




Sir William Wallace was a Scottish knight and landowner who is known for leading a resistance during the Wars of Scottish Independence and regarded as a patriot and national hero.



The University and King's College of Aberdeen was founded in 1495. It was the first university in Aberdeen, the third in Scotland and the fifth in the United Kingdom.







Glasgow is the largest city in Scotland and third most populous in the United Kingdom.

The University of Glasgow was founded in 1451.






Inverness lies at the mouth of the River Ness, and it is from this the city derives its name.

Several Scottish Kings and Queens have been crowned at Stirling, including Mary, Queen of Scotts, in 1543.


Robert I, King of the Scots (11 July 1274 - 7 June 1329) known as Robert the Bruce was King of the Scots from 1306 until his death in 1329.





The National Wallace Monument is a tower standing on the summit of Abbey Crag.

It commemorates Sir William Wallace, the 13th century Scottish hero.



The Battle of Stirling Bridge was a battle of the First War of Scottish Independence. On 11 September 1297, the forces of William Wallace defeated the English.
