

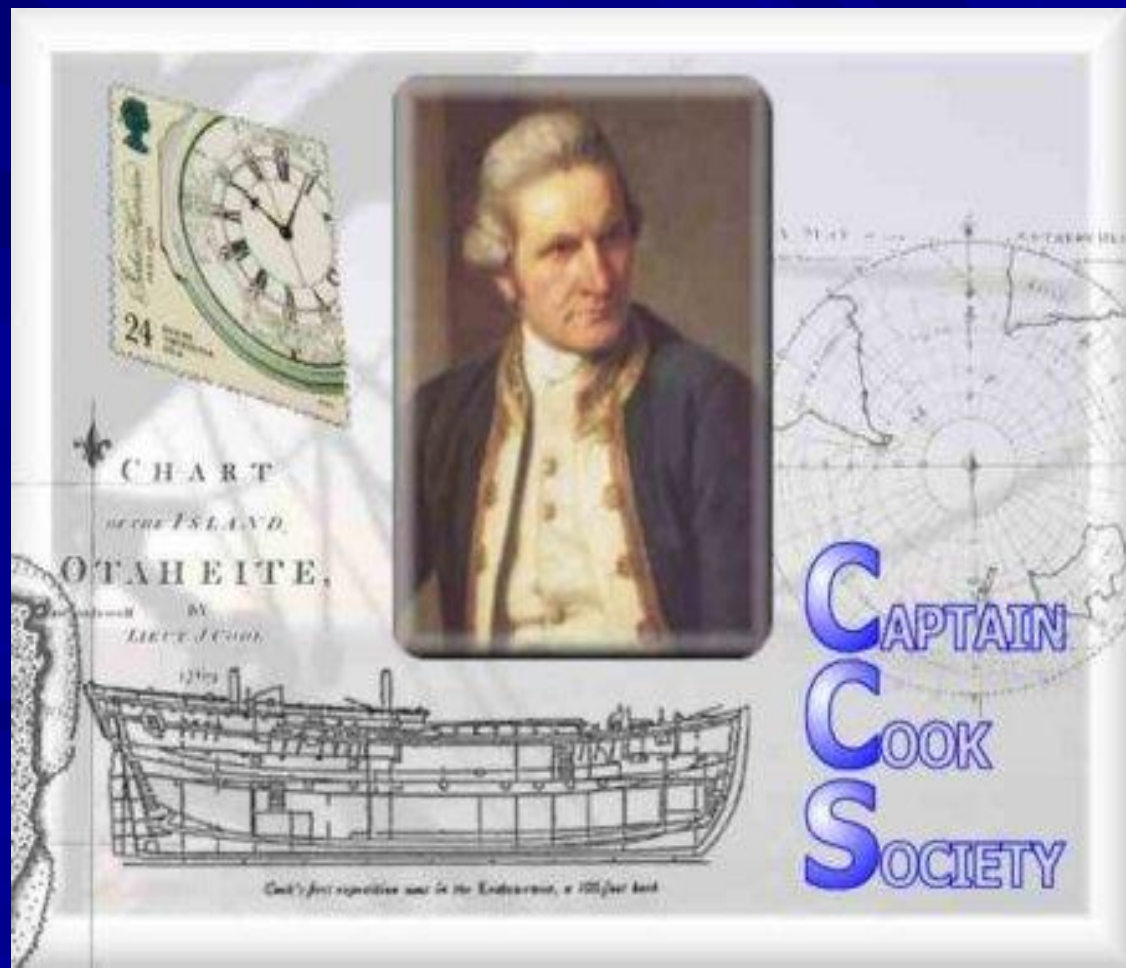


James Cook

on October 27, 1728 in
Marton, Britain.

He sailed around
the world **twice!**



He also had **secret** orders to seek a **southern** continent



He set out on his first voyage round the world on the ship **Endeavour**.

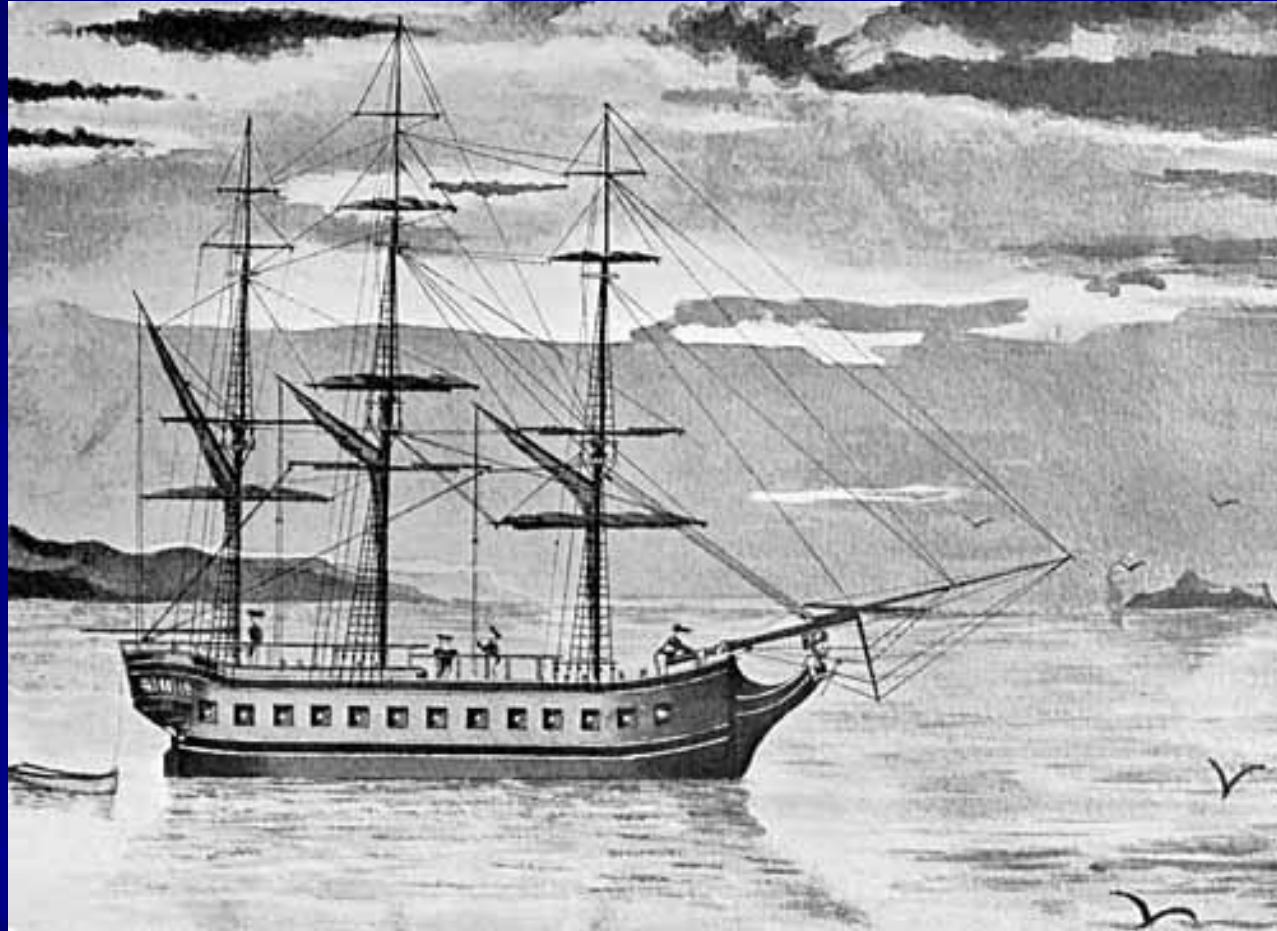
On August 22, 1770, Cook claimed for Great Britain the eastern coast of New Holland (now Australia)



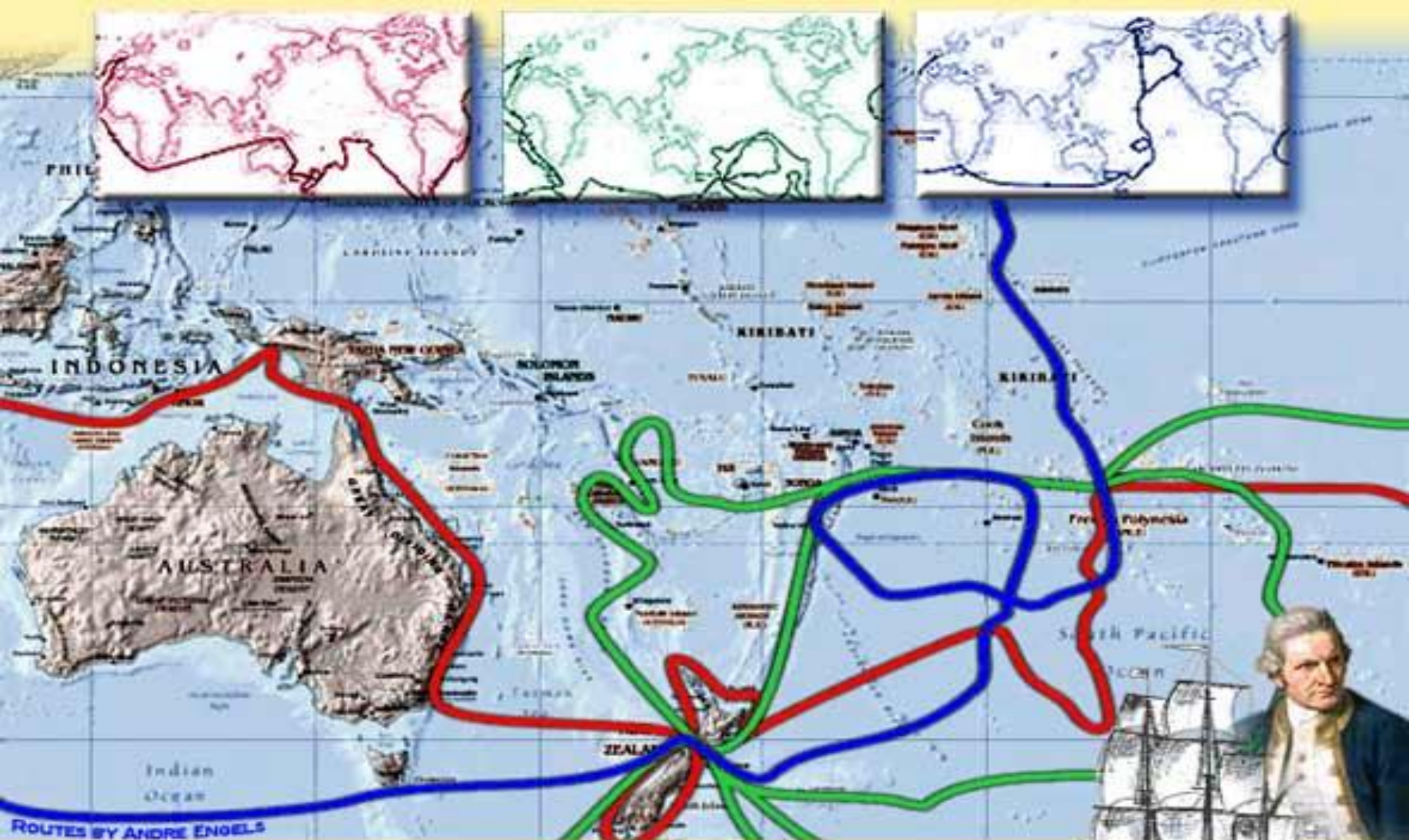
The name "Australia" was not used until the early 1800s.

Cook Strait is a narrow body of water between the North and South Islands of New Zealand, separating the two islands. It is approximately 22 kilometers (14 miles) wide at its narrowest point. The strait is named after Captain James Cook, who first discovered it in 1770. The Cook Strait is a major shipping route and is home to several cities, including Wellington on the North Island and Christchurch on the South Island.
