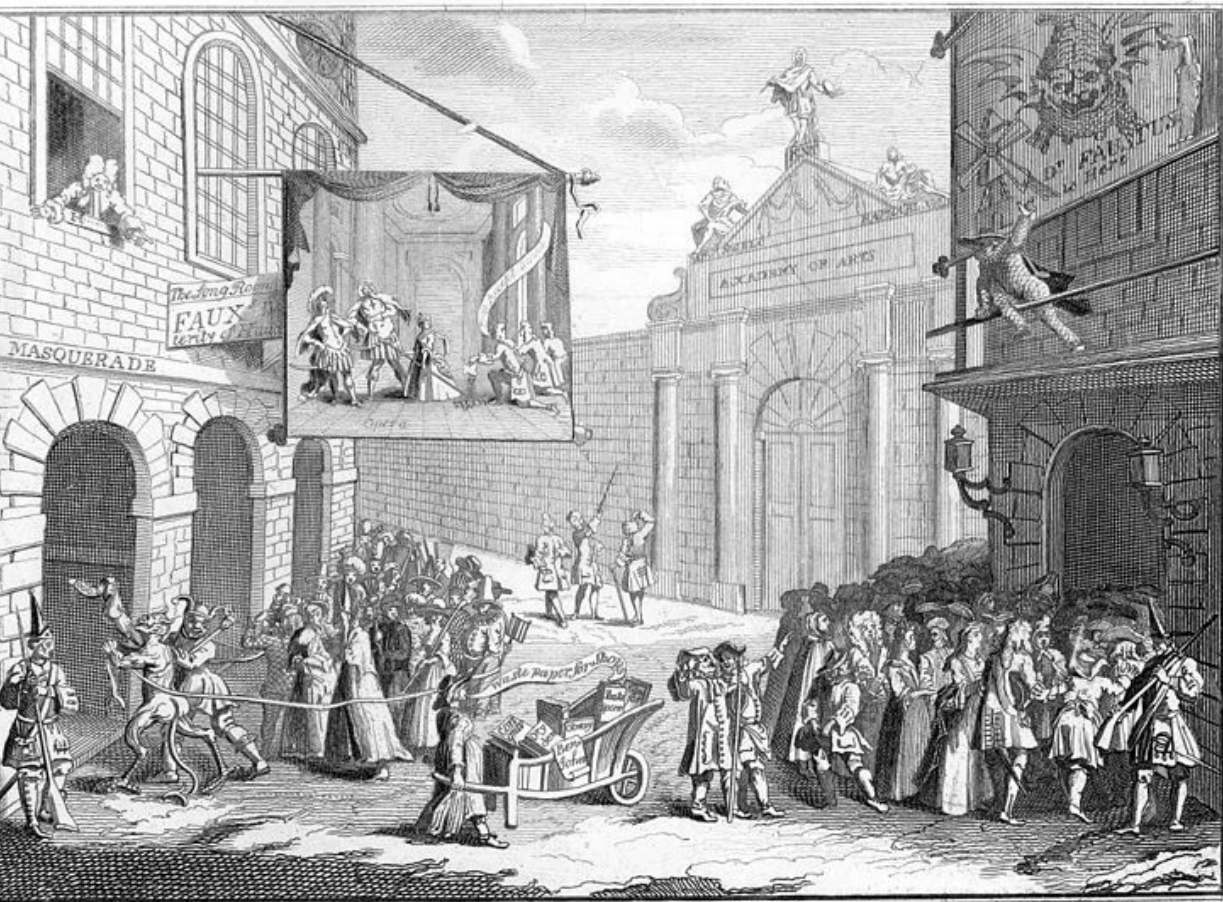

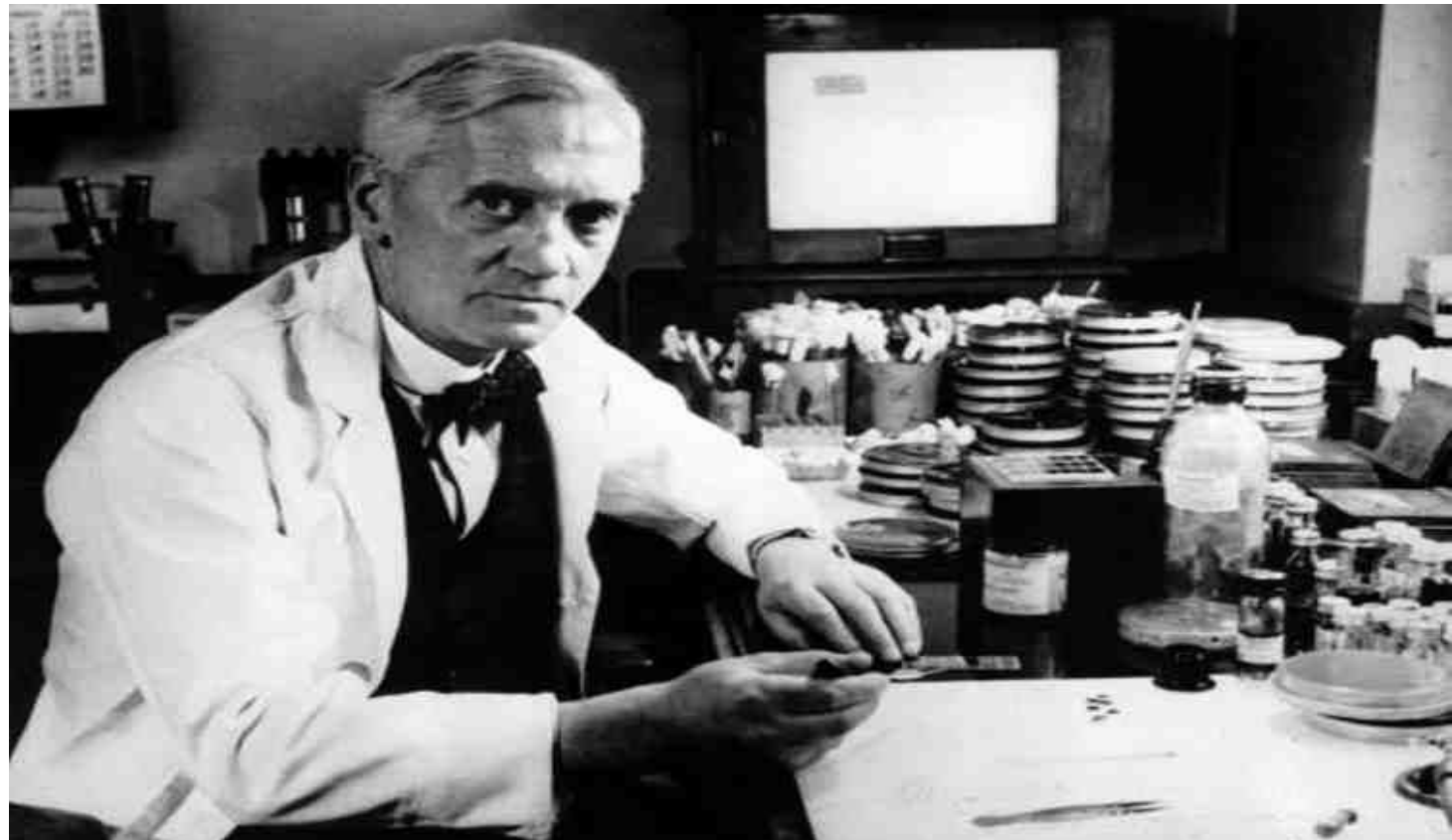

FLEMING

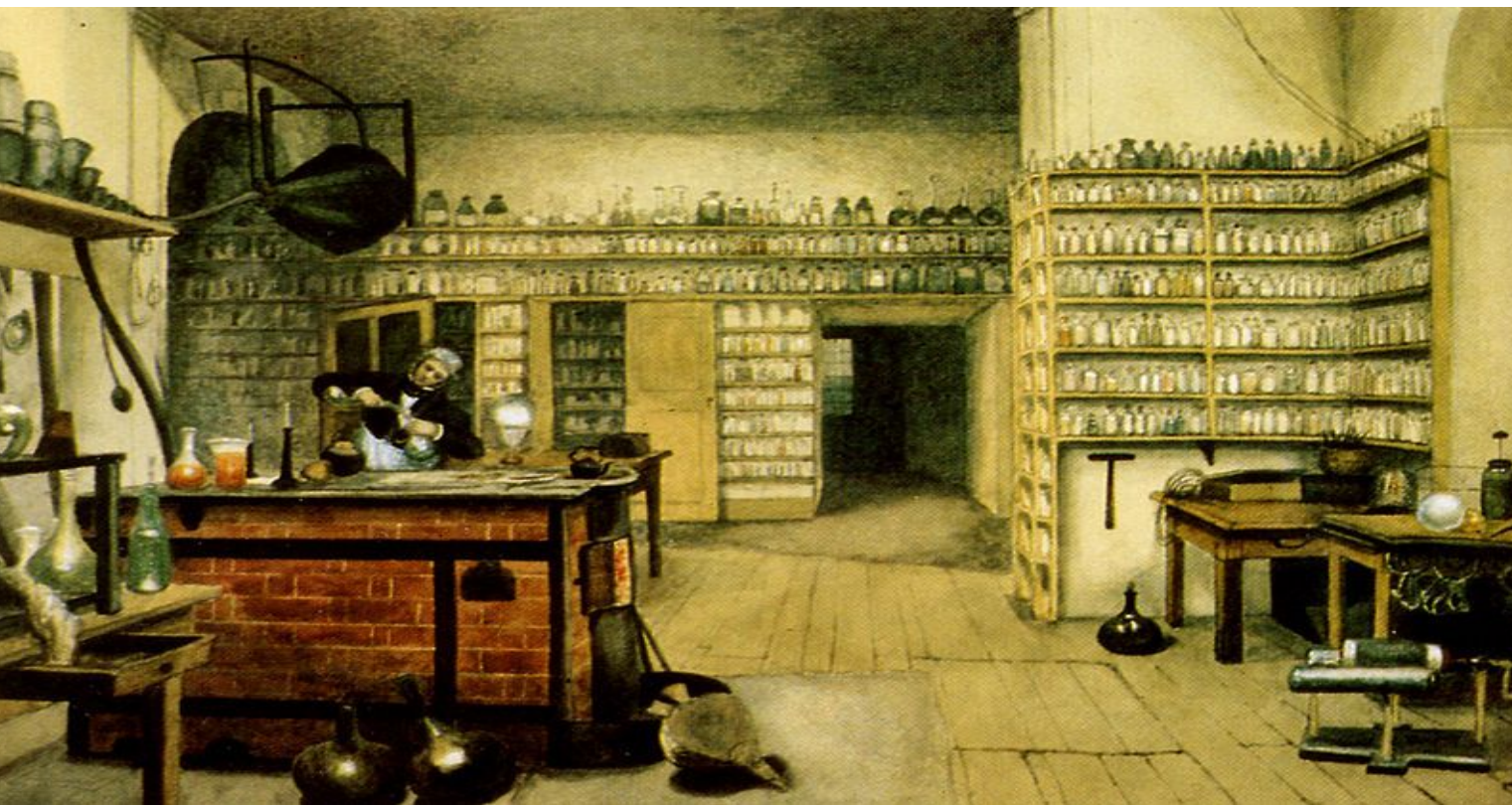
Alexandr Fleming – british bacteriologist. He discovered penicillin. Penicillin-first antibiotic.
