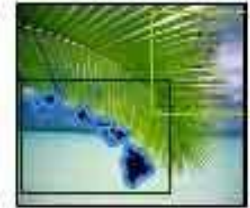

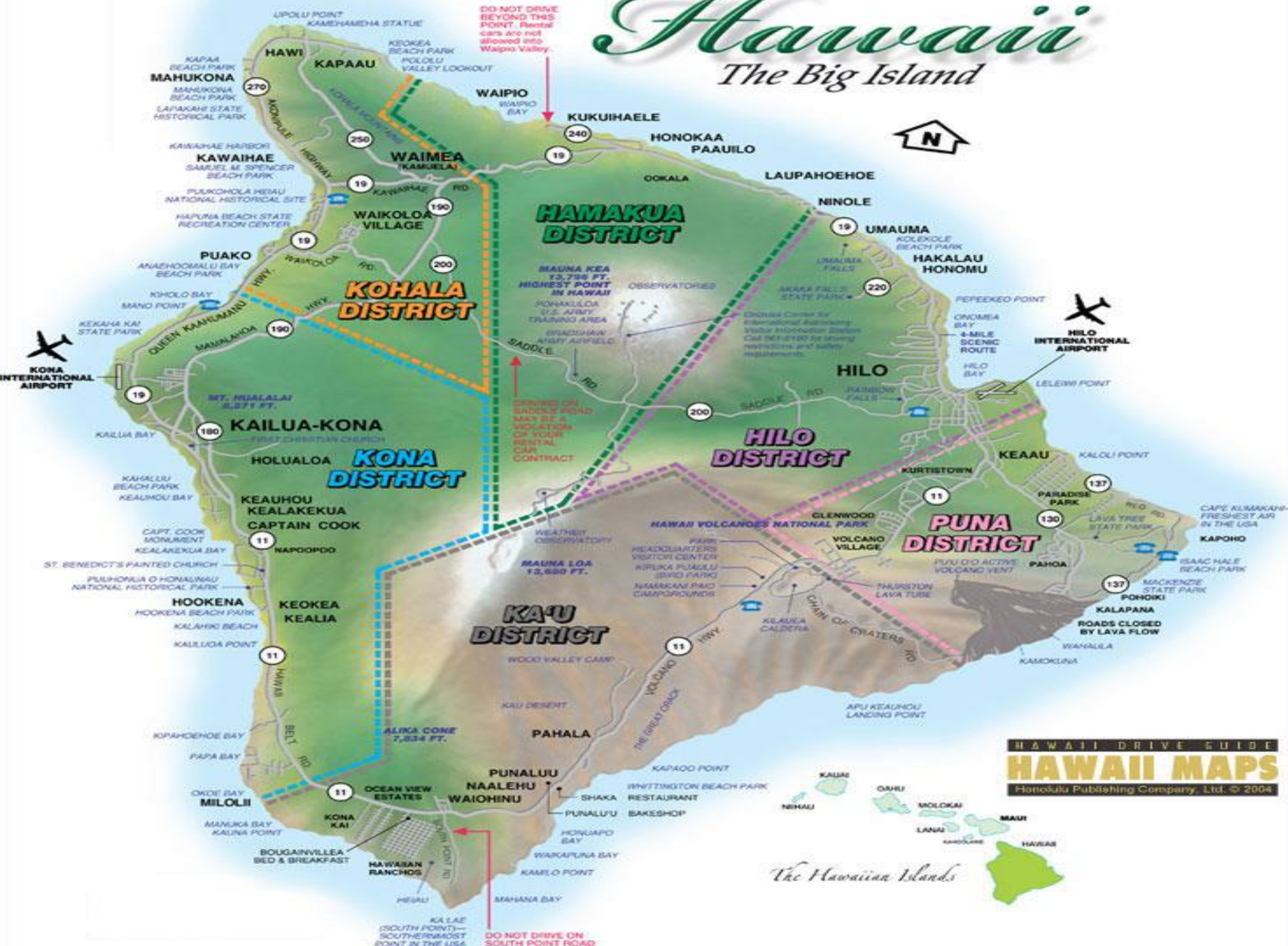

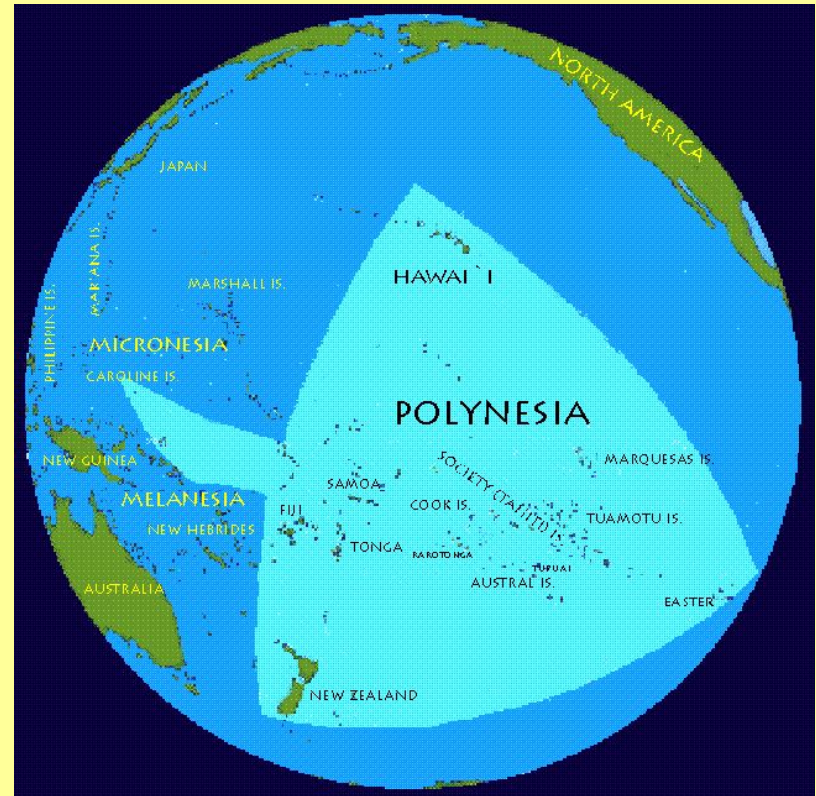






A Brief History of Hawaii

- AD 500-700 – settled by Polynesians from the Marquesa Islands
- 11-14th centuries – Tahitians took over islands
- 300,000 Hawaiians lived on islands when Captain Cook arrived
- 1778 – Captain Cook landed in Waimea, Kauai.
- 1810 – King Kamehamela unified islands for first time

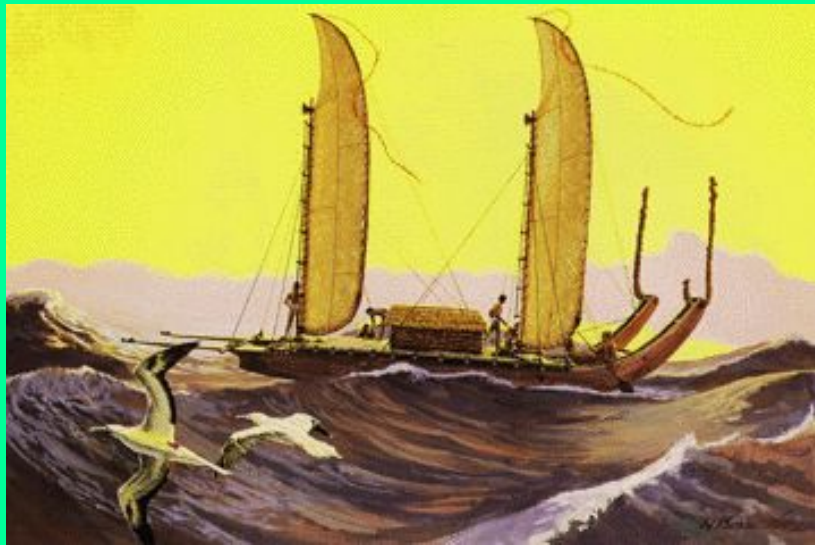


The Polynesian Islands





Canoes



A deck bridged two hulls
for longer voyages.

- Built with tools of stone, bone, and corals
- Dug out of tree trunks or planks sewn together
- Sails made from coconut or pandulus leaves woven together
- Could travel 2000 miles (Hawaii to Tahiti)
- Faster than Captain Cook's ships
- No navigational equipment





Captain Cook



- British sailor
- 3 voyages to Pacific
- 1778 landed in Waimea, Kaua'i; received in peace
- 1778 – returned to distrustful Hawaiians; perished on the beach

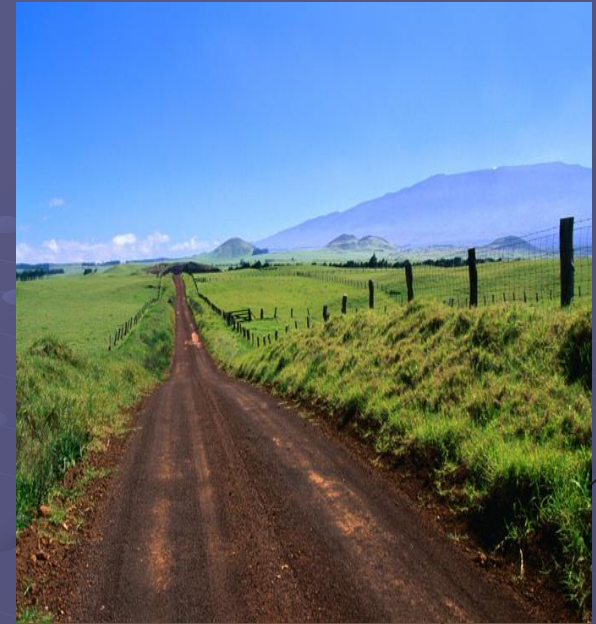
